Santa shows SAR-Techs thing or two

With a “Ho, Ho, Ho,” away he goes!

Santa Claus knows how to make a hasty exit from his sleigh, thanks to parachute training with 14 Wing Greenwood’s 413 (Transport and Rescue) Squadron.

“He regularly comes to the annual jump school,” says Warrant Officer Conrad Cowan, describing Santa’s participation in the August event for search and rescue technicians from a number of Royal Canadian Air Force squadrons. “There’s just always so much commotion – he’s just another guy in a jumpsuit and pack at the back of the plane.”

And, being in the off season, Santa’s beard isn’t as lush and he’s managed to keep off that “bowl full of jelly” required in the Christmas season itself, allowing him to slip under the radar on the operations side of 14 Wing’s airfield.

While RCAF SAR-Techs

likely jump a minimum 25 times throughout the year just to keep up training standards, Cowan says, you’ve got to remember Santa has been parachuting for decades. His formal partnership with the RCAF dates back more than 75 years, and builds on the links between operations at the North Pole and the wider Canadian Armed Forces, with communications at CFS Alert and the forces’ meteorological network, CFB Trenton aircrafts’ mid-air refuelling capabilities; along with NORAD tracking services out of Colorado. 14 Wing crews, linked in a network of CAF bases and wings, back Santa up on his big night, as search and rescue technicians hold their 24-hour response posture in case of any special requests or support Santa may need.

Cowan says Santa’s jump skills are second-to-none.

“He’s fantastic at getting into the more confined, tight and remote areas,” likely from ensuring presents get delivered to special children in all

parts of the world. “He looks after his own gear: his own helmet, goggles, gloves and parachute. He has to make arrangements to bundle his sack of toys, too, hooking it to the front of his parachute.

“He’s one of the best jumpers: he goes from high alti-

tudes to pinpoint precision, targeting chimneys. That’s fantastic accuracy, and we just follow him.”

Not only does Santa’s training build his accuracy, it also reinforces safety standards: Santa’s magic only goes so far, as the flying reindeer and

sleigh are what actually carries him through the night skies. If there was ever an emergency, Santa has to have a safe way down to Earth, where his elves can pick him up.

Cowan, an experienced SAR-Tech and long-time member of the CAF, says

working with Santa during his years with 413 Squadron have been eye-opening.

“Santa’s back flips off the back of the ramp are wild – we have regulation exit jumps, but him? He’s jolly, always full of good spirits and it’s ‘Ho, Ho, Ho,’ and away he goes!”

Fired up in support of food bank

December 7, with Sparky in the lead; fire trucks rolled out of 14 Wing Greenwood Fire and Emergency Services for the 17th Christmas food drive in support of the Upper Room Food Bank in Kingston. A note about the Upper Room Food Bank: this charitable organization helps, on average, over 150 families a month. The donations raised December 7 will serve one month's operational needs; during the winter season, the demand increases from families that depend on seasonal work. Your donations directly support families in the Greenwood and Kingston area.

Flight training students visit 14 Wing

November 20, eight students and two instructors from 1 Canadian Forces Flying Training School (1 CFFTS) Air Combat Systems Officer (ACSO) course 1301 visited 14 Wing Greenwood.

As part of their course curriculum, the ACSO students, who receive their basic flying training in Winnipeg, complete two cross-country trips, the first of which being MOTIVEX. On the trip, the delegation visited 8 Wing Trenton, 12 Wing Shearwater, 14 Wing Greenwood as well as a RCN ship in Halifax, exposing them to some of the platforms they might be selected to fly, and life in the maritime flying community.

In Greenwood, the course visited 413 (Transport and Rescue) Squadron, where students learned about the search and rescue reality of the East Coast and the many challenges 413 Squadron faces daily. They were also introduced to the specific duties of a SAR navigator, and then given a static tour of the CH149 Cormorant.

At 405 Long Range Patrol Squadron, students received an eye-opening lecture on long range patrol operations, the CP140 Aurora aircraft and life as an LRP crew-member with a perspective for both coasts.

The next stop was at 404 Squadron, where they were given a tour of the Operational Mission Simulator, one of the tools used to train Aurora ACSOs that allows the crews to practice their procedures in a synthetic environment, and manned by former aviators. They were then briefed on the training path ahead for those selected to fly the Aurora. Their last stop took them on board the aircraft, where they were given a

hands-on demonstration of some of the capabilities of the upgraded CP140 Block III.

Overall, the feedback from the visitors was very positive and the tour changed

the minds of many, as it provided an up-to-date and accurate picture of the life in Greenwood as an Aurora or a Hercules ACSO – which sometimes may not seem as glamorous and exciting

to young aircrew as it actually is.
