

## 413 Squadron, partners conduct boat-hoist training blitz

Members of 413 (Transport & Rescue) Squadron returned home after a productive week of maritime search and rescue (SAR) training in Halifax. Two CH149 Cormorant helicopters, three crews and support staff deployed between November 1 and 5 with the express aim of conducting saturated maritime extraction training, commonly known as boat hoisting.

In many ways, boat hoisting represents both the most demanding and important flying on the Cormorant in a

SAR context. The teamwork, technique and precision that must align to safely and effectively hoist SAR technicians and equipment from the helicopter to a vessel and back again (likely along with injured personnel) is nothing short of challenging. The difficulty is further compounded by winds, waves, darkness and a myriad of obstacles or complicating factors; nonetheless, the capability to hoist to vessels is a key maritime rescue capability often employed when carrying out 413 Squadron's SAR mandate.

In a real-world scenario, a Cormorant crew may con-

duct a boat hoist to a fishing vessel to extract someone having a medical emergency. However, as recent history with 413 Squadron's efforts in the *Atlantic Destiny* rescue continue to reveal, all the intricacies of a real-world boat rescue are impossible to replicate in training scenarios. Building and maintaining solid foundational maritime SAR skills is essential to keeping everyone safe when called upon.

413 Squadron's Cormorant crews make a point of regularly practicing boat hoists throughout the year; however, a dedicated week

of saturated maritime SAR training with an array of different marine participants is invaluable for developing and improving this perishable skill. This year's 413 Squadron Maritime Extraction Exercise saw exceptional community participation, providing Cormorant crews with a diversity of vessels on which to hone their skills. These included eight unique vessels from the Royal Canadian Navy, the Canadian Coast Guard Auxiliary and civilian sea survival and vessel charter companies. The participating vessels' home ports are near Halifax, Ma-

gon Bay, Lunenburg, St. Margaret's Bay and Jeddore. Through the combined efforts of the Cormorant crews, participating vessels and support staff, a total of 20 independent training serials were successfully completed in day, night and varying weather conditions.

The return of 413 Squadron's exercise participants to 14 Wing Greenwood marked the successful completion of the maritime extraction exercise. Although the intensive training has formally ended, Cormorant SAR crews continue to refine their boat hoisting skills, along with

all other SAR capabilities, on a daily basis. Beyond highlighting the unique challenges associated with maritime extraction, the exercise magnified the importance of support staff, the Canadian Coast Guard and Canadian Coast Guard Auxiliary and SAR stakeholders in upholding the SAR system. While no one looks forward to the unfortunate instances where we have to respond to someone in distress, it is comforting to know there is an entire network that provides us the training and support to keep us safe as "We Watch The Waves." →

# Greenwood's Lancaster maritime patrol history, in detail

The Lancaster on the Greenwood runway is gleaming – sure, there are oil and exhaust streaks down the wings from the engines, and there are coiled lines on the asphalt as the aircraft is serviced, but the trim work and detail on the newest aircraft in the Greenwood Military Aviation Museum's collection is perfect.

"I'm pretty happy with it," says Major (retired) Bob Johnson, standing back from the three-foot-square shaped Plexiglas case displaying the model he built and donated to the museum October 20.

This Lancaster Mark X is a 1:32nd scale: the original's 112-foot wingspan is reduced to three feet in the model – "It's a big," Johnson says, "if you

know models. It came out of my shop in pieces." The model is meant to represent KB959, a Lancaster with 405 (Long Range Patrol) Squadron that flew maritime patrol until it was retired and sent for scrap in 1965.

"This aircraft shows how the air force evolved," Johnson says. "Just the paint scheme alone – this was one of the first applications of a lightning bolt on the chin, and what we saw on the Neptune, the Argus, the Aurora – it came from those early Lancasters."

Johnson's model includes the APS 33 radome, search windows in the back and depicts the movement of the mid-upper turret forward, alleviating worry then with weight and balance issues in flight. As the model sits on the runway, Johnson added in a period-correct tow

tractor model he sourced in Italy, cables and wheel chucks: "a tremendous amount of detail. "There are 824 parts. This was something I always wanted to do and, when the model came out two years ago and the pandemic happened – it all worked out. It took 900 hours, and lots of research because I wanted to get it right."

14 Wing Greenwood Commander Colonel Tom Goldie, himself the most recent commander of 405 Squadron, accepted the model donation on behalf of the museum.

"I'm speechless – this is a beautiful model, and I'm extremely proud to be here," Goldie said. "The detail is exceptional, and it's obvious your conversions worked from the company's model kit to what you've built – this is one of a kind." →


