Labrador SAREX tests readiness

The Royal Canadian Air Force hosted its national search and rescue exercise (SAREX) September 15 to 20 in Newfoundland and Labrador.

Organized by 9 Wing Gander, and held at 5 Wing Goose Bay, SAREX included about 250 participants from the Canadian Armed Forces, the Civil Air Search and Rescue Association (CASARA), the Canadian Coast Guard and the Canadian Coast Guard Auxiliary. Primary search and rescue air assets include CH146 Griffon and CH149 Cormorant helicopters, CC130H Hercules and CC115 Buffalo aircraft and four CASARA search

and rescue aircraft.

Realistic training scenarios on land, in the air and on the water were set to enhance interoperability and decision-making among the SAR community. Participants were tested on search techniques, parachute accuracy, mountaineering, water rescue and emergency medical response.

"The national search and rescue exercise gives our Canadian Armed Forces' SAR professionals and our partners the opportunity to exchange ideas on best practices and lessons learned," said

Commander, 1 Canadian Air Division. "The training is essential for our SAR personnel to take those lessons and apply them to

the multiple SAR challenges we face across our great and vast country so that others may live."

The RCAF responds to about

1,000 search and rescue calls annually. Canada's area of responsibility for search and rescue is the largest in the world,

with some of the most remote and arduous terrain, challenging weather conditions and longest coastline.

SAR calls keep crews on the go

A flurry of search and rescue calls at the first of October was "overall, in basically a 36-hour period, our busiest SAR period in — I can't even tell you in how many years."

Captain Mark Norris, squadron operations officer

at 413 (Transport and Rescue) Squadron at 14 Wing Greenwood summarizes three major calls and a routine response to several non-urgent or false calls as intense.

October 2, around 5 p.m., the just reporting night SAR crew was tasked by the Joint Rescue Centre to medivac a 25-year-old man off of a

Clearwater fishing vessel 160 nautical miles south-south-east of Yarmouth. The man was successfully hoisted by SAR-Techs off the ship and transported to hospital in Yarmouth. Conditions were horrendous for both the Cormorant helicopter crew doing the extraction, and the Hercules aircraft providing top cover

and flare support.

Both aircraft returned to Greenwood, and the Hercules was almost immediately tasked to a plane crash in Quebec, responding to a spot beacon sounding about 60 miles north-northeast of Sept-Îles. A float plane with two people aboard had gone down: the plane was upside

down in a lake, with no injuries to the passengers. Hercules' flares attracted the downed pilot's attention, as their communications were out. A radio was parachuted in, then SAR-Techs, who actually parachuted into the lake and swam ashore, as the terrain was mountainous and it was dark. The following Cormorant picked up the two SAR-Techs and plane passengers and transported them to hospital in Sept-Îles. The Hercules and Cormorant returned to Greenwood late in the morning of October 3.

"We have provisions for the operation of our aircraft because it's life and limb," Norris said, referring to the Hercules crew's now 16 hours on calls and the Cormorant crew's 17.5 hours out.

In Greenwood October 3, a call around 2 p.m. from the JRCC tasked a Hercules to head north to Cape Dorset in a further extended call. A group of 22 hunters, including nine children, had been trapped at a camp by weather for several days, and couldn't leave in the canoes they'd travelled in. They were running low on supplies and had contacted Nunavut EMO for assistance. 14 Wing crews packed a three-day supply of military rations and camp fuel, and prepared the incoming night crew for a 5 p.m. departure.

"Our night crew from the day before had returned so late in the day, and our day crew had already been on the job for the better part of a shift – and this was something we could do some pre-planning for," Norris said. "It wasn't life and limb, but we did expect the crew to be out a number of hours, with a night drop of the supplies."

"Community service and family values highlight each and every candidate," said Bill Shaw, president, Para Rescue Association of Canada. "Master Corporal Dennis Van Sickle, your skill as a SAR-Tech, as well as your exemplary sense of duty and responsibility, surely makes you a dedicated rescue specialist."

Chief Warrant Officer (retired) Al Daigle cited Van Sickle's organization of the squad-

ron's annual medical training week, attention to follow-up reports on trainings' and missions' lessons learned, and making use of wide resources in trainings and searches in order to gather the best possible information. Van Sickle also reached beyond the day-to-day, as a member of the squadron hockey team, school in-service trainer, minor hockey and lacrosse coach.

The Diamond Trophy for best overall performance was awarded to a combined 413 Squadron team, including a Hercules flight, maintenance, a Cormorant flight and IMP. Pay attention to online air force life

People love to share what they're doing in social media circles, but beware: "It leaves you open," warns 14 Wing Greenwood's Lieutenant-Colonel Brendan Cook, commanding officer of 405 Squadron.

He recently led a ground training day for his squadron personnel, with a guest presentation from Public Affairs Officer Lieutenant (Navy) Sylvain Rousseau.

"The more information you put out — your likes, your dislikes, the businesses you shop at and what you buy, your friends, where you've been and where you're going; the more you let 'someone' into your life," Cook said. "You need to protect yourself. It's timing, thinking and the simple little things."

Rousseau has been making the rounds at 14 Wing this fall, providing briefings large and small to squadrons, sections and base personnel in

all fields. He reviewed a March 2014 Royal Canadian Air Force policy around the use of social media, but stressed the "common sense" rules Canadian Forces personnel should keep top of mind.

"We encourage people to use social media, sure: you all help us tell our story," Rousseau said. "But — you are all expected to be professional. The way you behave in uniform at the grocery store on the way home is the way you need to behave on your facebook status."

Posting photos, making online statements or expressing opinions that violate CAF policies, derogatory or racist comments are all potential disciplinary actions, not only for the reflection they cast on a soldier's professional affiliation with a national institution, but also the impact on operational security.

"A lot of people don't have bad intentions, but they don't realize the implications when they're talking about move-

ments, or 'we're on the way,'" Rousseau said. "You have to think about yourself, your spouse at home...."

Rousseau and wing public affairs staff work with RCAF personnel across Canada to promote RCAF news, and personnel can help send a professional message in their on-line lives. He also provided some

tips to help them protect themselves while doing it.

"Verify your online security setting all the time — they can change. The air force has one facebook site, but you can have your own, closed group, respecting all the guidelines; for air force activities. State in your personal account profile as well that all content is your own."

Take a stand, educate with CAF family violence prevention campaign

The week of October 13 will mark another year of the Canadian Armed Forces' Family Violence Prevention and Awareness campaign, "Take a Stand Against Family Violence."

The national campaign seeks to engage CAF personnel, their families and the

broader military community and raise awareness of and educate people on the dynamics of family violence. All CAF personnel, leaders and commanding officers have specific professional obligations to prevent, identify or intervene in potential or actual cases of abuse. There is guid-

ance available to victims and those who commit violence as well, to help them respond appropriately to instances of abuse. It is an unfortunate reality family violence exists, and this complex and destructive social phenomenon can occur in the families of CAF members - just as it does

elsewhere in Canadian society.

Military careers entail a range of unique challenges to CAF personnel and their families. The CAF leadership understands this, and has established support programs in the hope of improving the quality of life of those undergoing relocation or experiencing periods of isolation or operational reintegration. While we can all identify and empathize with the emotional upheaval that accompanies these events, we must also recognize acts of family violence cannot be justified or condoned under any circumstance.

Upon the direction of the chief of the defence staff, every CAF base and wing

commander has established a local Family Crisis Team comprising of CAF social work and medical officers, as well as chaplains, military police and health promotion and Military Family Resource Centre staff. The teams are often supplemented by civilian community experts in family violence and are mandated to ensure the safety of victims, then provide all possible assistance and support in a discreet and empathic manner with due regard to family privacy.

We all have a role to play in making our communities safer. Educational resources are available from every base Family Crisis Team to help in recognizing the signs of family violence, understanding our

duty to intervene and respond appropriately to potential or actual cases of abuse.

Take a Stand! Family Violence Education and Awareness one-hour presentations are available to units and squadrons at 14 Wing Greenwood upon request. Topics include family awareness, leadership roles and responsibilities and general awareness. Prenez position et éduquez avec la campagne de prévention de la violence familiale des FAC

La semaine du 13 octobre marquera une autre année de la campagne de sensibilisation et de prévention de la violence en milieu familial des Forces armées canadiennes, qui a pour thème « Prenez position contre la violence en milieu familial ».

La campagne nationale vise à rallier le personnel des FAC, leurs familles et la vaste communauté militaire à cette cause, ainsi qu'à éduquer les gens et à les sensibiliser à la dynamique de la violence familiale. Tous les membres du personnel, tous les leaders et tous les commandants des FAC ont des obligations professionnelles spécifiques en matière de prévention, de repérage et d'intervention face à des cas potentiels ou réels d'abus. De l'aide est disponible pour les victimes de même que pour ceux qui posent des gestes violents, afin de leur permettre de réagir de façon appropriée aux situations d'abus. Le fait que la violence familiale existe est une triste réalité, et ce phénomène social complexe et destructeur peut se produire dans les familles des membres des FAC — comme partout ailleurs dans la société canadienne.

Les carrières militaires posent toute une gamme de défis uniques aux membres du personnel des FAC et à leurs familles. Le leadership des FAC comprend cela, et a établi des programmes de soutien dans l'espoir d'améliorer la qualité de vie de ceux et celles qui vivent des réinstallations ou traversent des périodes d'isolation ou de réintégration opérationnelle. Bien que les bouleversements affectifs qui accompagnent ces événements soient évidents et méritent toute notre sympathie, nous devons aussi reconnaître qu'absolument rien ne permet de justifier ou de tolérer les actes de violence familiale.

Sous la direction du chef d'état-major de la Défense, chaque commandant de base et d'escadre des FAC a établi une équipe locale d'aide aux victimes de crise familiale formée d'officiers du service social et de médecins militaires des FAC, de même que d'aumôniers, de policiers militaires et de membres du personnel de la Promotion de la santé et du Centre des ressources pour les familles des militaires. Ces équipes sont souvent appuyées par des experts en matière de la violence familiale de la communauté civile, et elles ont le mandat de voir à la sécurité des victimes, puis de fournir toute l'assistance et tout le soutien possible, avec discrétion et empathie

en tenant dûment compte de la vie privée des membres de la famille. Nous avons tous un rôle à jouer pour rendre nos communautés plus sûres. Des ressources didactiques sont disponibles auprès de l'équipe d'aide aux victimes de crise familiale de chaque base pour nous aider à reconnaître les signes de violence familiale, à comprendre notre devoir d'intervention et à réagir de façon appropriée aux cas d'abus potentiel ou réel. 14 Wing small arms trainer up and running

October 3, Lieutenant-Colonel Scott Latter and Chief Warrant Officer Fred Stanley cut the ribbon to officially open the wing's new SAT. Latter and Stanley were the first to fire a round down range.

This state-of-the-art training system maximizes the use of simulation technologies afforded by SATs and will significantly enhance the efficiency and effectiveness of "RCAF Force Generation." This wireless/ tetherless simulated weapons technology was developed by Meggitt Training Systems/ military training solutions in Montreal. It is the BlueFire wireless weapons simulator that provides the highest level of realism maintaining form, fit and function of Canadian Armed Forces small arms,

Personnel from the Wing Readiness Training Flight have been trained to operate the system and equipment and will adopt a mixed strategy of live and virtual training. For annual

small arms training, wing personnel will now qualify annually by first completing an online (AFIILE) familiarization course before going into the SAT to achieve their annual qualification. RCAF personnel will still have to qualify on a live rifle range every three years, or if they are going to deploy during that year.

Spicy peanut wings make the crowd go wild on game day

(NC) Watching a game while eating wings just can't be beat. Be sure to have plenty of napkins on hand when you settle in with these spicy, peanutty wings.

Spicy Peanut Chicken Wings

- Makes 2 lbs (1 kg) of wings, to serve 2 to 4

- Prep time: 10 minutes
- Baking time: 35 to 40 minutes

- Ingredients**
- 2 lbs chicken wings
 - ½ cup smooth or crunchy peanut butter
 - ¼ cup lime juice
 - 2 tbsp each soy sauce and hoisin sauce
 - 2 tbsp brown sugar, lightly packed
 - 2 to 3 tbsp hot Chinese chili garlic sauce
 - 1 tbsp hot pepper sauce

Directions

Preheat oven to 425°F (220°C). If wings are whole, cut in half at joint, then cut off wing tips and discard. Place wings in a large bowl.

In a separate bowl, whisk peanut butter with lime juice, soy sauce, hoisin sauce,



brown sugar, chili garlic sauce and hot pepper sauce until combined. Toss with wings, stirring occasionally, while oven preheats.

Set one or two well-greased racks over one or two foil-lined baking sheets. Place wings skin-side up on racks, making sure to not crowd the wings. Spread any peanut butter mixture left in the bowl all over wings. Discard any sauce still remaining in the bowl after this step. Bake wings, turning halfway through cooking, 35 to 40 minutes. Sprinkle with chopped peanuts, if desired.

Tip: If you like your wings extra spicy, you can add more chili garlic sauce and hot pepper sauce, to taste.

Fun By The Numbers
Here's How It Works: Sudoku puzzles are formatted as a 9x9 grid, broken down into nine 3x3 boxes. To solve a sudoku, the numbers 1 through 9 must fill each row, column and box.
