Wheels in motion for Boomer's ride

The logistics of a 176-kilometre cycling challenge are settled way easier over the kitchen table, as husband-andwife team captains Dan and Lisa Klco take on the organization of Greenwood's Boomer's Legacy Ride September 13.

in 2013 for the first time. his longest ride to date; Lisa has an 1,800 kilometre, eight day charitable ride from Yellowknife to Edmonton on her resume - pre-kids.

"We make a great team: he's the fit triathlete, I'm the working mom, which goes to show, if I can do it, at five-footnothing on a good day; this is a manageable challenge for anyone who wants to join us," Lisa savs.

Dan agrees the event is not as "daunting as it seems.

"With a little bit of training. it's a doable pace - not a race," he says.

Roughed out from 14 Wing Greenwood's runway starting point to Halifax's Citadel Hill in five 30-kilometre leas, the ride route is also well-supported: checkpoints and refreshments,

first aid and RCMP escorts thing in mind: raising funds for the Boomer's Legacy Foundation, a Canadian charitable organization in memory of Corporal Andrew "Boomer" Eykelenboom, killed in action in August 2006. Participants register, and are encouraged Dan completed the ride to raise funds for Boomer's Legacy. The fund supports special projects identified by Canadian soldiers in communities here at home and internationally: school supplies, medical equipment, sports gear and more.

The Klcos are excited that, this year for the first time, the Greenwood ride's proceeds will be used right here in the Valley, partnering with the Middleton Soldiers' Memorial Hospital's Senior LINCS (Living Independently with Community Supports) program.

"Veterans Affairs and Afghan vets' programs are wellestablished, but, in smaller communities, others struggle, too," Lisa says. "There are forgotten people - retired soldiers - who fall through the cracks. This is Boomer's Legacy riders: soldiers helping

soldiers. Make a difference and a cycling "pack" with one with your personal accomplishment and contribution."

> The organizers are hoping to raise \$100 per kilometre – an ambitious \$18.000.

"Boomer's Legacy is becoming a well-established in Spin Boldak, Afghanistan event," Lisa says. "There is definitely growing interest."

> Dan says the highlights from his 2013 ride include 30 or 40 minutes riding alongside the base commander from CFB Halifax - "we're all fellow Boomer's riders," and getting to the end at Citadel Hill. "Families were there, people were cheering you along. We were all just riders together."

Old, new, future 14 SES gets ready for new roles

"Things happen – as they do," Lieutenant-Colonel Andre Gloumeau said, as he wrapped up his last weeks as commanding officer of 14 Wing Greenwood's 14 Software Engineering Squadron.

He expected to be in the post two years; it was extended to no time for any of those plans

three years this spring - then to be changed. was shortened again to two years, ending with a change of command ceremony August 5.

There wasn't a lot of time between that handover and his August 6 first day at the Canadian Forces Integrated Command Centre, where he was taking on directorship

"This new job comes with challenges, as everything that happens in the forces goes through here. There's a high tempo, and it's operationsfocussed. I pick that up and will be responsible for all the daily briefings products for Canadian Joint Operations duties, so, hopefully, there was Command and the chief of defence staff.'

What he sets down for incoming commanding officer Major Eric North, a 14 SES member, is no less challenging, as mid-way through Gloumeau's command came the decision to disband and merge 14 SES with 14 Wing's Maritime Proving and Evaluation Unit as a new 400-series squadron next year.

"It's change – and it's not connections to 14 done. That merge wasn't on the horizon when I arrived in Greenwood, but it's a completely new set of plans that will set the fleet for the future."

On 14 SES's plate - beyond all the logistics of the changeover in the year ahead are continuing Block III CP140 Aurora programming requirements, from vetting contractor-supplied software to handling trouble reports from operational flight crews. The transition into the Block III world has been over a decade, with the last of the Block IIItrained flight crews coming onto the line this year. There have been upgrades, new systems to test and accept - and figure out how to use to their maximum potential. And, Block IV projects are coming up.

Gloumeau points to advancements on beyond-the-lineof-sight capabilities on the Aurora and network security and encryption demands as ahead, and the team response the remodelled aircraft are increasingly connected as projects that 14 SES drives into the future with "very specialized and networked tools." The dayto-day support to the fleet doesn't lighten, and the SES' past role and TERE CUM SAPIE success is of prime

concern as the squadron goes through the restructure. "It's absolutely the right way on board. I've been blessed to have a great team - a small team, but we make a key contribution." Gloumeau extends acknowledgement





During her departure speech, Mahar thanked her squadron for its dedication and support to the operations of the wing through the last three years, and wished Dubé all the best as the new officer commanding.


