Men take regional title No national repeat for Greenwood women

Atlantic Regional Canadian Forces' hockey titles split this year, between Formation Halifax and 14 Wing Greenwood.

The Greenwood men's team defeated Halifax 5-3 in the final February 15, at the Greenwood Gardens Arena. Game MVP was #6, Dave Jenkins, and the tournament MVP was #1, Chris Lindsay both from Greenwood. The men earned their way to the final with a mixed bag of results in the double round robin tournament

February 12 through 15: an opening 3-2 win over CTC Gagetown, a 3-3 tie with Halifax, and then a 5-3 loss to Halifax and a second 5-4 loss to Gagetown.

Halifax had a 9-8 win over Gagetown in its opener, solidified with a 5-2 win the next day, plus the win over Greenwood and tie.

On the women's side, the 14 Wing team failed in its attempt to return to the CF national tournament – but the outcome was in question through five periods of hockey in the final against Halifax. When regular play timed out at 2-2, the

teams battled out a 10-minute fourth period before Halifax's Kirsten Lindstol scored four-and-a-half minutes into a 15-minute fifth. Player of the game was Greenwood's #15 Serena Palmer; while tournament MVP was team captain Charlene Arsenault.

Atlantic Region sports director Fred Williams, Fitness & Sports Centre manager here in Greenwood, recognized Arsenault as one of the original – and still playing – female CF hockey players.

"I've been to nationals every year except one – I was

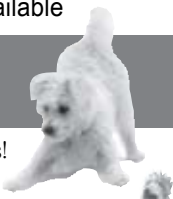

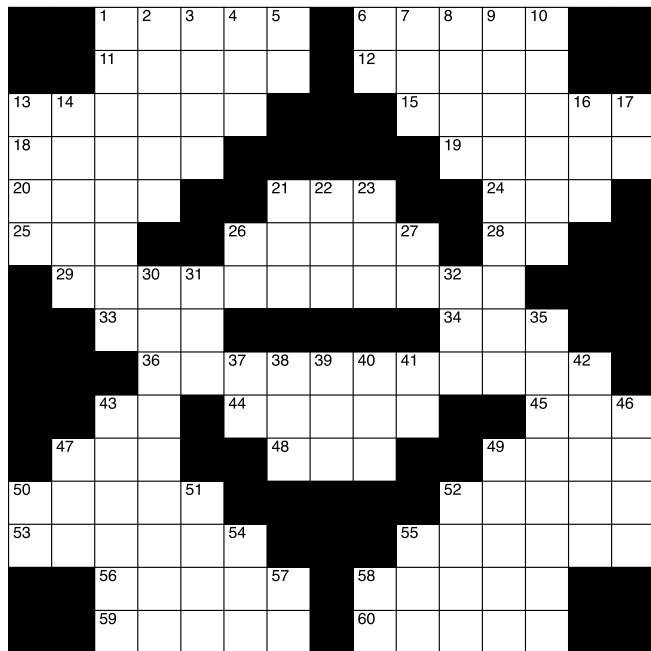

# Milestone birthday marked

A special lady turned 109 February 15: Edrie Beeler, a resident of Tibbetts Home for Special Care in Wilmot.

She received well wishes from friends, neighbours and family from across Nova Scotia and Ontario, had many telephone calls, and local MLAs and church members helped celebrate the special time. Five generations of the family were in attendance. In addition, numerous pink flamingos arrived for the day. Pictures were taken at the party and everyone enjoyed cake and drinks. CTV's Live at 5 shared a photo of Mrs. Beeler on its newscast and numerous local newspapers had articles. Daughter Jean and Jim Moore actually celebrated their 60th wedding anniversary February 14, the day before Mrs. Beeler's birthday.

Mrs. Beeler is one of the oldest Nova Scotians, and remains in pretty good health. She was born February 15, 1904 in Victory, Annapolis County. At 18, she travelled to Boston to train as a nurse; in 1925, she graduated as a registered nurse and valedictorian of her class. She spent the next three years doing private nursing duties in the Boston area. In 1928, Mrs. Beeler returned to Nova Scotia and was soon married to her childhood love, Murray C. Beeler. In 1930, her husband and his brother, Ken, bought a hardware store in Annapolis Royal and ran it under the name of Beeler Bros. The couple raised two children, Jean and George,


and Mrs. Beeler was active in Annapolis Royal community life. In the late 1930s, she was very involved in having the Annapolis Royal General Hospital conceived and built. Over the next 40 years, she was president of the Hospital Aid Society. After Murray's death in 1967, Mrs. Beeler continued to run the store until it was sold in 1968. In 1985, she sold her home in Annapolis Royal and moved to the local senior citizens' home, where she resided until 2000, when she moved to Tibbetts Home for Special Care in Wilmot.

At 109, she enjoys playing a game of Scrabble and reading the newspaper. She is much loved by her son and daughter, as well as five grandchildren, nine great-grandchildren and five great-great-grandchildren; and by all those who know her over the many years of her life.


