Wheels in motion for Boomer's ride

The logistics of a 176-kilometre cycling challenge are settled way easier over the kitchen table, as husband-and-wife team captains Dan and Lisa Klco take on the organization of Greenwood's Boomer's Legacy Ride September 13.

Dan completed the ride in 2013 for the first time, his longest ride to date; Lisa has an 1,800 kilometre, eight day charitable ride from Yellowknife to Edmonton on her resume – pre-kids.

"We make a great team: he's the fit triathlete, I'm the working mom, which goes to show, if I can do it, at five-foot-nothing on a good day; this is a manageable challenge for anyone who wants to join us," Lisa says.

Dan agrees the event is not as "daunting as it seems."

"With a little bit of training, it's a doable pace – not a race," he says.

Roughed out from 14 Wing Greenwood's runway starting point to Halifax's Citadel Hill in five 30-kilometre legs, the ride route is also well-supported: checkpoints and refreshments,

first aid and RCMP escorts – and a cycling "pack" with one thing in mind: raising funds for the Boomer's Legacy Foundation, a Canadian charitable organization in memory of Corporal Andrew "Boomer" Eykelenboom, killed in action in Spin Boldak, Afghanistan in August 2006. Participants register, and are encouraged to raise funds for Boomer's Legacy. The fund supports special projects identified by Canadian soldiers in communities here at home and internationally: school supplies, medical equipment, sports gear and more.

The Klcos are excited that, this year for the first time, the Greenwood ride's proceeds will be used right here in the Valley, partnering with the Middleton Soldiers' Memorial Hospital's Senior LINC (Living Independently with Community Supports) program.

"Veterans Affairs and Afghan vets' programs are well-established, but, in smaller communities, others struggle, too," Lisa says. "There are forgotten people – retired soldiers – who fall through the cracks. This is Boomer's Legacy riders: soldiers helping

soldiers. Make a difference with your personal accomplishment and contribution."

The organizers are hoping to raise \$100 per kilometre – an ambitious \$18,000.

"Boomer's Legacy is becoming a well-established event," Lisa says. "There is definitely growing interest."

Dan says the highlights from his 2013 ride include 30 or 40 minutes riding alongside the base commander from CFB Halifax – "we're all fellow Boomer's riders," and getting to the end at Citadel Hill. "Families were there, people were cheering you along. We were all just riders together."

Seasoned SAR pilot puts in final 1.4 hours

"How was your flight?" "They're all good!" responded Major Greg Dixon, stepping onto the pavement from the back of the Cormorant and marking his last flight as a pilot with 413 (Transport and Rescue) Squadron.

Inside the cockpit a moment earlier, he wasn't quite as jovial.

His 1.4 hours piloting over the Valley July 10 added to an impressive 5,000-plus hours over a 23-year career in the Royal

Canadian Air Force: 98 per cent of those hours likely in a helicopter.

"You boys will be lucky to see a quarter of that in your entire careers," 413 Squadron Commanding Officer Scott Murphy said to crewmembers

gathered around Dixon for a bit of a "send-off" post-flight.

Dixon was greeted upon landing by a couple of dozen 413 Squadron personnel – and a rather large tub of water for the traditional "dunking."

Despite a sprint across the tarmac, he couldn't evade the dousing, and the applause and congratulations.

Dixon enlisted in the RCAF in 1991, and has flown the CH135 Twin Huey, the CH146 Griffon, the CH139 Jet Ranger, the AS355N Twin Star and the CH149 Cor-

morant. Throughout his career, he earned A1 instructor qualifications, taught at the Central Flying School at 17 Wing Winnipeg and has deployed several times, including Haiti, Kosovo and Jamaica. In August 2013, he was awarded the Meritori-

ous Service Medal for accomplishments as first officer onboard Rescue 903 during a February 2011 sea rescue and, in the spring of 2014, he was recognized for the 5,000 hour flying milestone.

"Major Dixon has been our operations officer, the cen-

tral focus for all our activity, coordinating our operations, contact with the Joint Rescue Centre, overseeing maintenance, the crews – he's had a key role within our unit," Murphy said, "all to protect our SAR posture 24/7."

Murphy also commended

Dixon for his unspoken role as a veteran and mentor for junior pilots and crew members.

"He's calm in challenging and dynamic situations, and in making life-saving decisions, with incomplete information on dark and stormy nights."

Actually, Dixon isn't going

far: he's posted to 14 Wing Greenwood's Wing Operations branch, but flying opportunities will become scarcer in his new role.

"We're sorry to see him go, but we're happy he's staying on the wing and contributing to the wing team."

Old, new, future 14 SES gets ready for new roles

"Things happen – as they do," Lieutenant-Colonel Andre Gloumeau said, as he wrapped up his last weeks as commanding officer of 14 Wing Greenwood's 14 Software Engineering Squadron.

He expected to be in the post two years; it was extended to

three years this spring – then was shortened again to two years, ending with a change of command ceremony August 5.

There wasn't a lot of time between that handover and his August 6 first day at the Canadian Forces Integrated Command Centre, where he was taking on directorship duties, so, hopefully, there was no time for any of those plans

to be changed.

"This new job comes with challenges, as everything that happens in the forces goes through here. There's a high tempo, and it's operations-focussed. I pick that up and will be responsible for all the daily briefings products for Canadian Joint Operations Command and the chief of defence staff."

What he sets down for incoming commanding officer Major Eric North, a 14 SES member, is no less challenging, as mid-way through Gloumeau's command came the decision to disband and merge 14 SES with 14 Wing's Maritime Proving and Evaluation Unit as a new 400-series squadron next year.

"It's change – and it's not done. That merge wasn't on the horizon when I arrived in Greenwood, but it's a completely new set of plans that will set the fleet for the future."

On 14 SES's plate – beyond all the logistics of the changeover in the year ahead – are continuing Block III CP140 Aurora programming requirements, from vetting contractor-supplied software to handling trouble reports from operational flight crews. The transition into the Block III world has been over a decade, with the last of the Block III-trained flight crews coming onto the line this year. There have been upgrades, new systems to test and accept – and figure out how to use to their maximum potential. And, Block IV projects are coming up.

Gloumeau points to advancements on beyond-the-line-of-sight capabilities on the Aurora and network security

and encryption demands as the remodelled aircraft are increasingly connected as projects that 14 SES drives into the future with "very specialized and networked tools." The day-to-day support to the fleet doesn't lighten, and the connections to 14 SES' past role and success is of prime concern as the squadron goes through the restructuring. "It's absolutely the right way ahead, and the team response to it has been heartening. Really, everyone is on board. I've been blessed to have a great team – a small team, but we make a key contribution." Gloumeau extends acknowledgement of the "team" to all of 14 Wing, from his command team peers to across-the-base personnel: "we don't do it alone."

Change of command marks coming year of challenge

The departing gift to his squadron from Commanding Officer Lieutenant-Colonel Andre Gloumeau was a fitting artistic portrayal of work and life within 14 Software Engineering Squadron.

At the August 5 change of command ceremony at the Annapolis Mess, Gloumeau chose a painting, "Empty Nest," by a Nova Scotian artist, depicting an empty nest with various figures moving away from its centre.

sociated with this. The hatchlings are off to new, better things: for us, our 400-series force development squadron."

For Gloumeau, a role as director at the Canadian Forces Integrated Command Centre; for incoming commanding officer Major Eric North, the opportunity to see through change he has been an integral part of during the early plan-

ning and logistics of the 14 SES and MPEU merge in the past six months.

North said he is looking forward to the challenge of leading the transition, but also to dealing with continued and growing demands on cybersecurity, software systems independent of hardware – but with development and maintenance issues all their own; and the

partnerships that come from building the network 14 SES has epitomized throughout its 30-plus year history.

"How are we going to rise to these challenges? Wisdom, experience and a squadron full of success stories. Cooperation, within and without. Now, more than ever, I ask you to network. This next year will truly be our best year yet."

14 Wing Greenwood Commander Colonel Ian Huddleston reinforced that message, knowing he and the Royal Canadian Air Force have set 14 SES and MPEU "a tall order" with the merge.

"You have the confidence of myself and the RCAF, and the backing of a strong team at 14 SES. This year will be particularly difficult, as offices, procedures and relationships will change; but you are joining at great unit at MPEU – and that's the light at the end of this tunnel. Your contributions are and will make a huge difference for the long range patrol fleet."

Aerial displays take to Annapolis Valley skies

14 Wing Greenwood will host Armed Forces Day August 20, from 1 p.m. to 8:30 p.m., showcasing 14 Wing Greenwood and the Canadian Armed Forces. Armed Forces Day is a fun-filled family event open to the public, free of charge.

Static displays and aerial displays will demonstrate Royal Canadian Air Force capabilities in the areas of air mobility, long range patrol and search and rescue. There will be performances by the Snowbirds and the CF188 Demonstration Teams as well as air demonstrations by all of 14 Wing's operational aircraft.

Other exhibits include various units' exhibits, children's activities, the Greenwood Military Aviation Museum, kiddie commando obstacle course and much more.

The event will continue on

in the evening with a Sunset Ceremony, a combination of three distinct ceremonies that are part of Canada's military history: the ancient ceremony of Beating Retreat, the Tattoo, and the lowering of the National Flag of Canada.

Residents in the area can expect increased aircraft activity during the day and evening throughout the Annapolis Valley. Due to the

large number of expected visitors, traffic will increase travel times around Greenwood. Parking capacity on base is large, but demand is also expected to be high.

Those planning to visit 14 Wing are reminded security screening will be in effect and people will be subject to search. Visitors are asked not to bring large items, such as coolers, backpacks and duffel bags.

Music makes the day

3rd Sunset Ceremony August 20 highlights Armed Forces tradition

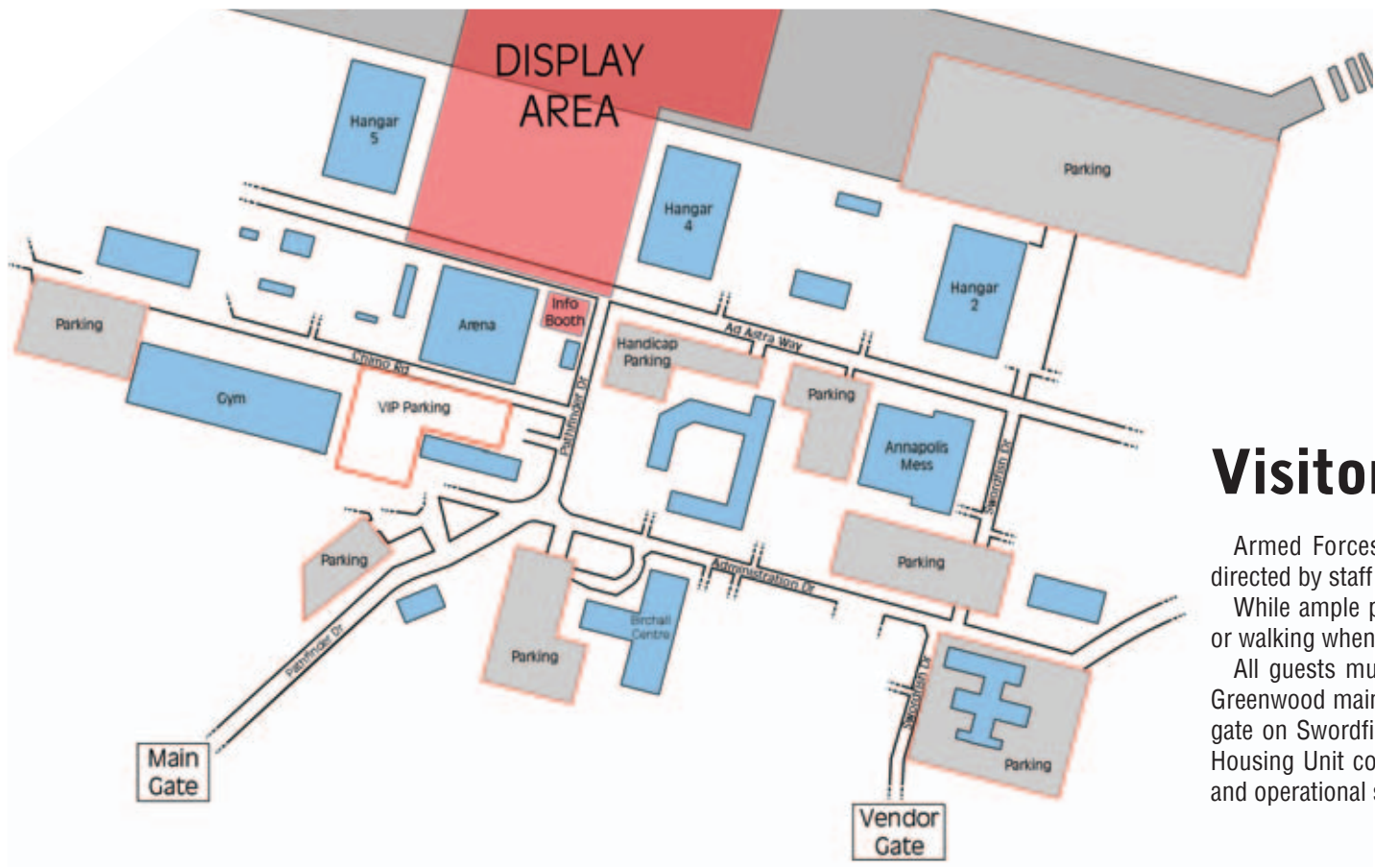
... and the band played on. The third annual 14 Wing Greenwood Sunset Ceremony August 20 will cap a day of events highlighting both the traditions and the modern role of the Canadian Armed Forces. Armed Forces Day at 14 Wing Greenwood starts earlier in the afternoon, but the Sunset Ceremony begins at 6:30 p.m. and is carefully and musically timed to close as the sun sets in the west, over the edge of the North Mountain.

Over 2,000 people were in the audience for last year’s event, double the inaugural event in 2012. 14 Wing’s bandmaster Warrant Officer Vincent Roy and Pipe Major Sergeant Andrew Bruce are confident this year’s show will be an even bigger draw. “People are now expecting the Sunset Ceremony, and the Armed Forces Day program earlier in the day will keep people around into the evening,” Roy says.

On the musical roster this year are 14 Wing’s own Pipes & Drums and Brass & Reed bands, the Stadacona Band from CFB Halifax, the Halifax Citadel’s 78th Highlanders Pipes & Drums and a return performance by the Bridgewater Fire Department Band. The RCMP Highland Dancers will be featured, along with an honour guard from Camp Aldershot and a display of artillery manoeuvres by the



78th Highlanders. “There is no official theme to this year’s show, but we will be touching on the 100th anniversary of the start of the First World War musically in the finale,” Roy says. Pieces such as “It’s a Long Way to Tipperary” and “Pack up your Troubles” are long associated with the First and Second world war years; there will be some other selections not as well known, but from the same musically historic period. Each performing band will have 10 or 15 minutes for its own selections, and the massed finale – featuring close to 100 musicians, 60 of them pipes and drums players; will be a sight to see – and sound to hear – as the sun goes down. The entire concert happens against a backdrop of 14 Wing Greenwood’s airfield and featured aircraft on the Parade Square. Organizers advise audience guests to plan to arrive early, as parking will be directed and there may be some walking involved. Seniors and those with mobility challenges are welcome to advise parking attendants as they arrive of any special needs. Guests are invited to sit on limited bleachers, or bring their own lawn chairs. Seating will be expanded this year to “wrap around” the Parade Square, and the bands’ performances adapted to make full use of the “stage.” Admission is free, and there will be a BBQ on site before the main Sunset Ceremony gets underway. In case of inclement weather, the Sunset Ceremony will be held August 21.



Snowbirds show off CAF excellence

The Snowbirds Demonstration Team (431 Squadron) is a Canadian icon comprised of serving members of the Canadian Forces. Pilots and technicians work as a team to bring thrilling performances to the North American public. Serving as Canadian ambassadors, the Snowbirds demonstrate the high level of professionalism, teamwork, excellence, discipline and dedication inherent in the women and men of the Royal Canadian Air Force and the Canadian Armed Forces. The Snowbirds’ pilots and aircraft technicians spend the winter months at their home base in Moose Jaw, acquiring and practicing the skills necessary to perform in very demanding positions. The Snowbirds’ show is the result of six months of intensive preparation and training and consists of over 50 different formations and manoeuvres. The Snowbirds have flown the CT114 Tutor jet since 1971. The aircraft was designed and built in Canada and was used by the Canadian Armed Forces as its basic pilot training aircraft until 2000. The jets are painted in a distinctive red and white paint scheme, symbolic of Canada’s national flag. As members of the nation’s military, the Snowbirds are proud to fly Canada’s colours across North America.

Welcome to 14 Wing Greenwood

14 Wing Greenwood is the largest air base on the East Coast. Aurora crews conduct sovereignty and surveillance missions over the Atlantic Ocean routinely, while search and rescue capabilities are maintained 365 days of the year. In 1942, CFB Greenwood was established as Royal Air Force Station as part of the British Commonwealth Air Training Plan (BCATP). The BCATP was a plan to expand all Commonwealth air forces. In keeping with this objective, Greenwood was used as a training base during the Second World War and, before the end of the war, produced operational forces.

Today, 14 Wing is home to three operational squadrons. CP140 Aurora Long Range patrol aircraft are flown by 405 (Long Range Patrol) Squadron. 404 (Long Range Patrol & Training) Squadron, which operates both the Aurora flight deck and tactical simulators, also uses the long range patrol Aurora for operational and training purposes. 413 (Transport and Rescue) Squadron is responsible for search and rescue throughout Atlantic Canada and eastern parts of Quebec. The squadron members carry out their missions with both CH130 Hercules aircraft and CH149 Cormorant helicopters. In addition to its diversified operations, 14 Wing Greenwood is home to 14 Air Maintenance Squadron, responsible to maintain the entire CP140 Aurora fleet operated here in Greenwood. The wing has a large recreational facility (including a pool and an arena) and a variety of community recreation and family programs and services, and is home to hundreds of Air Cadets every summer.

Visitor parking

Armed Forces Day guests’ parking will be directed by staff on base, in priority order. While ample parking is available, carpooling or walking when possible is suggested. All guests must enter through the 14 Wing Greenwood main gate on Pathfinder Drive. The gate on Swordfish Drive (from the Residential Housing Unit community) is open for vendors and operational staff only.

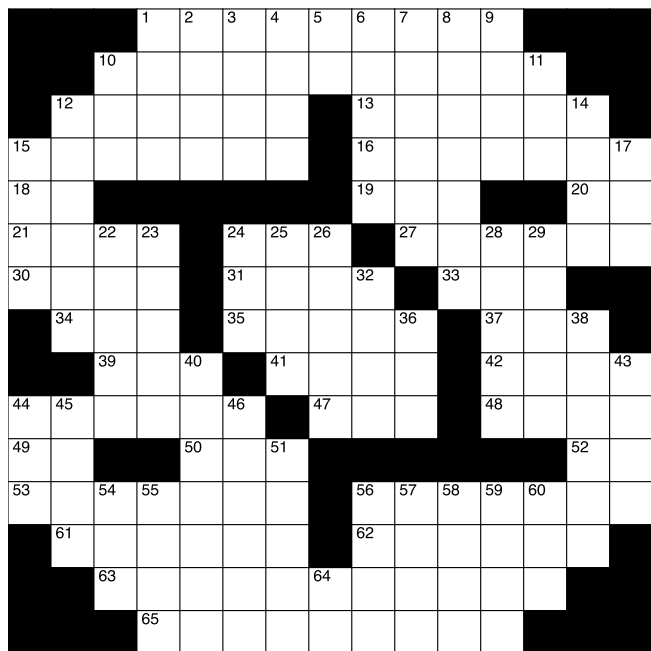

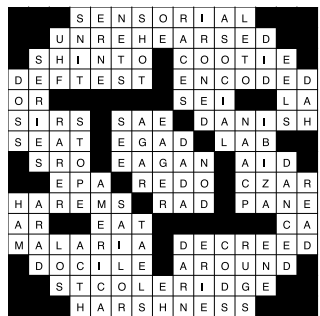

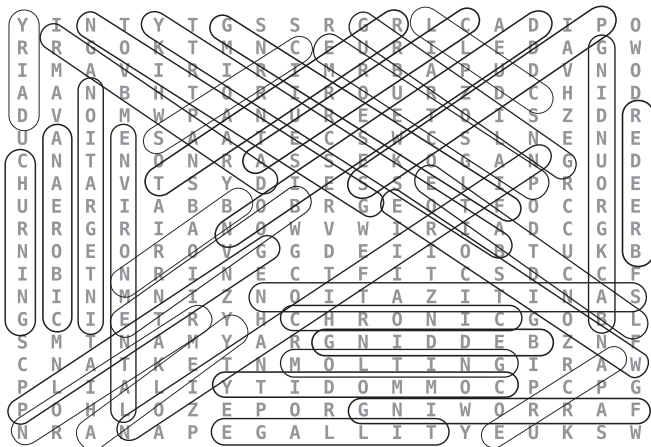
