Greenwood gives **Combined Charities** pulls off record year

14 Wing Greenwood's charitable efforts blew the top off the thermometer tracking the dollars.

January 10, Combined Charities committee members met to look at \$63,000 and how best to distribute it among close to 80 agencies at the local, provincial and national level.

"Thanks, everyone, for all their hard work - and that's coming from the wing commander right on down," committee co-chairman Captain James Murdock said. "We're all happy."

The 2012 goal was an ambitious \$50,000 - \$10,000 more than the 2011 campaign. With just a few months from the September kick-off to the end of December, the committee was busy. Several big events, including the Festival of Trees silent auction, a mega potluck, dress down Fridays and a chance to jail and dunk the boss; were held, along with pay allotment contributions from 14 Wing personnel.

"In November, we took a big jump - 404 Squadron collected \$4,000 alone it its Movember challenge, and then in December, the fire hall held its annual food drive and gathered the equivalent of over \$4,000 in food donations," Murdock said.

Pay allotment contributions were down by \$7,000, but wing participation in all the special events more than made up the difference.

Co-chairwoman Major Andrea MacRae credited the work of committee volunteers, representing every base branch through meetings, planning and running events and representing Combined Charities' goal so well.

"A lot of the success is a result of your hard work - and it was a lot of fun being part of this committee," she said.

The funds will be disbursed to a variety of charities: more than 80 per cent work and serve in the local area. Some are designated recipients by 14 Wing personnel through the pay allotment program; others are recognized base-wide for the work they do. Chief recipients include local schools' breakfast programs and community food banks. There are also a number of sports, health, animal welfare and emergency services on the list.

SAR Tech injured on training jump

While conducting confined-area parachute descents from a CC-130 Hercules over Cloud Lake January 9, a 14 Wing Greenwood search and rescue technician from 413 Squadron was injured at approximately 3:20 p.m.

A CH-149 Cormorant helicopter was in the area conducting local training and was able to quickly respond and transport the injured SAR Tech to Halifax, where he received medical attention. Although initially it was determined the SAR Tech suffered minor muscular and skeletal injuries, it was later determined he did suffer major life-threatening torso, back and rib injuries. He was operated on later that night.

The cause of the parachute accident is under investigation. Confined-area jumps include those into crash sites or other rescue situations where the area to land is quite limited. 413 Transport and Rescue Squadron conducts training missions daily to ensure high readiness in order to respond to SAR missions of all types.

Crews assist in search for fisherman

14 Wing Greenwood search and rescue crews put in a full shift as part of a search of waters 30 kilometres off Yarmouth January 12 for a missing lobster fisherman.

The call was reported to the joint rescue centre in Halifax just before 6 p.m., and 413 Squadron's Cormorant 902 and Hercules 332 left Greenwood just after 8 p.m. and 9 p.m., respectively, to help area fishermen and two Canadian Coast Guard vessels covering the area on the water. The aircraft dropped 86 flares, each lasting four minutes: the Cormorant was on site eight hours, while the Hercules was out for seven-and-a-half hours.

The search was called off around 8 a.m. January 13. Yarmouth Rural RCMP will investigate the incident as a missing persons case. Missing and presumed drowned is 20-year-old Michael Jeffrey Doucette from Wedgeport.







Campagne de charité à Greenwood

Le Comité des œuvres de bienfaisance connaît une année record

Les activités de bienfaisance de la 14° Escadre Greenwood ont fait « exploser » le thermomètre servant à enregistrer les sommes recueillies.

Le 10 janvier dernier, les membres du Comité des œuvres de bienfaisance se sont réunis pour faire le point et déterminer la meilleure façon de distribuer à près de 80 organismes locaux, provinciaux et nationaux les 63 000 \$ recueillis.

« Nous vous remercions tous pour votre excellent travail – et ces remerciements viennent du commandant de l'Escadre et de toute la hiérarchie, a déclaré le Capitaine James Murdock, coprésident de la campagne. Nous sommes tous très heureux. »

L'objectif de 2012, fixé à 50 000 \$, était ambitieux, soit 10 000 \$ de plus que l'objectif de 2011. Du lancement de la campagne en septembre

jusqu'à la fin de décembre, le Comité s'est affairé. Plusieurs activités d'envergure ont été organisées, dont l'encan silencieux du Festival des arbres, un grand repas à la fortune du pot, les vendredis décontractés et une activité « plongeon ou prison pour le patron », en plus des contributions par délégation de solde du personnel de la 14e Escadre.

« En novembre, nous avons fait un grand saut. En effet, le 404° Escadron a recueilli à lui seul 4 000 \$ lors de son défi Movember. Puis, en décembre, la Caserne de pompiers a tenu sa collecte annuelle d'aliments et a amassé plus de 4 000 \$ en dons d'aliments », a expliqué le Capitaine Murdock.

Les contributions par délégation de solde ont connu une baisse de 7 000 \$ cette année, mais la participation de l'Escadre à toutes les activités spéciales a amplement compensé l'écart.

Les fonds seront versés à divers organismes de bienfaisance. Plus de

80 p. 100 d'entre eux offrent leurs services dans la région. Certains sont des bénéficiaires désignés par le personnel de la 14e Escadre dans le cadre du programme de délégation de solde. D'autres sont reconnus sur toute la base pour le travail qu'ils accomplissent. Les principaux bénéficiaires sont des programmes de petits déjeuners pour les écoles locales et des banques alimentaires communautaires. La liste d'organismes comprend aussi un certain nombre de programmes sportifs, de programmes de santé, de services de bien-être des animaux et de services d'urgence.

Museum celebrates 2012 success

Malcolm Uhlman, **Greenwood Military Aviation** Museum

Highlight after highlight marked the most exciting vear vet at the Greenwood Museum. Volunteers, staff, wing squadrons and branches, and the community at large all contributed to the best of their ability to make 2012 an designated critics from higher headquarters all agreed this museum is among the Canadian military's very best.

The museum extension now houses the beautifully-restored Anson MkII aircraft, after its momentous move from storage in 10 Hangar. The Dakota restoration is nearing completion, with painting well underway, and the concrete pads are awaiting its display in the museum air park in the spring. Major advancements have been made on the nose and tail sections of the Bolingbroke, and the Sperwer UAV restoration is nearing completion with painting and reassembly. The newest restoration, a search and rescue Piasecki H-44 Helicopter, will commence in 2013, the nose section having been trucked from Wetaskiwin, Alberta in 2012. Refreshment of the lettering and decals has really spruced up the Labrador

outstanding year. Even the helicopter, and the removal of the Lancaster nose reflects the beginning of the conversion to a World War II 405 Squadron model.

> Preparing to join the restored aircraft is a 1946 Willys Jeep and a, period-correct, Jeep trailer, both donated to the museum. After modification and painting, these vehicles will complement the museum's aircraft display. Other items on inventory, or expected but not yet restored, include an aircraft tug. fire truck, CP-140 flight deck simulator, QUAD radar and Aurora engine.

> There have been three large airplane models added to the collection: a Mosquito, Beaufighter and an Air Cadet glider. Four new oil paintings were donated, bringing the mseum total to 50. A new display is under construction on Canada's and Greenwood's role in NATO, and many co-




