## Vintage visitor Heritage Harvard lifts eyes to old-time skies

You could hear it overhead: the loud engines of the old-time Harvard, a 1952 Mark 4 trainer, flying over Greenwood August 30.

The distinct, yellow-painted plane flew in as part of Canada's Vintage Wings' cross-country, year-long flight tribute to one of the greatest military and industrial achievements in the country. During the Second World War, the British Commonwealth Air Training Plan was an achievement in planning, construction, community involvement and aircrew training that involved every province,

hundreds of small and medium-sized communities and thousands of airmen from Canada, the British Commonwealth and the United States.

Greenwood was one of those small communities affected by the BCATP back in 1942, when the bulldozers moved in and carved RAF Station Greenwood, soon to become RCAF Station Greenwood.

"No one in today's Air Force would have flown this," says pilot Robert Erdos, a retired Air Force pilot himself.

"Guys don't always know what they don't know: I promise, if one of them went up, it would be a

brief and dramatic flight. This is a demanding plane."

Erdos, now a test pilot for the National Research Council in Ottawa, got involved in Vintage Wings' mission to "educate, commemorate and inspire" modern aircraft enthusiasts with the stories and realities of "the old planes, the veterans and what they accomplished." Vintage Wings has over a dozen heritage aircraft in flying condition, some gathered from private collections and others that arrived as a "bucket of parts."

"They burn gas, they drip oil... they keep it alive. When I take the old plane to air shows, there are always these old guys who come in and look at them. We get a good reaction."

Arriving in Greenwood from a Summerside air show over the weekend, the Harvard was alone. It was supposed to be accompanied by a restored Lysander but, as Erdos says, "our schedules have had a few bumps."

"But, Vintage Wings is really lucky – we have parts in stock or we can make 'em."

There's no factory support for these old planes anymore, but we have staff and volunteers" to keep the planes in the air.

Volunteers here with the Greenwood Military Aviation Society understand: they've spent years restoring non-flying aircraft for their displays, including the current Anson project. They gathered to meet Erdos and co-pilot and navigator Debbie Wall at the museum and in their own workshop, and later enjoyed Erdos' air show routine over the base airfield.

# SAR Tech and the next generation

I met up with my parents for a search and rescue family reunion September 1, fortunate enough to be a part of the Cormorant crew from 413 Squadron sent to Summerside in support of the Para Rescue Association Reunion. Almost 100 people from across Canada and the United States made the trip for this bi-annual event, run by members of the Para Rescue Association (est. 1989) for military and ex-military SAR Techs, pilots and PJs (para jumpers, US Air Force).

My father, ex-SAR Tech, Chief Warrant Officer Arnie Macauley; and my mother, Darlene, rode their Ultra Classic Screaming Eagle Harley Davidson all the way from Medicine Hat to

participate, and they will tell you it was worth every kilometre travelled.

Once we landed in Summerside, our crew was greeted with curious and envious eyes. Many of these ex-SAR Techs and pilots hadn't had a chance to get a close look at the "new" SAR rotary wing asset. The welcome and gratitude we received, in regards to our support for the event, was overwhelming. On a personal level, I was greeted with hugs and handshakes from many familiar faces from my childhood. "I haven't seen you since you were this tall," was the most common salutation, holding their hands at waist level. A number of these people had worked with my father when he was the SAR Tech leader of 413 Squadron (1989-1992), during the relocation of the unit from Summerside to

Greenwood. In 1991, one of the most significant and renowned rescues of 413 Squadron history, Boxtop 22, the Hercules crash at Alert, took place when my father was a warrant officer. He was the first rescuer to parachute into the crash scene from the 413 Squadron Hercules - flown by his younger brother, Major Marvin Macauley. I was nine years old, and while, that event shaped a part of many people's lives, it also affected my own.

"I hear you're flying helicopters," and, "Your father must be proud of you," were other comments I heard during the reunion.

This reunion was a unique bonding opportunity for me and my Dad. I was able to bring him on board the Cormorant to conduct some routine training, including a hoist sequence with him on the hook. Dad spent 37 years in the Regular Force, 30 of these years as a SAR Tech, and is going on four years as a Reservist. This was the first time he had been hoisted from a Cormorant, and his daughter was flying! We were both thrilled, and we shared a huge sense of pride for each other, our family and our work community.

The reunion itself was a huge success. It meant so

# Cadets offer youth big opportunities

Looking for an extra curricular activity that costs parents nothing and could, in fact, earn your child money as they participate?

Many youth have graduated from 517 Flight Lieutenant Graham Royal Canadian Air Cadet Squadron, where they have “learned, served and advanced.” Established in 1949, the squadron has experienced many changes - but the results for participating youth haven’t.

Air Cadets provides youth leadership, organization and team building skills. Most importantly, it is a supervised, hands-on program that allows each cadet the chance to learn public speaking, how to march and play in a band, practice drill team work, build self-discipline and encourage teamwork.

The squadron meets every Wednesday night at the Birchall Training Centre, 6:30 p.m. until 9 p.m. Fall training resumes September 14: you may join until December.

Many annual events are held at 517 Squadron, including the Remembrance Day Aurora competition, in which provincial cadet organizations compete with

one another; Tac Eval, a weekend bush exercise; the Battle of Britain parade, Air Cadet league ticket sales to maintain the gliding program, flying scholarships and gliding; band concerts, drill and range competitions, citizenship activities, the always fun wake-a-thon and trips to Halifax.

The Greenwood Air Cadet Summer Training Centre offers youth training, from general course work to basic survival, aviation, leadership, fitness and music programs. Advanced sessions mean returning cadets continue to build their skills and experiences. They also earn a training bonus of \$60 a week.

The squadron would not function without the efforts of volunteers. Members of 14 Wing Greenwood help with training, obtaining a flying scholarship, Duke of Edinburgh work and the band. Civilians help with administration, supply and training.

The Department of National Defence supports the squadron with uniforms, training materials, officers and summer training. The Area Cadet Instructor Cadre officer provides assistance to corps and squadrons, promotes recruitment and public relations, assists in the conduct of examinations, selection boards and the organization of competitions, conferences and meetings.

Sponsoring committees, including 107 Valley Wing Royal Canadian Air Force Association, Branch 98 Royal Canadian Legion Kingston and the Air Cadet League; aid the squadron.

This is, without a doubt one of the best organizations for youth. It builds character, confidence, teamwork and friendship. It can also provide a long-term association with the cadet program and helps develop an awareness of the role and activities of the Canadian Forces. I know: all three of my children were participants, and one is now in the Regular Force in Halifax, another is a CIC officer who earned her glider pilot license and instructs every summer and one participated in the National Marksmanship Competition.

# Nijmegen team: 'remarkable four days'

They trained hard and often, through extreme heat, downpours, pain - and personal satisfaction.

It all paid off for 14 Wing's 2011 Nijmegen team during this year's international Nijmegen March in Holland July 19 through 22.

Led by Captain Craig Little from 404 Long Range Patrol and Training Squadron and Corporal Shanna Wheaton, Wing Logistics

and Engineering, 10 Hangar Supply, the team successfully completed the four-day Nijmegen marches without serious injuries. There were the expected wrecked feet, a lack of sleep and general fatigue, but those issues were overshadowed by the team's tremendous esprit de corps. The camaraderie with other Canadian teams and previous Greenwood team members gave this year's team valuable insight into what to expect each day. Interaction with teams from other countries and the

The Nijmegen Marches, held annually in the Netherlands, are a rigorous and prestigious annual event, attracting some 45,000 military and civilian participants and more than a million spectators from over 50 nations. Canadian Forces members have participated since 1952 as an opportunity to honour Canadians who lost their lives fighting in Europe in the 20th century. The marches are also the ultimate test of physical fitness and mental stamina and require effective teamwork, as participants march over 160 kilometres in four days while carrying a standard military rucksack weighing at least 10 kilograms.

Wheaton describes the experience as unforgettable.

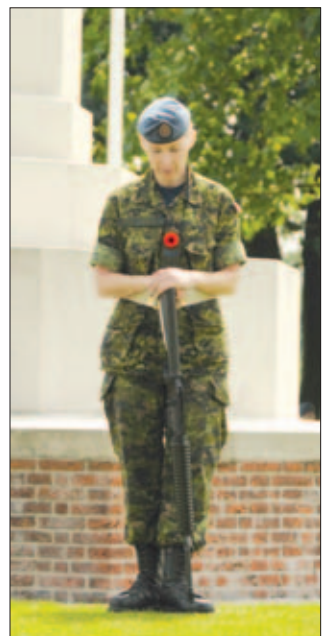


