## Training, testing for emergencies

A morning in class is the price to be paid to ensure 14 Wing Greenwood responders are ready in case of an emergency.

September 26, the base's emergency response program hosted a set of seminars, covering everything from fire services to damage control at a scene to partnerships with non-military paramedical and communications agencies.

"We have to make sure we maximize this program," said Lieutenant-Colonel Scott Latter, commanding officer of Wing Operations and in charge of the A3 Readiness and Evaluation team.

"It's my insurance policy for what may or may not happen on or off the base – and I hope it never happens. This training is our payment of this policy."

Latter said the level of training, whether it is through online directories, table top exercises or fully staged emergency scenes; "makes me comfortable."

"Our emergency response program is well-lauded within the Canadian Armed Forces, due to a lot of work."

The readiness team regularly gathers and updates all the information on contacts, equipment and personnel the base has at hand and in the surrounding community.

"It's a collaborative effort," said Captain Dave Nelson, the training day organizer. "Once a plan is developed – and there are 26 chapters in that document – a lot of input has to come in from wing contributors to make the file work. We always want to try and make it better."

And, because "there is not much point in a plan if you don't actually test it, you make sure it actually works."

There are regular tests of the plan at 14 Wing, at various levels and scales: coming up October 31, a full airfield scenario will be re-enacted, meaning the plan's multiple elements will be called upon to move.

"The results from events like that will help us re-develop the plan if required. It's a living document."

## A quiet 60 years Lone visitor marks Lancaster crash anniversary

Myles Meed, 81, marked a quiet 60th anniversary tragedy at 14 Wing Greenwood October 9, with a solitary visit he's made

several times since a fateful day in 1953.

Then, he was a young airman, working in aircraft radio repair on RCAF Station Greenwood's Lancaster bombers, leftovers from the Second World War

being used for coastal patrols. After every 1,000 hours of flight, the planes were torn apart and inspected, rebuilt and ready for a test flight. Ground crew were taken along to check for any problems with radio, radar, air-

frame or aero engine systems.

"I was being paid \$87 a month, and any of the ground crew who could get eight hours' flying time in a month received \$30 more," Meed says. "This created a race: every time there

was a test flight, the overtime might be five or six hours - but no one got up to eight."

A new "rule" was made: in future, a list would be posted in each section of whose turn it would be to do all the flying that month, so at least one person would get the \$30. Then, their name would return the bottom of the list to work its way back up.

October 1953 was Meed's "lucky" month in the aircraft radio repair shop: it was his turn for the month's test flights. October 9, a Friday, there were no scheduled test flights, so Meed asked for the afternoon off. He took what time he could to catch the Digby ferry home to Bristol, New Brunswick and visit his parents, as his mother was ill.

"Around 1 o'clock that afternoon, when I was on the ferry, someone in one of the hangers changed their minds and decided to do a test flight, so they called down to the section and asked for me, but I was away. A chap named Green jumped at the chance to go," Meed recalls.

The aircraft had just lifted off when it lost power on both left side engines, while both right side engines were running full throttle for takeoff. The plane immediately turned left, the left wing dropped and the plane crashed between the main station and the married quarters.

All five crew members aboard were killed.

"I heard about the crash on the radio on the ferry, and found out the details when I got back to Greenwood on Monday. I was lined up for that flight - I should have been on it."

Meed left Greenwood within months, and the service after five years, and went on to do many other things in life, but his visits back to Greenwood every

five or 10 years, or more, or less, have continued. Last year, when he was here October 5 and realized how close he was to the actual date, and the 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the crash, he resolved to return again this year from his home in New Brunswick.

"I don't have any particular reason to come, but someone might be interested.

"The Lord's been good to me."

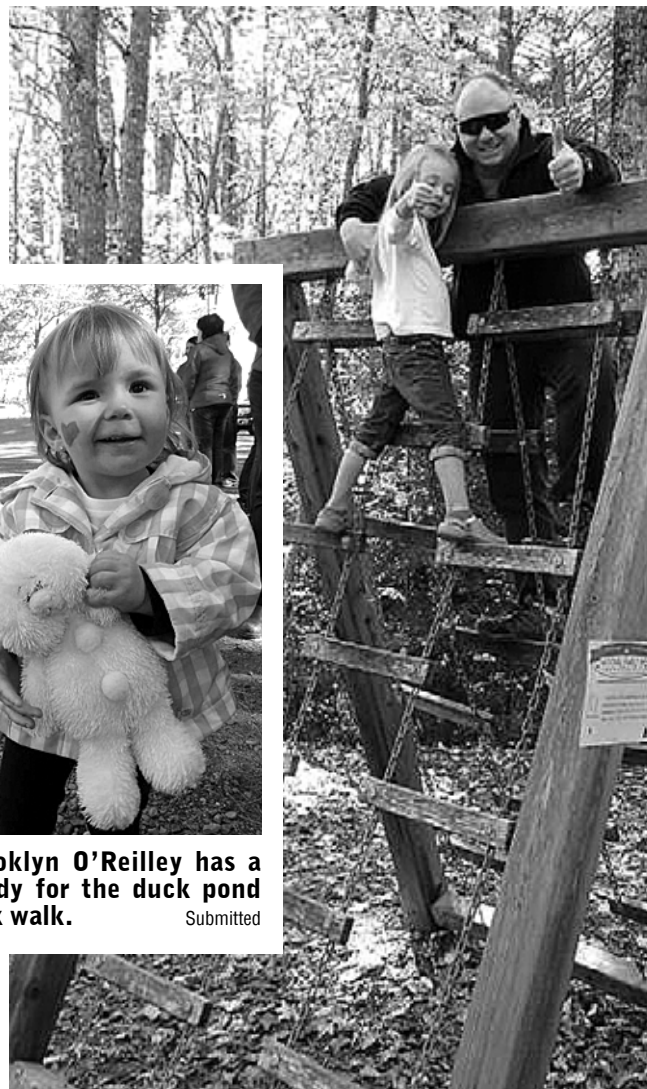

The Canadian Forces Morale and Welfare Services Group delivers a wide range of public morale and welfare programs, services and activities to eligible

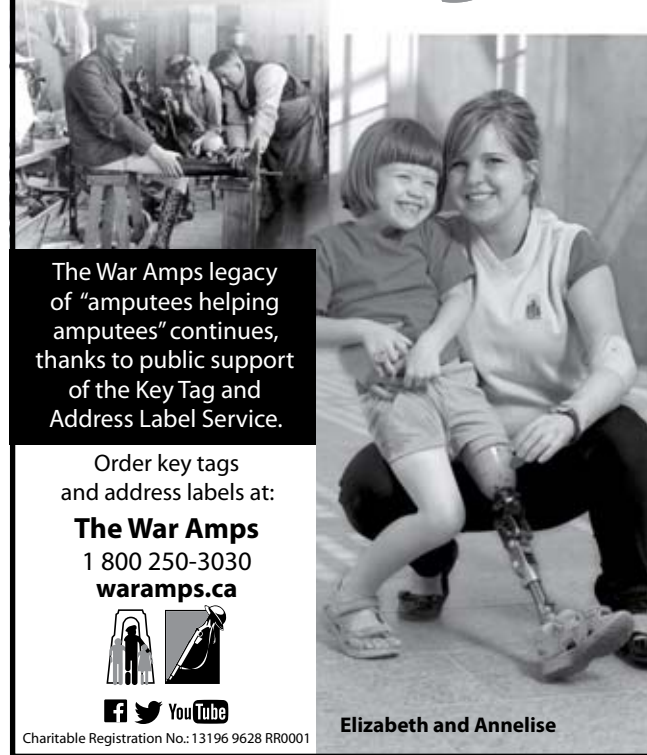

# RCAF unveils new badge

Following the national Battle of Britain ceremony, held in Ottawa September 15, Lieutenant-General Yvan Blondin unveiled the Royal Canadian Air Force's new badge before a crowd of veterans, Royal Canadian Air Force personnel and guests.

Two Cadets from 742 "National Capital" Air Cadet Squadron, located in Ottawa – Flight Corporal William Lambert, 14, and Leading Air Cadet Anne-Florence Lambert, 12 – assisted. The brother and sister knew they were participating in a significant and historic event.

It was "amazing," said FCpl Lambert. LAC Lambert agreed, saying, "I was very proud."

"While we are the youngest of the three services," said Blondin, in a message to RCAF personnel earlier this year, "we have a unique military history, proud traditions, powerful symbols and a strong sense of community."

"Now is the time for us to build upon our heritage, to strengthen the unique identity of the modern RCAF and to better understand our history."

The design of the new badge recalls the pre-unification badge design and shows an eagle flying with its wings outstretched. It replaces the Air Command badge that came into being following the unification of the Canadian Forces in 1968 and that displayed an eagle rising from a Canadian astral crown.

"The new RCAF badge mixes pride in the past with contemporary spirit," continued Blondin. "The eagle flying solo in all environments is a reflection of the confident, experienced, resilient, agile and integrated RCAF."

The Royal Canadian Air Force retains the Air Command motto, *Sic Itur Ad Astra* ("such is the pathway to the stars"). This is, in fact, the Air Force's very first motto, adopted when the Canadian Air Force formed in 1920. *Sic Itur Ad Astra* was replaced by *Per Ardua Ad Astra* ("through adversity to the stars"), the motto of the Royal Air Force, when the Royal Canadian Air Force came into being in 1924.

Since the ascension of Queen Elizabeth II in 1953, all Canadian Armed Forces badges have displayed the St. Edward's Crown (or Queen's Crown), rather than the Tudor Crown (or King's Crown) used during the reigns of her father and grandfather.

The bird depicted on the badge has been the subject of much debate over the years, with some insisting it is an albatross and others maintaining that the bird is an eagle. Though the origins of this debate are murky, that has never stopped a heated argument! To set the record straight (again): it is an eagle.

# L'ARC dévoile son nouvel insigne

Après la cérémonie canadienne de la bataille d'Angleterre, ayant eu lieu à Ottawa le 15 septembre, le lieutenant-général (Lgén) Yvan Blondin a dévoilé le nouvel insigne de l'Aviation royale canadienne (ARC) devant un auditoire constitué d'anciens combattants, de membres de l'ARC et d'invités.

Il était accompagné du caporal de section William Lambert, âgé de 14 ans, et du cadet de l'air de 1re classe

Anne-Florence Lambert, âgée de 12 ans, qui sont tous les deux membres du 742<sup>e</sup> Escadron de cadets de l'Air de la région de la capitale nationale, situé à Ottawa. Le frère et la sœur en question savaient qu'ils participaient à un événement historique important.

Selon le CplS Lambert, c'était « incroyable ». Le Cdt 1 Lambert a renchéri sur les propos de son frère en indiquant : « J'étais très fière. »

« Même si l'ARC est la plus jeune des trois armées, nous possédons une histoire militaire unique, de nobles

traditions, des symboles puissants et un fort sentiment d'appartenance », a indiqué Blondin dans un message destiné au personnel de l'ARC plus tôt cette année.

« Il est maintenant temps pour nous de mettre à profit notre héritage pour renforcer l'identité particulière de l'ARC moderne et mieux comprendre notre histoire. »

Le motif de l'insigne, qui rappelle l'insigne d'avant l'unification, montre un aigle en vol aux ailes déployées. L'insigne du Commandement aérien qui se fait remplacer par le nouvel insigne a vu

le jour après l'unification des Forces canadiennes en 1968. Il représente un aigle qui s'envole d'une couronne astrale canadienne.

« Le nouvel insigne de l'ARC réunit fierté du passé et esprit contemporain, a poursuivi Blondin. L'aigle, qui survole en solo tous les environnements, illustre la confiance, l'expérience, l'adaptabilité, l'agilité et l'intégration de l'ARC. »

L'Aviation royale canadienne conserve la devise du Commandement aérien : Sic Itur Ad Astra (telle est la voie vers les étoiles). Il s'agit

en fait de la toute première devise de la Force aérienne, qui a été adoptée au moment où l'Aviation canadienne a été créée en 1920. La devise Sic Itur Ad Astra a été remplacée par celle de l'Aviation royale, Per Ardua Ad Astra (à travers les embûches jusqu'aux étoiles), lorsque l'Aviation royale du Canada a vu le jour en 1924.

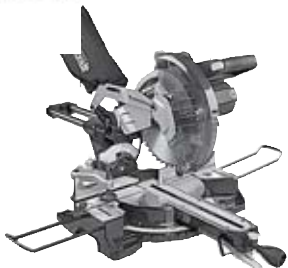

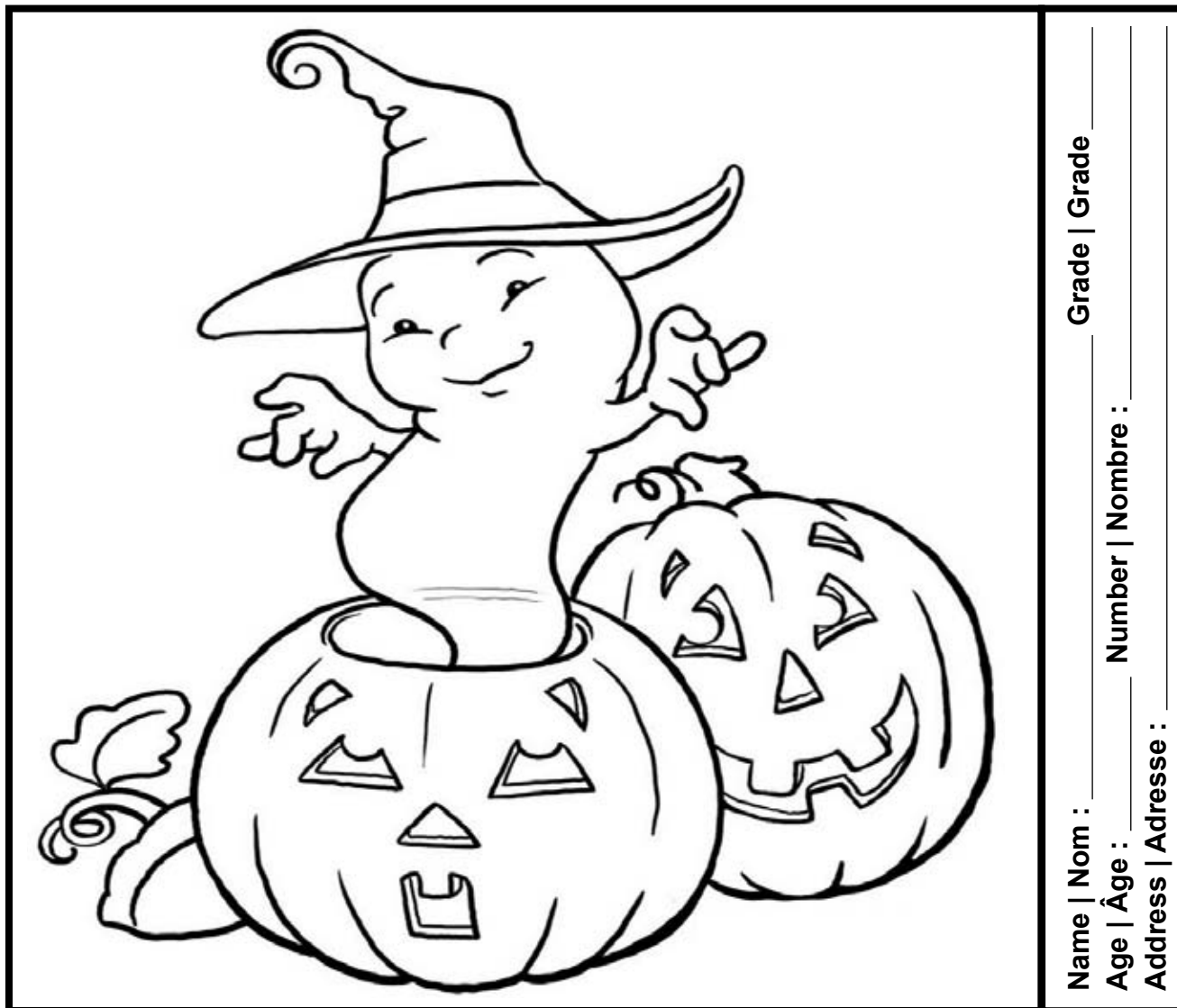

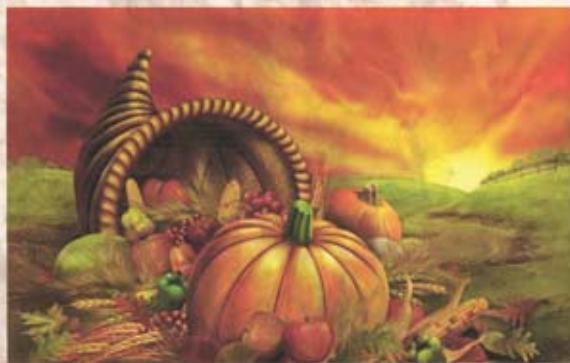

## 413 completes Miramichi squadron SAREX

**Warrant Officer C.J.S. Cowan,  
Search and Rescue Technician Leader,  
413 (T&R) Squadron**

413 (Transport and Rescue) Squadron exercised its remote location search and rescue skills at a squadron-level exercise October 6 through 13 in Miramichi, New Brunswick.

This SAREX tested the unit's capability to maintain staff reviews, response assessments, increase force generation and conduct realistic training. The training also showcased search and rescue technicians' skill sets to the media and the greater public within the squadron's operational "backyard."

Morning, afternoon and night exercises simulated SAR missions, including 413 Squadron personnel and aircraft - the CC130 Hercules and CH149 Cormorant helicopter; 405 (Long Range Patrol) Squadron, the Civil Air Search and Rescue Association (CASARA), Canadian Coast Guard and Canadian Coast Guard Auxiliary (CCGA).

"The opportunity to train with a multitude of outside agencies, both Canadian Armed Forces and civilian, are few and far between. I felt it comparable and realistic to the operational environment," says Captain Dawn Macauley.

The overall aim of the exercise was met, from Sergeant Paul Jackman's perspective.

"The scale and realism of the aircraft wreckage at the crash sight and live patients to treat were very beneficial, adding great training value for us.

"This training is essential to maintaining a force that is capable of responding with the tools and skills required to do the job."

There is an inherent risk involved with SAR training and operations; to mitigate the risks, 413 Squadron, along with its partners, used the week-long exercise to build experience. The SAREX also challenged crews for real: the squadron responded to four actual SAR call-outs while on the training, meeting all mission obligations.

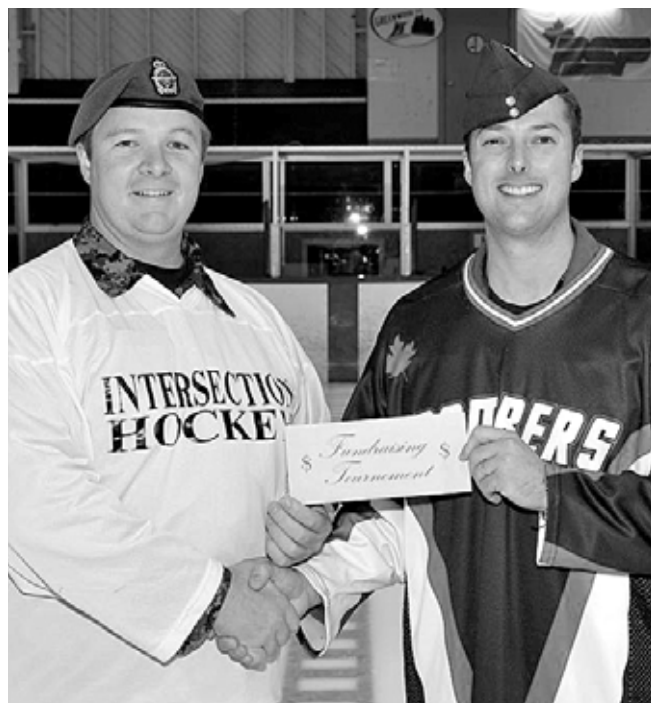

14 Wing's winning team consisted of swimmer Captain John Bernardi (in a time of 4:22) from 14 Software Engineering Squadron, cyclist Leading Seaman Shawn Miller (19:57) from HMCS Fredericton and runner Private Shawn Clarke (6:48) from 14 Air Maintenance Squadron. Their winning time was 31:05, just four seconds ahead of the second place team from the fleet.

Greenwood's 413 Squadron search and rescue technicians also entered a team, placing third. Members included swimmer Sergeant Chris MacIntyre (4:55),

cyclist Master Corporal Brad Nisbet (21:23) and runner Master Corporal Jeff Connors (7:17).

The event was renamed to pay tribute to Blake, a naval clearance diver who died May 3, 2010 following an IED detonation during a dismounted operation in the Panjwayi District of Afghanistan. He was also a cyclist and triathlete who regularly competed in the event. September 21, Montebello Park in Eastern Passage was renamed PO2 Craig Blake Memorial Park.

Earlier in the season, August 4, GMSC and 14 Wing members competed in the Bridgetown Triathlon. Bernardi and Clarke won the team event, with Clarke doing double duty as both the cyclist and runner. In the Olympic distance, Miller came second and Captain Dan Klco, 404 Squadron, finished 34th. In the sprint distance, MacIntyre came 12th, Erin Rivers was 16th, Captain Michelle Guertin, Wing Logistics and Engineering, was 31st, and Peter McLean, 404 Squadron, was 76th.

September 28, the club also participated in the annual Rum Runners Relay, a 110.3 kilometre relay race from Halifax to Lunenburg. Each team consists of up to 10 members, and each leg of the race varies from 3.8 to 17.1 kilometres. Did you know your child could receive a French education if he or she qualifies under the Education Act? You or your spouse should meet the following eligibility criteria:

- one of you must be a Canadian citizen
- the first language one of you learned and still understand is French
- one of you received your elementary education in

French in Canada

- one of you has a child who has received, or is receiving, instruction at the elementary or high school level in French in Canada (if applicable)
- your child could be eligible if one of his or her biological parents does not meet any of the criteria, but the other parent is a Canadian citizen who is eligible (see criteria above).

In addition to eligible children, the Conseil scolaire acadien provincial de la Nouvelle-Écosse could admit children of Canadian parents who have one grandparent who speaks French, or who spoke French during his or her lifetime. Parents must then commit to actively promote French throughout the child's school years. Other categories of children may be eligible.

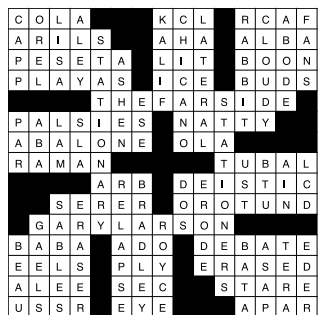

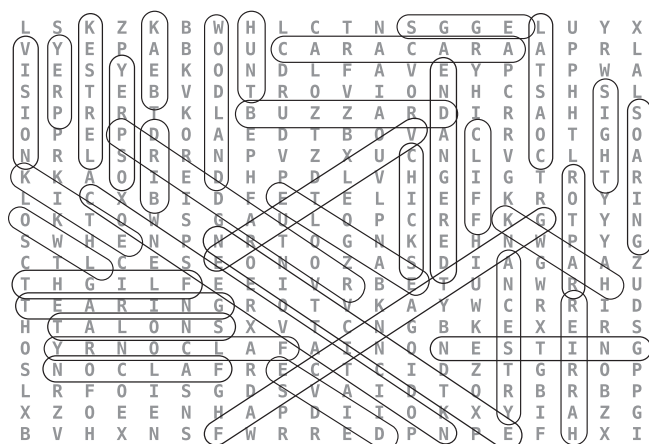

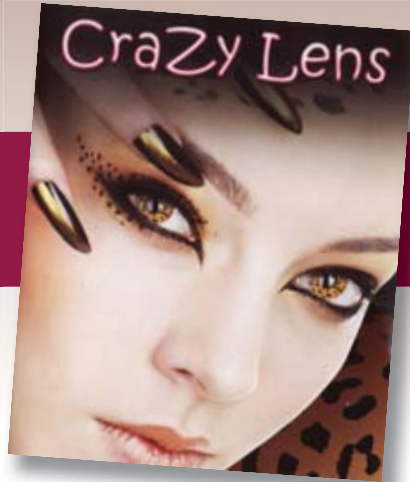
