Maritime Search and Exercice maritime Rescue Exercise on de recherché et the East Coast sauvetage sur la Côte Est

A C-130 Hercules and a C-149 Cormorant from 413 Squadron participated in a search and rescue exercise on March 2nd 2010. The exercise was done in conjunction with the HMCS Toronto and the Coast Guard Canadian Ship Edward Cornwallis and took place 40 nm east of Halifax harbour.

The Hercules had to find 3 simulated persons in the water and to drop them a search and rescue kit. Then, the Cormorant had to extract 2 persons from the water and to transport them to the HMCS Toronto. The other person was extracted by a rigid-inflatable boat and brought to the HMCS Toronto as well.

Décès d'un soldat canadien des suites de ses blessures

CF Soldier Dies of Wounds in Edmonton Hospital

lundi 22 mars 2010

Edmonton (Alberta) - Le Cpl Fitzpatrick, dé Prince George, en Colombie-Britannique, était un soldat d'infanterie âgé de 21 ans et membre du 3e Bataillon, Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry, basé à la Base des Forces canadiennes Edmonton.

Le Cpl Fitzpatrick en était à sa première affectation opérationnelle. Il s'était enrôlé dans les Forces canadiennes en 2006 et servait en Afghanistan au sein de l'Équipe de liaison et de mentorat opérationnel depuis octobre dernier.

Le Cpl Fitzpatrick avait été grièvement blessé le 6 mars par l'explosion d'un dispositif explosif de circonstance durant une patrouille à pied menée conjointement par des soldats canadiens et afghans à 25 km à l'ouest de la ville de Kandahar dans le district de Zhari.

Il avait alors été soigné l'Unité médicale multinationale de rôle 3 à l'aérodrome de Kandahar et avait ensuite été transporté au Centre médical régional de Landstuhl, en Allemagne. Le Cpl Fitzpatrick avait ensuite été transporté à l'Hôpital de l'Université de l'Alberta, à Edmonton, le 19 mars.

Son Excellence la très honorable Michaëlle Jean, gouverneure générale et commandante en chef du Canada, a fait la déclaration suivante à l'occasion du décès du Cpl Darren J. Fitzpatrick:

« Nous venons d'apprendre avec une profonde tristesse mon mari Jean-Daniel Lafond et moi que la guerre en Afghanistan a fait une

nouvelle victime parmi nos valeureux et courageux soldats.

« Le Caporal Darren James Fitzpatrick était en patrouille à l'ouest de Kandahar lorsqu'il a été blessé par une mine antipersonnel le 6 mars dernier. Il a malheureusement succombé à ses blessures, entouré des siens, samedi, à Edmonton.

« La grande famille militaire et le Canada perdent ainsi un homme remarquable et d'une très grande générosité.

« Le Caporal Darren James Fitzpatrick avait en effet énormément à

cœur de servir son pays. En mission en Afghanistan, il était convaincu de l'importance cruciale de l'aide humanitaire apportée dans les collectivités de la province de Kandahar où la pauvreté, l'insécurité et le terrorisme sont des réalités quotidiennes.

« Du plus profond de notre cœur, et au nom de toutes les Canadiennes et de tous les Canadiens, nous offrons nos plus sincères condoléances à la famille, aux amis et aux compagnons d'armes du Caporal Fitzpatrick, en particulier à ceux du Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry. Nous partageons leur chagrin et nos pensées les accompagnent. »



Fitzpatrick, of Prince George, B.C., was a 21-year-old infantryman and a member of the 3rd Battalion, Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry, based at CFB Edmonton.

This was Cpl Fitzpatrick's first operational tour. He joined the Canadian Forces (CF) in 2006, and had been serving in Afghanistan with the Operational Mentor Liaison Team since last October.

Cpl Fitzpatrick was critically wounded by an improvised explosive device during a joint Canadian/Afghan dismounted patrol 25 km west of Kandahar City in Zharey district on March 6.

He was treated at the Role 3 Multinational Medical Unit at Kandahar Airfield and was then moved to the Landstuhl Regional Medical Center in Germany. Cpl Fitzpatrick was evacuated from LRMC to the University of Alberta Hospital in Edmonton on March 19.

Her Excellency the Right Honourable Michaëlle Jean, Governor General and Commander-in-Chief of Canada, issued the following statement on the death of Corporal Darren James Fitzpatrick:

"It was with great sadness that my Edmonton, Alberta — Cpl Darren James husband, Jean-Daniel Lafond, and I learned that the war in Afghanistan had claimed a new victim from among the ranks of our valorous and courageous soldiers.

Corporal Darren James Fitzpatrick was on patrol west of Kandahar when he was wounded by an anti-personnel mine on March 6. Unfortunately, he succumbed Saturday to his injuries, surrounded by his loved ones in Edmonton.

"Canada and its extended military family have lost a remarkable and very generous man.

"Corporal Darren James Fitzpatrick cared very deeply about serving his country. On mission in Afghanistan, he was convinced of the crucial importance of humanitarian assistance for the communities of Kandahar province, where poverty, insecurity and terrorism are daily realities.

"From the bottom of our hearts and on behalf of all Canadians, we extend our most sincere condolences to the family, friends and comrades of Corporal Fitzpatrick, in particular those serving in the Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry. We share their pain, and our thoughts are with them.'
