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Wing-wide security campaign underway this fall

A security awareness campaign will get underway at 14 Wing Greenwood September 14, and run through November 30, a joint initiative of Wing Commander Colonel Iain Huddleston, commanding officers and Military Police.

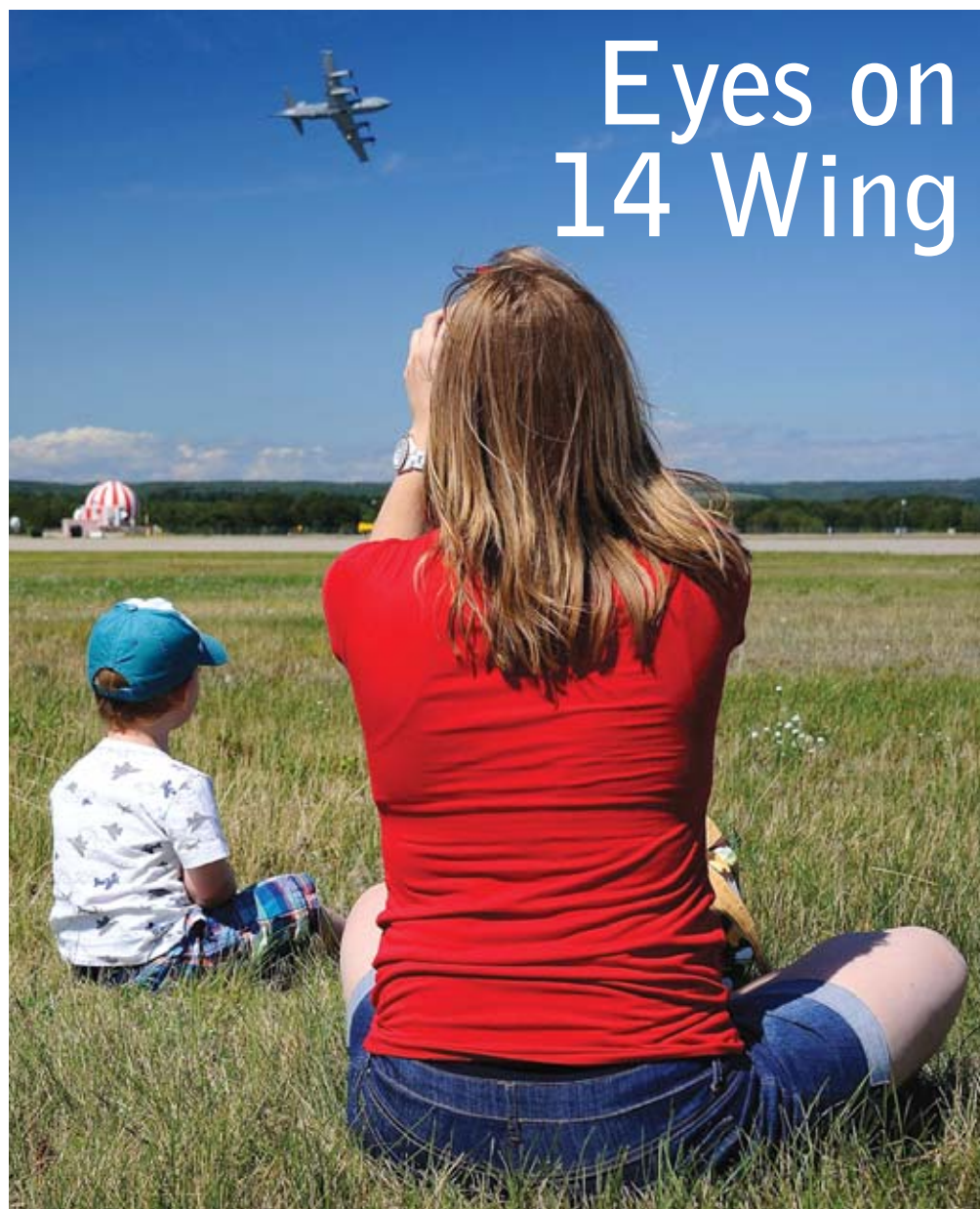
The campaign is designed to sustain the professional effort and past success shown by all personnel, in reinforcing attention to the importance of maintaining a secure environment. Personnel, operations, infrastructure, information management and equipment at 14 Wing all must practice and meet security standards.

The vice chief of the defence staff has recently provided new direction on security requirements, including access areas, project management and security screening; that will enhance 14 Wing's security posture and change significantly the way personnel do their work and maintain a secure environment on a day-to-day basis.

This 14 Wing campaign will promote the new security requirements with all personnel and reinforce DND policies and instructional standards in many ways, including a short, bi-monthly security quiz; postings in various areas on security-themed topics, making operational security presentations within base units, writing, finalizing and improving Unit Security Orders; empowering USS duties and responsibilities, identifying reoccurring security incidents - and resolving them; and more.

As per the Chief of Defence Staff-written statement earlier this year, 14 Wing will achieve professional services in a way that "all personnel handling sensitive information... observe stringent security procedures and are held to the highest ethical standards, consistent with the core military values of loyalty, integrity and honour."

Security is everyone's business: keep personnel and operations safe and our environment secure.

Judy Besharah looks like she fell in a vat of cotton candy. Maybe two: pink and blue.

Her hair has a life, vibrancy and purpose of its own this month, part of a personal and 14 Wing Greenwood-wide Terry Fox challenge.

Besharah is the most visible head getting set for the biennial base head shave challenge, coming up September 12. She hopes to raise \$1,000 within the base's larger \$9,000 goal. Command team members and other volunteers are also getting ready for the head shave, and, squadron by squadron, special events are underway to ensure the fundraising target is met.

Besharah is no stranger to a hair-free head: she went under the razor two years ago for the first time in memory of both her father and father-in-law.

Three weeks after that, her mother died of cancer, and hadn't even been aware of her illness. Besharah's freshly shaved head in the hospital while visiting caught people's attention, but she was focused on her most current family dealing with the disease.

"I felt I had done something, kind of a karma – you get good if you give good; but this felt like the karma train was all screwed up. That was the last opportunity for my mom to tell me how

proud she was of me.

"I haven't had my hair touched with scissors since."

Her first experience generated lots of conversations with people inquiring about her shaved head, and special memories. A girlfriend dealing with cancer at the time took off her head scarf for a picture with Besharah and their two hairless heads. She learned rain runs down a bald surface faster and without absorption, and new, white, fluffy towels are not great on stubble.

"Cancer is an ugly, ugly thing, and I've lost a lot of people in the past couple of years. So much pain.... Of all the things I could put my mind and energy to, let's work on making this so much easier.

"Every day, there are new and hopeful things happening with cancer, and it's because of all our

efforts."

Teaming up with the base's challenge is only natural, as Besharah has an integral job as an IT contact within Wing Telecommunications and Information Services. Each branch and squadron is working on their own Terry Fox fundraising goals to meet the September 12 target.

"We have a lot of special people here on the base. It shouldn't be a problem."

La 14e Escadre Greenwood mènera une campagne de sensibilisation à la sécurité du 14 septembre au 30 novembre. Il s'agit d'une initiative conjointe du commandant de l'escadre, le colonel Iain Huddleston, des commandants et de la police militaire.

La campagne vise à assurer le maintien de l'effort professionnel déployé par tout le personnel et à s'appuyer sur les réussites antérieures pour attirer davantage l'attention sur l'importance de maintenir un environnement sûr. Les pratiques du personnel, les opérations, les infrastructures, la gestion de l'information et l'équipement à la 14e Escadre doivent être conformes aux normes établies en matière de sécurité.

Le vice-chef d'état-major de la Défense a récemment fourni de nouvelles directives quant aux exigences en matière de sécurité, notamment en ce qui concerne les zones d'accès, la gestion de projet et les contrôles de sécurité, dans le but d'élever le niveau de sécurité à l'escadre, de changer considérablement la façon de travailler du personnel et de maintenir de façon quotidienne un environ-

nement sûr. Cette campagne à la 14e Escadre fera la promotion des nouvelles exigences en matière de sécurité auprès de tout le personnel et renforcera les politiques et les normes pédagogiques du MDN de plusieurs façons : court questionnaire bimensuel sur la sécurité; affiches posées dans divers secteurs sur des thèmes précis en lien avec la sécurité, exposés sur la sécurité opérationnelle au sein des unités de la base, rédaction de consignes de sécurité de l'unité et amélioration des consignes existantes; tâches et responsabilités accrues du SSU, détermination des incidents récurrents relatifs à la sécurité et leur résolution; etc.

Conformément à la déclaration écrite du chef d'état-major de la Défense émise plus tôt cette année, les services professionnels à la 14e Escadre seront fournis de façon à ce que « tous les militaires qui manipulent des renseignements de nature sensible observent de rigoureuses procédures liées à la sécurité et respectent les normes éthiques les plus élevées, conformément aux valeurs militaires fondamentales de loyauté, d'intégrité et d'honneur. »

La sécurité est l'affaire de tous : il faut assurer la sécurité du personnel et des opérations ainsi que la sécurité de notre environnement.

The pilots of the Royal Canadian Air Force's CF18s don't want to spend too much time on the ground, but what they spend in future at 14 Wing Greenwood will be a lot more pleasant.

The sod was ceremoniously turned August 7 near Hangar 13, where the 3 Wing Bagotville crews stay while training and participating in exercises on the East Coast. By December, a new steel-structure will replace five aging trailer units on site, a project that's been in the works since the temporary trailers went in close to 20 years ago. The project advanced in the past year, with Mid-Valley Construction winning the \$497,000 build in June.

Lieutenant-Colonel Pierre Haché had the honours, representing Wing Commander Colonel Iain Huddleston.

"I'm looking forward to seeing the construction going on, and I'm sure our customers from Bagotville will be thrilled with the accommodations when they do come visit. We'll have a high degree of service provision, and that's good for Greenwood – it puts us on the map."

The 50-foot-by-70-foot pre-engineered construction will include sleeping quarters for 14, a briefing room, maintenance area, operational planning space, a break room and shower facilities. Work was set to start August 11, and be finished by the end of November or early December.

Mid-Valley Construction project manager Peter Giffin said "Greenwood is our favourite place to work," adding the project will employ about 30 people at various times.

Progress will be impacted by the presence of the CF18s when security levels are higher than construction crew members' clearances.

Fostering leadership, peace and teamwork is one role Canadian soldiers may be contributing to as part of Op Soprano in South Sudan. How about through sports?

Three 14 Wing Greenwood personnel – Warrant Officer Cathy Ripley, Sergeant Trevor Jessome and Captain Lara Jennings – are currently working in support of UNMISS, the United Nations Mission in South Sudan. South Sudan is the world's newest country, ranked #1 in 2014's Fragile State Index. The majority of its population lives in poverty, without basics such as clean water and roofed houses. Children seldom have toys, including items such as soccer balls.

In mid-June, a child approached the gate of Canada House, where the 12-member Canadian contingent deployed to Juba, South Sudan lives, and handed Jennings a letter

requesting soccer balls for his team. They have no money for equipment, and no way to fundraise: with inflation, a simple soccer ball would cost at least three times what it would in Canada.

"In a country that is struggling to achieve unity, the sport of soccer is a perfect place for the youth to start," Jennings passed on to friends home in Greenwood recently, updating them on her six-month stay.

"There are numerous local youth as well as teams in the surrounding area that would benefit greatly from a simple soccer ball. Kids in South Sudan are resilient and resourceful. We have witnessed numerous children playing soccer with balls made of balled up plastic bags or, in one instance, the shell of a soccer ball stuffed with pieces of styrofoam."

Picking up on the idea, 405 Squadron's Flight Sergeant Ian Sinski and Corporal Glenn Duncan began a collection of balls through the squadron,

community connections and friends. They now have close to seven dozen balls on hand.

"People who have the passion for the game took this on," Duncan says, himself a coach of Greenwood's Under 16 girls' team. "This is pretty poignant: Lara Jennings plays with the base team here at Greenwood, the World Cup was on and we just felt like taking this on."

Sinski says they started with a facebook message: "Can anyone help?"

They had some donated through the squadron and community, and had great support from Greenwood Wal Mart, and Juandaro's and Gametronics in New Minas, with one business able to add to the collection with a direct supplier contribution of 56 balls.

The balls are making their way to South Sudan now in small postage parcels, as cost is an issue.

And Jennings awaits: "The donation of soccer balls and equipment is a fantastic way for

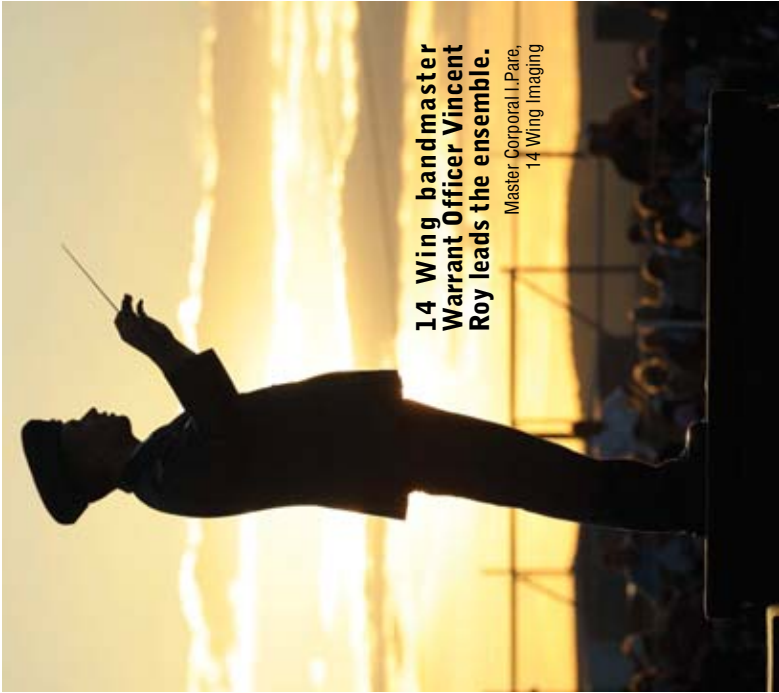

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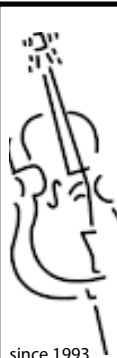
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Aerial armada set for 43rd Stanley Fly-in

In what was once an old abandoned RCAF aerodrome, old and new aircraft will land for Stanley Sport Aviation Association's 43rd Stanley Fly-in August 29 to 31.

As part of the British Commonwealth Air Training Program, the Stanley Aerodrome was built in 1941 as one of many Canadian airfields during the Second World War. It was the home of No 17 Elementary Flight Training School, which trained Commonwealth pilots with Fleet Finches and De-Havilland Tiger Moths for the war effort in Europe.

After the war and years of discontinued use, the Dartmouth Experimental Aircraft Association recovered the airfield with permission from the Nova Scotia government: a daunting task, as almost two decades of inactivity took its toll on the runways. With years of backbreaking work from members, all three runways were recovered. This dedication is continued by the

approximately 95 members of the now Stanley Sport Aviation Association (SSA), whose members range from contractors and cabinet makers to airline pilots – including one employed by the royal family of Morocco.

The Stanley Fly-in, running since 1971, is “gathering of aircraft” from all over the Maritime Provinces and Eastern United States.

“Pilots have come from as far away as British Columbia to as far south as Texas,” says

Kevin Layden, president of the SSA. Pilots with homebuilt aircraft and commercially built aircraft are always welcome to attend this event, the largest fly-in in Eastern Canada.

The fly-in is also open to the general public: “see the

planes, talk to the pilots,” and be inspired to press on with your own dreams of flight.

Don Ledger, director of the Stanley fly-in, says the fly-in is more of a “social event than an air show,” with more pilot- and family-orientated events

planned. This year's schedule includes static displays, local crafts and forums open to all who are interested, and a helicopter from the Department of Natural Resources is tentatively scheduled to provide a static display. Children's events include hay rides, face painting and a cupcake walk. The candy drops Saturday and Sunday, when candy is scattered from the air over an area of the aerodrome, is eagerly anticipated by visiting children. During the evenings, the merriments continue with a band on Friday night, a nightly corn boil and fireworks as well as the SSA's auction Saturday night. Before the fly-in concludes Sunday, SSA members present awards, such as Best Homebuilt Aircraft and Best Commercial Aircraft on the Field, as well as Best Ultralight Aircraft – just to name a few.
