Making invisible known Wing commander's diversity session focuses on unseen issues

An open discussion on issues not often seen is the goal of 14 Wing Greenwood Commander Colonel Jim Irvine's diversity session April 5, at 1 p.m. in the Annapolis Mess.

"Please make this a priority in your busy schedules. I think it will prove to be worth your time," says Irvine.

This is the third year for the initiative, and Irvine is presenting an afternoon with dynamic guest speakers and information on the theme, invisible disabilities. This professional development session is open to the base community.

14 Wing Honorary Colonel Barb Stegemann will share her own story of living and working with an invisible disability: an undiagnosed hereditary hearing impairment. She discovered the impairment at age 21, but refused to get hearing aids until she was 36. She now understands how family poverty prevented an earlier diagnosis, how her own reasons for waiting to get help affected her life

and career and how facing the challenges and accepting her impairment has made a difference – and can actually be seen as a unique "gift" as she continues to face personal and business challenges.

Warrant Officer Robert Dolsen, an instructor at the Gagetown infantry school, was featured in the "Be the Difference" video, and has had his own journey with an invisible disability through his military experiences and deployment.

14 Wing's own combined advisory group, through the employment equity office, is

supporting the wing commander's presentation, part of its work to "champion" issues facing women, Aboriginals, people with disabilities and around racial discrimination. Employment equity officer Lori Gordon says invisible disabilities are a bigger issue than people think: "because they're invisible."

"People are reluctant to talk about their impairments, but it's important it happens: it's all about education, education, education."

The Employment Equity Act considers an invisible disability one that is long-term or recurring, and which an individual feels puts them at a disadvantage – or could be seen as a disadvantage by an employer.

"The Canadian Armed Forces has its own universality of service standards, but it really works well with the Employment Equity Act, and the CAF's own Integrated Personnel Support Centres and Joint Personnel Support Unit programs.

"It's a network of partners."

Les problèmes invisibles, cœur de cible de la séance du commandant de l'Escadre sur la diversité

Un débat ouvert sur les problèmes qui passent souvent inaperçus : tel est l'objectif du Colonel Jim Irvine, commandant de la 14^e Escadre, pour la séance sur la diversité qu'il animera le 5 avril, à 13 h à la Mess Annapolis.

« Ne manquez pas d'inscrire comme priorité cette activité à votre agenda. Je suis convaincu que vous ne le regretterez pas » dit le Colonel Irvine.

C'est la troisième année que la séance sur la diversité est organisée. Le Colonel Irvine nous prépare un après-midi captivant, avec des orateurs dynamiques et de l'information sur le thème des handicaps invisibles. Cette séance de perfectionnement professionnel s'adresse à toute la population de la base.

M^{me} Barb Stegemann, colonel honoraire de la 14^e Escadre, racontera son histoire. Elle vit et travaille avec un handicap invisible : une déficience auditive héréditaire non diagnostiquée, qu'elle a découverte à l'âge de 21 ans. Ayant refusé les aides auditives jusqu'à l'âge de 36 ans,

elle comprend aujourd'hui comment la pauvreté de sa famille a empêché qu'un diagnostic soit posé plus tôt, combien sa propre décision d'attendre pour obtenir des soins a pesé sur sa vie et sur sa carrière, et comment la confrontation aux difficultés et l'acceptation de son handicap ont changé sa vie, et peuvent même être considérées comme lui ayant apporté un atout extraordinaire, puisqu'elle continue à relever des défis, tant personnels que professionnels.

L'Adjudant Robert Dolson, instructeur à l'École d'infanterie de Gagetown, qu'on peut voir dans la vidéo « Be the Difference », a suivi, lui aussi, tant dans son quotidien de militaire que dans le cadre de déploiements, un parcours semé d'obstacles en raison d'un handicap invisible.

Par l'intermédiaire du bureau de l'équité en matière d'em-

ploi, le groupe consultatif de la 14^e Escadre appuie la séance du commandant, dans le cadre de son rôle de « champion » de la cause des femmes, des Autochtones, des personnes handicapées et des victimes de discrimination raciale. Pour Lori Gordon, agent de l'équité en matière d'emploi, le handicap invisible est un problème plus grave qu'on le croit, justement parce qu'il est invisible.

« Les gens hésitent à parler de leur handicap, mais il est important pour eux de le faire : c'est une question d'éducation, rien d'autre. »

D'après la *Loi sur l'équité en matière d'emploi*, un handicap est une déficience durable ou récurrente qui peut être considérée, par les personnes qui en souffrent ou par d'éventuels employeurs, comme un désavantage.

Logements abordables pour les membres des FAC à Ottawa

Même si les mois d'été sont habituellement tranquilles pour le milieu des Forces armées canadiennes, ce n'est pas tout le personnel qui profite de cette période d'accalmie.

Pour les organismes de logement militaire, la saison des affectations est la plus occupée de l'année. Ce fut certainement

le cas pour le Service autonome de logement (SAL), géré par le Programme de soutien du personnel (PSP) à Ottawa, qui a aidé le personnel des FAC au cours de la dernière saison à changer de résidence.

Dans le cadre de son mandat qui consiste à fournir un logement abordable et propre

aux militaires subalternes, le SAL supervise 545 unités de logement résidentiel (ULR) comprenant 519 maisons en rangée et 26 bungalows sur la base militaire Uplands.

Malgré la demande, des unités sont encore disponibles pour les militaires affectés dans la région de la capitale

nationale. Les militaires admissibles doivent être des Cplc ou des grades inférieurs, des Élofs, des Slt ou des Lt (sauf la Marine). Les réservistes de classe B ou C sont aussi admissibles, pour autant qu'ils aient un contrat d'un an ou plus au moment de leur demande.

La priorité de l'attribution

des logements est accordée aux familles militaires (y compris les célibataires avec personnes à charge). Les militaires célibataires sont inscrits sur une liste d'attente distincte, et du logement leur est offert lorsqu'ils répondent à toutes les exigences liées aux logements familiaux. Le

SAL accepte également les demandes des sergents et des PM2 à titre temporaire.

Leo Jenkins joined Squadron CFS St John's in 1978 and transferred to the Regular Force in 1984. He was posted to CFB Moose Jaw as an aero engine technician on the CT114 Tutors. In 1988, he was selected as a tech crewman on the Snowbirds. After two years, he returned to Moose Jaw, awaiting posting to CFB Greenwood in 1991. He remustered to flight engineer in 1992, moving to 427 Tactical Helicopter Squadron Petawawa and the CH135 Twin Huey. In 1995, he was promoted to master corporal and posted to 403 Squadron OTU as an instructor on the CH146 Griffin. In 1998, as sergeant, Jenkins was posted

back to Greenwood; then, in 1999 to 405 Long Range Patrol Squadron and the CP140 Aurora. Jenkins joined the Militia as a radio operator with 728 Communications as a flight engineer. In 2011, he returned to 14 Wing, joining 404 Squadron, and he is presently the senior flight engineer instructor. Jenkins has been a mem-

Affordable housing accommodations for CAF members in Ottawa

While the summer months are generally quiet throughout the Canadian Armed Forces community, not everyone benefits from the relative downtime.

For military housing organizations, the posting season is the busiest time of the year. This has certainly been the case for the Self-Help Housing Organization (SHHO), managed by Personnel Support Programs (PSP) Ottawa, which has been working this past season to help local CAF personnel in their change of residence.

With its mandate to provide

clean affordable housing to junior-ranked military personnel, Self-Help Housing oversees 545 Residential Housing Units consisting of 519 townhouses and 26 bungalows, located at Uplands.

Despite the demand, units are still available to CAF members being posted to the National Capital Region. Eligible members must be master corporal and below, OCdt, 2nd Lieutenant, or lieutenant (not including Navy). Class B or C Reservists are also eligible, provided they are in possession of a year or more contract at the

time of application.

Housing priority is given to military families (which includes single members with dependants). Single members are placed on a separate waiting list and are offered housing when all the family housing requirements have been met. SHH is also currently accepting application from sergeants/ petty officer 2nd class on a temporary basis.

Greenwood hosts Atlantic squash championship

Squash teams from CFB Halifax, CFB Gagetown, 12 Wing Shearwater and 14 Wing Greenwood gathered in Greenwood March 19 to 22 to compete for the Atlantic Regional squash championship.

The nine-member teams consisted of four open players, a master player, a senior player, an under-30 player and two female players. The 14 Wing team included Major Gilles Couture (404 Squadron) in the Open 1 division, and as team captain; Sergeant Alain Chalifoux (14 Air Maintenance Squadron) in Open 2; Major Kurt Lalonde (Maritime Proving and Evaluation Unit) in Open 3, Master Warrant Officer Dave MacLeod (MPEU) in Open 4, Major Allan Taylor (Wing Logistics and Engineering) in masters, Corporal Russ Francis (14 AMS) in senior, Corporal Ryan Doyle (14 AMS) as the under-30 player, Captain Jennifer Finateri (413 Squadron) in female Open 1 and Captain Genevieve

Dussault (Wing Commander) in female Open 2.

14 Wing was one of the favourites to win the title; however, 12 Wing fielded a strong team. After a gruelling day-and-a-half of competition, 12 Wing's team depth proved to be just a little too much, with 14 Wing ceding the coveted regional championship banner by just seven points.

An individual competition took place Wednesday afternoon through Friday to determine the Atlantic team which will compete at the national squash championship at CFB Borden May 4 to 10. The competition proved difficult, with some players having four matches Thursday, followed by semi-final and final matches on Friday. Despite the taxing schedule, an excellent level of skill and sportsmanship was evident. The overall result is an excellent Team Atlantic that should represent the region strongly, as they attempt to re-capture the national title for the fourth time in seven years. 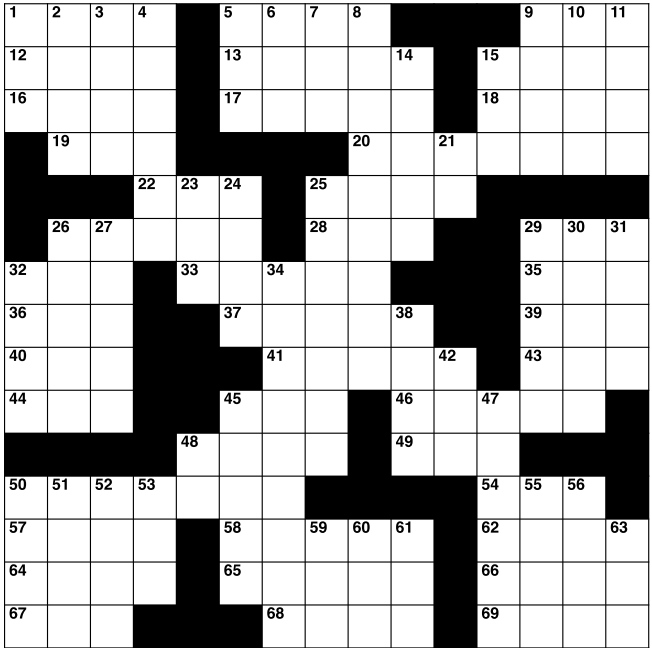
