## Sharing flight safety know-how

The career experience, knowledge and hands-on thinking that make up comprehensive flight safety standards needs to be shared.

Colonel Yvan Choiniere and Master Warrant Officer Vince

Bolduc from the Royal Canadian Air Force's Directorate of Flight Safety were at 14 Wing Greenwood April 16 through 18, making presentations on recent incidents and investigations, but also to bolster the idea of coaching and supervision.

"Our Air Force is young, many of our people have a lot of

experience under the pressures of combat time," Choiniere said. "Forty per cent of our people have 10 years or less left, and our young people are keen – and they need guidance."

He urged senior RACF personnel to "pass that experience along so they don't make our mistakes."

Even further, though, Bolduc said age and experience don't matter if someone – anyone – spots a flight safety issue.

"It could be knowledge from a private to a sergeant, from someone in your crew who is a subject expert to the newcomer," Bolduc said. "Knowledge has to be shared."

# Partager le savoir-faire en matière de sécurité des vols

L'expérience professionnelle, les connaissances et la conception pratique, qui contribuent à l'établissement de normes de sécurité des vols complètes, doivent être partagées.

Le colonel Yvan Choiniere et l'adjudant-maître Vince Bolduc, de la Direction de la sécurité des vols de l'Aviation royale du Canada (ARC), étaient à la 14<sup>e</sup> Escadre Greenwood, du 16 au 18 avril, pour faire des exposés sur les récents incidents et enquêtes de sécurité, mais également pour soutenir les idées d'encadrement et de supervision.

« L'effectif de la force aérienne est jeune, un grand nombre de nos gens ont beaucoup

Caporal S.Wilson, Service d'imagerie de l'Escadre du 14 EMA

d'expérience des pressions en période de combat. Quarante pour cent de notre personnel

sont à 10 ans ou moins de l'âge de la retraite, et les jeunes sont enthousiastes – et ont besoin de

conseils », a dit Choiniere.

Il exhorte le personnel senior de l'ARC à « transmettre cette expérience afin qu'ils ne fassent pas nos erreurs »

Allant même plus loin, Bolduc a affirmé que l'âge et l'expérience ne comptent pas si quelqu'un – n'importe qui – détecte un problème de sécurité des vols.

« Il pourrait s'agir d'une transmission de connaissance d'un soldat à un sergent, d'un membre d'équipage, expert en la matière, à une nouvelle recrue. La connaissance doit être partagée », a indiqué Bolduc.

Les deux hommes ont affirmé que l'accent mis sur la supervision en 2012 aurait un lien avec la réduction des incidents de sécurité des vols causés par le personnel. La Direction s'est rendue à la 14<sup>e</sup> Escadre à trois reprises au cours des trois dernières années pour examiner les incidents « et apprendre beaucoup », a indiqué Choiniere.

Qu'est-ce qui est à déclarer? La sécurité des vols comprend divers incidents, notamment les intrusions sur les pistes, les problèmes

de maintenance des aéronefs et les blessures causées au personnel au sol et dans les airs – qu'ils aient effectivement eu lieu ou non.

« L'objectif est que les gens signalent les incidents afin que nous puissions tous apprendre et faire en sorte qu'ils ne se reproduisent », a dit Choiniere.

Le système de déclaration non punitif de l'ARC est unique : l'échange d'information au sujet d'une réparation mal effectuée, d'un incident pendant le vol ou d'une question relative à une pièce, d'une norme relative à une pratique ou à un entraînement est nécessaire pour le plus grand bénéfice de tous les membres d'équipage au sol et du personnel navigant.

« Vous ne faites jamais d'erreurs? », demande-t-il. « Nous sommes tous humains – que pouvons-nous apprendre? Quel est le niveau de risque acceptable, et comment pouvons-nous éviter des accidents à ce niveau? »

Cela ne signifie pas qu'il n'y aurait jamais de blâme, a indiqué Choiniere, mais la violation in-

tentionnelle des règles n'a rien à voir avec la sécurité des vols : « Il s'agit-là d'une question qui relève de la chaîne de commandement ».

Il a félicité les responsables de la sécurité des vols à Greenwood pour leurs efforts visant à maintenir en priorité les questions et la pratique en matière de sécurité des vols, mais a également encouragé tout le personnel à continuer d'apporter leurs contributions.

« Vous êtes sur le terrain, et vous savez ce qui se passe »

Le lieutenant-colonel Scott Latter, officier des opérations de l'escadre, a confirmé plus tard l'engagement à la supervision cette année du colonel Jim Irvine, commandant de l'escadre, car Irvine est soucieux de mettre en place l'« environnement de sécurité qui convient ».

« Cet exposé offre un examen peu reluisant des incidents qui se produisent, et comment les petits détails peuvent rapidement prendre de l'ampleur. Par le souci du détail, toute personne peut contribuer au programme de sécurité ».

The men said focusing on supervision through 2012 may have something to do with a decrease in personnel-caused flight safety incidents. The directorate was called in to 14 Wing three times in the last three years, looking into incidents “and learning a lot,” Choiniere said.

What's reportable? Flight safety includes everything from runway incursions to aircraft maintenance concerns to personnel injuries on the ground or in the air – whether they actually happen, or could have.

“The intent is for people to report so we can all learn about it and keep it from happening again,” Choiniere said.

The RCAF's non-punitive reporting system is unique: sharing information about a repair done incorrectly, an in-flight mishap or a question about a part, practice or training standard is meant for the greater good of all ground and air crew members.

You never make mistakes?” he asked. “We're all human –

what can we learn? What's an acceptable level of risk, and how can we prevent incidents to that level?”

It doesn't mean there may never be blame, Choiniere said, but intentional breaking of rules has nothing to do with flight safety: “that's a chain of command issue.”

He commended Greenwood

flight safety leaders for their work keeping issues top of mind and practice, but encouraged all personnel to keep their input coming.

“You guys are in the field, and you know what's happening.”

Wing Operations Officer Lieutenant-Colonel Scott Latter confirmed Wing Commander Colonel Jim Irvine's commit-

ment to supervision this year, as Irvine is keen to generate the “right kind of safety environment.”

“This presentation is a sobering look at the incidents that do happen, and how the small details can quickly develop. Attention to detail in a safety program is something anyone can be involved with.”

Line a large sheet pan with waxed paper. Place cereal and dried cranberries in a large re-sealable plastic bag. In a microwavable bowl, add chocolate chips, almond butter and margarine. Microwave on High heat, uncovered, for one minute. Stir. Microwave for another 30 seconds; remove and stir until smooth. Pour chocolate mixture into plastic bag, seal and shake to coat evenly. Add almond flour, sliced almonds and confectioners' sugar. Reseal and shake to coat. Spread mixture on waxed paper and cool completely. Refrigerate in an airtight container; mix can be stored for up to one week.

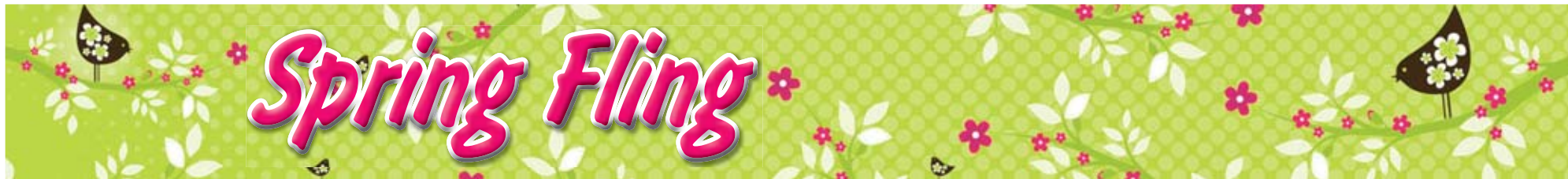

# Grilling equipment does matter to outdoor chefs

(NC) - The 24th annual Weber Canadian GrillWatch Survey found one-fifth of respondents own two or more grills. Over 65% of outdoor chefs prefer black, stainless steel, or a combination of the two, for their grill colour of choice. Thirty-eight per cent of those surveyed said the side burner is important to have and a feature they use often. Just over one-quarter use a rotisserie when grilling and, last year, the Weber grill became the number one purchase choice. While only 5% of Canadians own smokers, the interest in this type of outdoor cooking is quite high, with 30% of respondents admitting they’d like to learn more about this low and slow cooking method. Smokers are more likely to be owned by Ontarians and outdoor chefs in Western Canada and their use has increased over last year. Seventeen per cent report using the smoker once a week or more, up from 4% in 2011. The ubiquitous charcoal grill is still a favourite of 13% of survey respondents; however, 43% feel this is the most challenging of all outdoor cooking methods.

# Vehicles need spring cleaning, too

**Check the wear pattern of your tires** – If you notice certain parts are becoming more worn than others, take a look some of the possible causes: wear on inside and outside edges indicates under-inflation, wear in center indicates over-inflation. If there are cups or dips in the tread, you have worn suspension parts. Sawtooth edges indicate misalignment.

**Change your car's shoes** – Now is the time to change tires from winter to summer or all-season, if you haven't already.

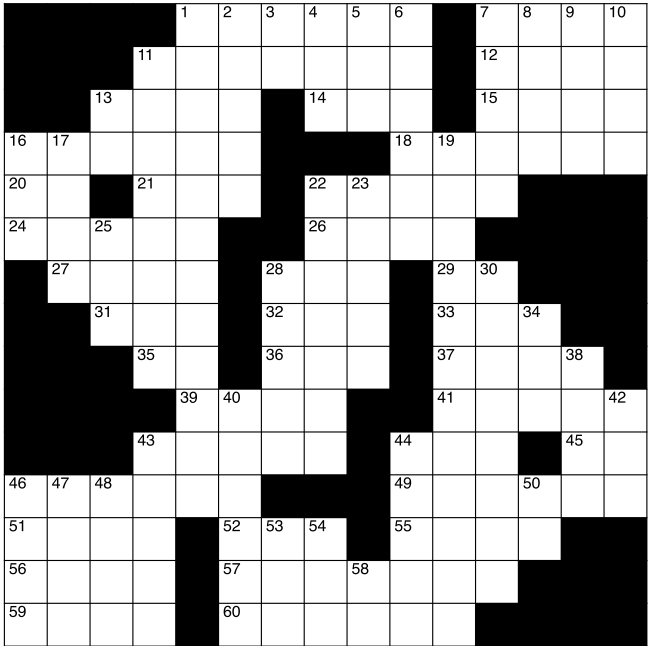

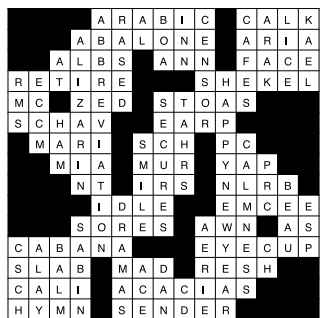

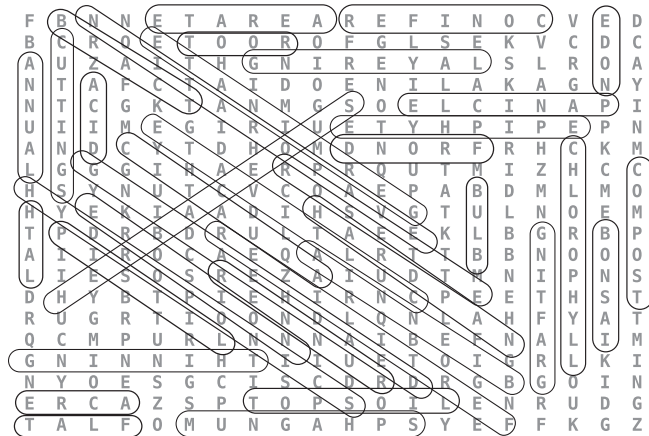
