# IMPACT force departs 14 Wing

Members of the Canadian Armed Forces from various parts of the country departed 14 Wing Greenwood in support of Operation IMPACT October 21. Crews from 14 Wing's Logistics and Engineering, traffic technicians and 8 Wing Trenton personnel worked hand-in hand-loading equipment and supplies into transport aircraft.

CAF personnel, including ground crew, logistic support and air crew; will join allies in the Middle East on one specific mission: to degrade the capability of the Islamic State of Iraq and the Levant. Canada's Air Task Force contribution to coalition operations against ISIL includes six CF188 Hornet fighter aircraft from 4 Wing Cold Lake, one CC150T Polaris aerial refueller from 8 Wing Trenton, two CP140 Aurora surveillance aircraft from 14 Wing Greenwood, providing reconnaissance capabilities; a CC130J Hercules tactical airlifter and CC177 Globemaster III strategic airlifter from 8 Wing Trenton and approximately 600 personnel from various elements.

Operation IMPACT is Canada's response to ISIL. CAF members will be working with allies, providing assistance to Iraqi security forces for up to six months.

"In coordination with our allies, Canada is taking action with the Government of Iraq to counter ISIL's barbaric activities and expansionist agenda, which are further destabilizing the region and posing a very real threat to global security," Canadian Prime Minister Stephen Harper has said. "The air support we are providing will ensure security forces on the ground have the weapons they need to defend innocent Iraqi civilians against these terrorists."

# Eyes turned skyward

Master Warrant Officer Keith Mitchell is the civil air search and Rescue Non-Commissioned Member for the National and Atlantic Region of Canada, based at 14 Wing Greenwood. He has served in the Canadian Armed Forces for 34 years and has acquired numerous recognitions, including the Cross of Valour in 1998 and the Order of Military Merit in 2012.

Mitchell was born in La-Salle, Québec and was raised in a military family. His father served in the Royal Canadian Navy as a stoker onboard the HMCS Bonaventure, and his uncle served with the 173rd Airborne Brigade in the United States Military. In 1980, two months after his 17th birthday, Mitchell joined the Canadian Armed Forces as a combat engineer; 12 years later, he decided to pursue a career in search and rescue.

The Canadian Armed Forces' search and rescue technicians (SAR-Techs) are elite members that provide on-scene medical aid and evacuation within Canada. SAR-Techs answer

the call in some of the worst weather conditions and over the most rugged terrain.

In 1996, Mitchell and Chief Warrant Officer Brian Pierce went on a rescue mission in the Arctic, off Baffin Island. They parachuted into the ocean and drifted for 30 minutes before being picked up by a life boat that took them to a nearby fishing vessel, where they administered life-saving medical attention to a stricken fisherman. They faced 50 knots wind and 10-foot waves. For this action, they received the Cross

of Valour from the Governor General on behalf of the Queen and the people of Canada.

Mitchell always enjoys being deployed via a parachute, where he can observe nature underneath his feet. He mentions a quote he first read 34 years ago from the Renaissance and, until this day, the quote remains true for him: "Once you have tasted flight, you will forever walk the earth with your eyes turned skyward, for there you have been, and there you will always long to return" (Leonardo da Vinci).

# 14 Wing 'bros' get set for Movember

Movember intends to "change the face of men's health," encouraging men to grow a moustache through November and raise awareness about men's health issues.

Originally targeted towards prostate cancer, the campaign has evolved to include other male cancers and mental health issues.

This year, the 14 Wing Greenwood Movember campaign will honour Jack Limo, a well-respected veteran of the air traffic control family and a stalwart proponent for the fight against prostate cancer. Limo passed away September 14 after a four-month battle with prostate cancer. He was a proud Canadian, immigrating to Canada from Finland at the age of five through Pier 21 in Halifax. He joined the Canadian Armed Forces in 1966, and served 40 years in the Royal Canadian Air Force before retiring with the rank of major in 2006. He then conducted more than 35 serials of the On Scene Emergency Response course.

As a tribute to Limo, and all brothers who have lost

or are currently fighting the fight, 14 Wing "bros" are invited to unite and "grow the mo." Together, we can make a difference by creating awareness, educating people and contributing towards men's health issues.

Two Movember pep rallies are scheduled at 14 Wing, both in the Annapolis Mess during the TGIF November 14 and the TGIT November 27. Personnel and Movember participants are invited to check in on the progress of various moustaches under development at these events.



The Movember Foundation strongly encourages men to have annual checkups and be aware of their family history of cancer and to adopt a healthier lifestyle. Movember aims to increase early cancer detection, diagnosis and effective treatments, and ultimately reduce the number of preventable deaths.

Prostate cancer is the most common cancer among Canadian men (excluding non-melanoma skin cancers). It is the third leading cause of death from cancer in men in Canada. It is estimated, in 2014, 23,600 men will be diagnosed with prostate cancer; 4,000 men will die from prostate cancer. On average, 65 Canadian men will be diagnosed with prostate cancer every day.

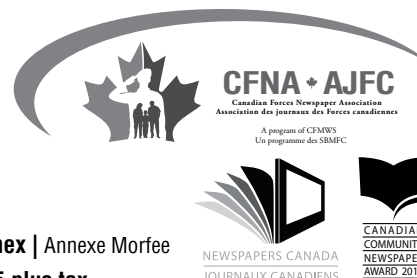

# Aircraft fire, rescue training takes on reality

“We have a downed CP140 on the button, with 33,000 pounds of fuel and two souls on board...”

Rolling into action on 14 Wing Greenwood’s airfield would be fire response crews from 14 Wing Fire and Emergency Services, who have used this scenario in training.

FES has all 14 Wing firefighters up to speed on aircraft fire and rescue response, with a summer’s worth of training time on the new MAFT – Mobile Aircraft Fire Trainer – sit-

ting in its training compound. This is the Royal Canadian Air Force’s first propane-fuelled aircraft firefighting simulator, having arrived at 14 Wing late in the spring. The 48-foot metal body tube, with a stylized cockpit, cargo and seating area, exits and a working cargo ramp; can be adjusted to simulate one of the RCAF’s cargo or fighter aircraft. The whole thing sits on an 18-wheeler flatbed.

“The guys would go to Borden to certify, or there would be contract trainings with the Toronto airport’s firefighter school,” says Chief Captain

Bruce Paradis. “The plan with this is it would arrive here in Greenwood, stay here for local training, and then travel to Bagotville and Shearwater, and then come back again.”

As 14 Wing can store the MAFT indoors during the winter, the equipment’s home base will be here in Greenwood. A late summer start on installation and training means the MAFT will stay here until next spring, when it will indeed become mobile.

In the meantime, firefighters are making good use of the simulator’s variable combinations of fire and rescue

scenarios. The exercise simulator can remotely ignite or extinguish propane feeds to several burn boxes on the aircraft body to mimic engine, cargo, cockpit, wheel and other fires. It can even simulate “3D” fires, meant to represent fire from pressurized fuel lines. Responders can use vehicle equipment, hand lines and breathing apparatus gear to tackle what they find at the training scene.

“For safety, if anyone is in or near the simulator and things go wrong, the operator can kill the propane – it’s instantaneous,” Paradis says.

Responders are evaluated any fire, extract flight crews and also contain damage and details for future flight safety investigations.

## The Defence Ethics Survey returns: We want to hear from you

The 2014 Defence Ethics Survey, now on its fifth iteration and sponsored by the Defence Ethics Programme, was released in September. The anonymous, voluntary survey will collect input from a random sample of DND and Canadian Armed Forces personnel, including reserves. Those chosen to participate have been notified.

Ethics is a topic of vital importance in the CAF and in DND. As such, the survey is a critical tool that, based

on respondent feedback, will guide the development of ethics initiatives and training programs. In addition, results will assist senior leaders in creating conditions aimed at fostering ethical attitudes and behaviour. Survey results will also contribute to international research collaborations, allowing DND to obtain even more insights from the results, while once more bringing visibility to Defence on the world stage in this research field.

This year's survey will mea-

sure perceptions of organizational conditions that promote ethical behaviour with questions such as, "Does your immediate supervisor set a good example in terms of ethical behaviour?" The survey will also measure ethical risk – the likelihood of Defence personnel acting contrary to one or more of the Defence standards or values. And last but certainly not least, the survey aims to be the most user-friendly ever. It will be possible to submit it from any computer with inter-

net access (hard copy delivery will be available on request). It will also allow users to save a partially-completed survey if finishing it all at one time poses a challenge.

If you were randomly selected to complete the survey, remember that every response matters. We appreciate and value your input, and ask that you encourage your peers and subordinates to complete the survey if selected. All personnel will be hearing about the results of this important survey.

All intentions were good this fall to mark several significant milestones and achievements at 14 Wing Greenwood, but deployment preparations have taken precedence.

mendations were awarded to several individuals and groups.

Three members of 31 Military Police Flight – Captain Touchette, Corporal (retired) Caron and Corporal Osborne – were recognized for their role in a medical emergency at the Flight Line Café April 3, 2014.

One of the co-owners was experiencing heart trouble, and the MPS assisted with first aid, calming the co-owner's wife and bringing in wing firefighters and Emergency Health Services responders.

For their work post-Tropical Storm Arthur July 5, the Wing Construction Engineering Damage Control team was recognized for their immediate response and effectiveness during the clean-up of storm damage. The wing, the Residential Housing Units neighbourhood and grounds were all affected by high winds and extended power outages, and the members responded with "speed and focussed effort."

In recognition of organizational work around the consecration of new colours for 405 Squadron May 14, including a parade, visit by the governor general and follow-up museum dedication of the retired colours; Captain Vince Doucette of 405 Squadron was presented a Wing Commander's Commendation.

Also from 405 Squadron, Corporal D. Beauregard-Douaire was recognized for his role in responding to a flight safety issue: a cracked fuel nozzle in the engine of a

CP140 Aurora while deployed in Iceland June 20.

Segreant T.S. Klassen of 405 Squadron was further recognized for his redesign of the 14 Wing self-sufficient spares kit, and standardization of deployment spares across the CP140 Aurora fleet. He also regenerated a plan to minimize maintenance operations around daily aircraft wash capabilities.

Wing Operations Captain D.T. Hunter displayed "exceptional performance and dedication" during the preparations of 14 Wing's air traffic operation in both the aerodrome and controlled airspace for the recent 1 Canadian Air Division Aerospace Readiness' operational standardization visit.

Also from Wing Operations, Lieutenant T.G. Korn qualified as a mission support officer while awaiting MOAT training, and deployed with both Rimpac and Nanook exercises as an invaluable part of the junior officer team.

Petty Officer 1st Class J.S. Stewart from Wing Operations was recognized for performance while employed as both the acting 14 Wing intelligence

## Greenwood SAR crews recognized by governor general

Governor General and Commander-in-Chief of Canada David Johnston presided over two presentation ceremonies of Canadian honours October 3, at the residence of the Governor General at La Citadelle of Québec.

During the afternoon ceremony, he presented two Decorations for Bravery and 29 Meritorious Service Decorations (Military Division) to members of the Canadian Armed Forces and allied forces whose specific achievements brought honour to the Canadian Armed Forces and to Canada.

The Governor General noted 2014 marks the 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Meritorious Service Cross (Military Division).

“The medals and decorations being presented today are among the highest honours that can be awarded to Canadians and to members of the Canadian Armed Forces. You serve with so many dedicated and deserving servicemen and women, but today we honour you for your extraordinary accomplishments,” he said.

“With these medals and

decorations, your responsibility among your comrades and colleagues is now even greater. Never underestimate the power of your example to inspire others. I know that each of you also seeks a better world, where justice and equality prevail.

“These honours are a testament to your courage, ingenuity and quiet determination, and they also extend to your families and loved ones, who in their own way have accepted the demands of service. And

so it is with great admiration that I offer my thanks and congratulations to each of you for your service and valour.”

Several members of the Royal Canadian Air Force were honoured during the ceremonies, including the following (the ranks given in the citations are those held by the individuals at the time of the event for which the honour was awarded):

From 14 Wing Greenwood, Master Corporal Robert James Featherstone and Sergeant

Norman Ewen Penny were recognized with a Medal of Bravery for their role March 27, 2012, when they rescued three people stranded at sea during a storm, south of Cape Sable Island. In spite of challenging weather conditions, they managed to execute three successful hoist recoveries from a helicopter and retrieve all the victims from their damaged sailboat.

A Meritorious Service Medal was awarded to the crew of Rescue 908 from 14 Wing

Greenwood: Lieutenant-Colonel Joseph Christian Guy Leblanc, Corporal Clinton Jeffrey Lewis, Warrant Officer Michael David Mar and Captain Trevor Mark Pellerin. March 27, 2012, despite gale force winds, 120-metre altitude ceilings, snow squalls and five- to eight-metre waves; the crew from 413 (Transport and Rescue) Squadron was involved in a perilous night mission to recover survivors from the S/V Tabasco II, foundering in the stormy North

Atlantic south of Nova Scotia. First officer Leblanc took charge of all flight functions, including aircraft navigation and survivor spotting, allowing his aircraft commander to concentrate on managing crew resources while flying in the abysmal conditions. Aircraft commander Pellerin placed the helicopter in a 20-metre hover in order for his crew to investigate the life raft, and subsequently moved the aircraft to the sailboat to effect the rescue. Flight engineer Lewis, previously injured during hoist operations, identified an unconventional method to keep the helicopter in position over the vessel, which proved instrumental in the safe completion of the mission. As replacement flight engineer following Lewis’ injury, Mar immediately stepped in to operate the safe hoist by placing the SAR technicians on board the raft and sailing vessel, and safely recovering five persons. The crew of Rescue 908 demonstrated exemplary team work, bringing great honour to themselves and to the Canadian Armed Forces.

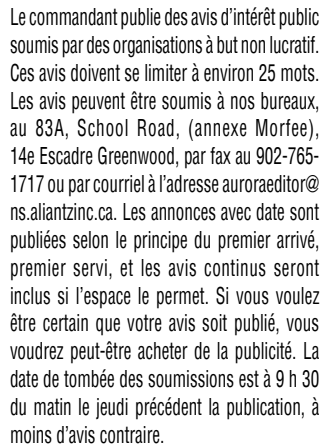

in question, but use the work as a teaching opportunity for ACS peers.

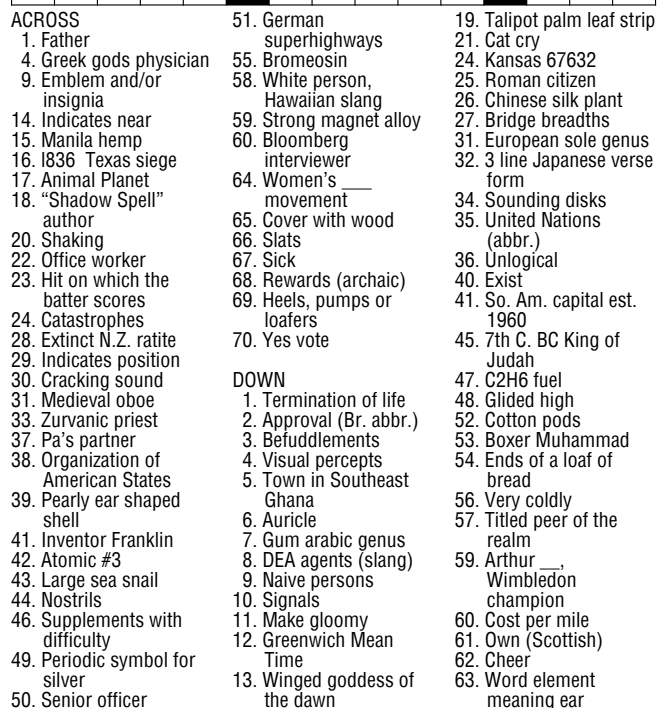
