## Aldershot handover an exchange of the 'unique'

Unexpected, out-of-theordinary, complex and unique are just a few of the words various leaders used to describe work and life at Camp Aldershot, the 5<sup>th</sup> Canadian Division's Training Centre Detachment in North Kentville.

Major Troy Kennedy turned over command of the camp to Major Brent Kerr August 22, a "bittersweet moment because I'm giving up something I care about very deeply, I've put a lot of myself into in - it's my family."

Kennedy, whose father grew up in nearby Sheffield Mills, whose family lived later in Granville Ferry, who attended Acadia University and actually began his military career at Camp Aldershot as a member of the West Nova Scotia Regiment; said the opportunity to come "home" and command the camp was a "dream come true.

"And then, it's kind of like a dog chasing a car – when he catches it, what does he do with it?"

Kennedy said getting to know the internal workings and overall responsibilities of the camp is complicated. With a small number of people, meeting the training needs of soldiers, RCMP, Coast Guard, Reserve forces, mote from Gagetown, the

international military units and many others who are lodgers at the camp's facilities is "an incredible amount of work.

"And we've been very successful."

Kennedy was particularly proud of the profile the camp has built through partnerships with its surrounding community, and projects close to Valley hearts. In 2012, the Town of Kentville gave soldiers at the camp freedom of the town in a ceremonial parade. Through his three-and-a-half years as CO, the Aldershot team helped raise over \$120,000 for the Valley Regional Health Foundation, just one of many charities it supports.

Colonel George Thomson, commander of 36 Canadian Brigade Group, recently left Aldershot from his post as CO of the WNSR. He served with Kennedy years before, and both arrived at Aldershot at the same time in their respective commands. He presented Kennedy a coin in appreciation of his service to both the WNSR and 36 Brigade.

A day after he tells the tale of the div, the father gives away his own daughter to a wealthy


