Skills camp All about the jump

Don't let the razzing on landings, the talk of so-and-so's "divots," the jokester crawling into the marked landing area with a full 'chute billowing behind him and the relaxed attitude fool you.

The 413 (Transport and Rescue) Squadron summer jump camp is all business.

June 22 to 26, 17 search and rescue technicians (SAR-Techs) and several Hercules air crews practiced a range of manoeuvres and skills in far better conditions than those experienced through may of their actual emergency calls. With 60-plus jumps scheduled every day, personnel took full advantage of practice, certification and trouble-shooting opportunities.

"I didn't realize I missed it until now!" said Sergeant

Mike Ruddy, first on the ground through many of the first jump rounds as he recertified after a year on a desk. "This is ideal!"

The jump camp takes several months to plan, including changing up the work schedule to bring the SAR-Techs together.

"There are normally two on an airframe crew per shift, so it's great to have us all together like this," says Master Corporal Brad Schetterer. "It's professional development, sure... but the teasing amplifies. This is all about camaraderie."

The SAR-Techs spent their days on daily briefings, skills lessons and gear checks in the shop, and then wedged in three and even four jumps, depending on weather conditions and timings. Canopy skills, confined space approaches and landings and

exit positions were practised and scrutinized, with every jump recorded by Wing Imaging for later review.

Ground support kept the SAR-Techs in the air, with two riggers working full days to keep 'chutes rolled and ready. Master Corporal Brad Ward estimated, with 17 guys jumping, using 60-plus chutes a day, "that'll take a SAR-Tech three-and-a-half to four hours at the end of the

day to repack. You'll see them do one or two, go home for supper and come back and work 'til nine o'clock tonight – or they'll come in super early tomorrow. They'll be tired: the average jump, that's like working an eight-hour day, and it's hard on you."

Family visit remembers lost brother

"Now we know," said Lieutenant-Commander (retired) Peter Curzon June 25, upon a visit to 14 Wing Greenwood to see historical and memorial reminders of the death of his brother, John, in a 1953 Lancaster crash.

The Curzon family – Peter, his wife, Jean; and daughters Lucy and Kate – were hosted by Padre Gord Poley for a morning's tour of the Greenwood Military Aviation Museum's 413 (Transport and Rescue) Squadron displays, 413 Squadron's briefing room, with its memorial mural to members lost, and the operations area of the squadron; and St. Mark's Chapel, with its commemorative stained glass piece. All was arranged in advance of a family visit to Nova Scotia.

"I was always wanting to

come, and see the windows and the displays – this was great," Curzon said, who was 21 when John died. "There's a lot we didn't know."

Curzon visited his older brother, at 14 Wing Greenwood many years ago, when he was a 19-year-old Cadet with three days' leave from Halifax. John, a flight officer, was training here at 14 Wing, a part of 413 Squadron. While search and rescue capabilities were nowhere near as comprehensive and effective as they are today, John, 27, was a navigator on a search mission April 20, 1953 when his Lancaster crashed in Centreville, north of Kentville. Six of the seven crewmembers died.

"It was so stupid – the week before, John had been up north for search and rescue exercises – and then to crash into a hill around here..." Jean said. While she never met John, her married life

with Curzon included an annual wreath-making and laying outing to the family burial plot in Richmond Hill, Ontario, where John's headstone was placed.

Curzon's parents were aware of the St. Mark's stained glass commissioning and dedication event, but had received the invitation from organizers too late to

attend the event from Ontario. Curzon himself continued his Navy career in the Reserves all his life, but had never had the opportunity to return to Greenwood until now.

He had a specially-selected arrangement of flowers to leave as a memento for John at St. Mark's, and was able to share many memories with his family.

Wing wide water restriction

Due to high summer temperatures and a low water table in the local area, 14 Wing Greenwood must institute annual water restrictions to protect the water supply and the water distribution system.

These measures ensure Residential Housing Units' residents have safe, potable water for all essential home use, while maintaining a fire-fighting reserve to protect the RHU area.


In an effort to give maxi-

mum flexibility to RHU residents, while maintaining the integrity of the wing water distribution system, changes have been made to the annual 14 Wing water restriction. As of July 8, RHUs with odd street numbers will have the opportunity to use water for non-essential home use on odd numbered calendar days; even numbered RHUs will be given the same opportunity on even numbered calendar days.

Results of spring recreation 'makeover' show off 14 Wing facilities

Captain Scott Bailey starts going through the list of improvements undertaken this spring at a variety of 14 Wing Greenwood facilities, both operational and recreational.

"... I can see we're going to be going off on a lot of tangents at once..." he says.

No small wonder, as Wing Construction Engineering is "at capacity" on multiple millions of dollars' worth of improvements. At once.

In the fall of 2014, a call

came out from Winnipeg for various wings' and bases' capital improvements and maintenance plans, lists of projects that were on the horizon over the next two years. Bailey, the outgoing requirements officer, very quickly pulled stakeholders in for a meeting and had a detailed \$32 million list ready to go the same day.

Over the winter, federal money became available in multiple budget management lines, and Bailey has continued working with partners to make the most of the money: \$11.6 million of Federal Infrastructure Improvement Plan funding has been released to 14 Wing for 2015/ 2016 and 2016/ 2017, and another \$5.6 million will take care of projects working their way down the priority list.

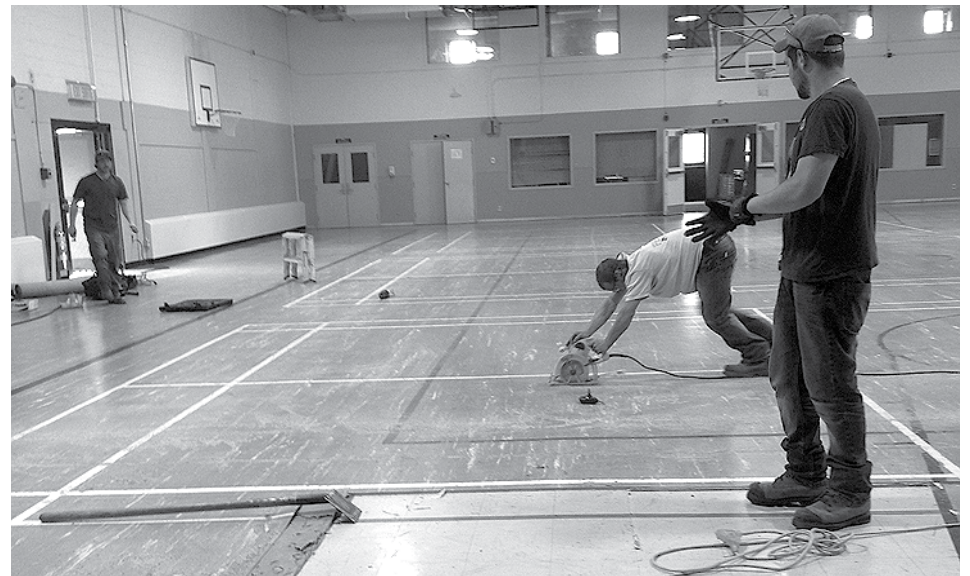
"It means an awful lot of work," Bailey says. "Last fall's (priority list from the wing infrastructure planning committee) list is pretty much done, and we're moving on"

Add in cost-sharing partnerships with the Personnel Support Program and Wing Fund, along with already budgeted improvements, and 14 Wing is getting a facelift.

Public spaces new, improved

High in the public eye will be the new look at several recreation and community spaces. The Church Street 14 Wing Greenwood Community Centre is a prime example: in the gym, a new floor, painting, a scoreboard, water fountain relocation, LED lighting, sprinkler upgrades and the removal of storage cabinets. PSP is funding six new basketball nets. The central lobby, office spaces and youth centre were repainted and refloored, and new stair treads were placed. The bowling alley's lanes were completely refinished.

"The community centre was lower on the priority list, but we started looking at it with some health and safety questions, and then the funding injection: this is the full blitz. We have

a proper sports floor for high traffic, and 15 to 20 years' lifetime is the goal. If we were going to do it, we were going to do it well."

Seeing the results of the flooring, painting and lighting in the community centre gym, Wing Construction Engineering intends to tackle the same work in the Morfee Centre gym.

Earlier this spring, the Fitness & Sports Centre's gym floor was also resurfaced, bringing it back from the wear and tear of regular use by personnel fitness training, testing and recreational activity.

The curling club has new LED lighting, and there's an \$800,000 project underway at the arena to "overhaul" the

building.

"This was a building with a large number of health and safety issues – near condemned," Bailey says. A total of \$200,000 in improvements over the last two years and this year is now augmented by the fresh cash injection: a new roof, asbestos remediation, five locker rooms being upgraded, new rubber flooring, a washroom replacement, LED lighting, new rink boards and a planned reconfiguration next summer of the west end entrance after this winter's snow collapsed the overhanging roof.

"We know we're not quite there yet, but there's another plan for next year."

Outdoors, the conversion of the Ivy Street ball diamond to a new soccer pitch got underway with the laying of 3.2 kilometres of drainage pipe two feet below the surface last fall. A late start this spring means the field will be left to naturalize and can likely be used for practices; in the fall, crews will move back in with topsoil levelling, hydroseeding and then "put it to bed" for the winter. This is another cost-shared project between the 14 Wing Construction Engineering and PSP/ Wing Fund.

Work to rehabilitate the walking track around the Apple Bowl soccer field is on the radar for fall, incorporating a long-envisioned trail system through the Residential Housing Units' neighbourhood and recreational spaces with outdoor fitness equipment.

Finally, the outdoor pool has a pending project to renovate the shower and washroom block and build some shade structures, with the PSP and CE partnership model.

"We've improved all these spaces for the community and military training," Bailey says. "There have been lots of logistics and brain power to make it all happen, and we've been very meticulous with keeping track of all the work this year."

"We have lots of stuff going on."

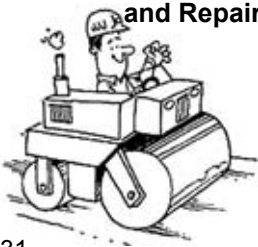

Base infrastructure gets \$20m boost

A long list of long put-off infrastructure work will be tackled at 14 Wing Greenwood over the next two years, after a \$20 million injection announced July 2.

Nova Scotia Members of Parliament Peter MacKay and Scott Armstrong visited the base to announce the funds, which will cover projects directly affecting operations, and the home life of 14 Wing personnel.

"This is a busy place, and operations never stop," Armstrong said. "That re-

quires remarkable dedication of people working here, and a solid dependence on infrastructure."

The Residential Housing Units will benefit from \$8 million in modernization work, particularly around energy efficiency, comfort and suitability conditions for residents.

Also covering accommo-

invested in renovations, bring accommodations standards up to national standards.

Asbestos removal work in three building spaces in and around the Greenwood Gardens Arena will cost \$1.6 million.

Road and parking lot pavement work will cost \$2.8 million this summer and next.

The airfield's taxiway and apron will be milled, with a new overlay of pavement installed at a cost of \$2.8 million.

Hangar 9 will see new door rails, rollers and electrical system upgrades, worth \$1.1 million.

Two fire pumps will be replaced, at a cost of \$2.3 million. The pumps are integral to the wing's fire suppression system, including the foam deluge system for two hangars and a suppression system for the mission support area of the base.

"These are central pieces of Canadian Armed Forces operational capability and readiness infrastructure," Armstrong said. "Investing

in our future – keeping roads, runways and hangars not only safe, but operational – allows you to do what you do best: keep the rest of us safe."

Wing Commander Colonel Iain Huddleston said the funding represents big projects going ahead," all critical

to the operational output of the wing.

"Half the funds are related to our spaces, and half to our people, including personal housing. We expect 40 to 60 projects to really be accelerated in the RHUs with this money."

The work will proceed with a mix of contracted providers, under the direction of the Construction Engineering

branch at 14 Wing and the Canadian Forces Housing Agency, over the next two fiscal years.

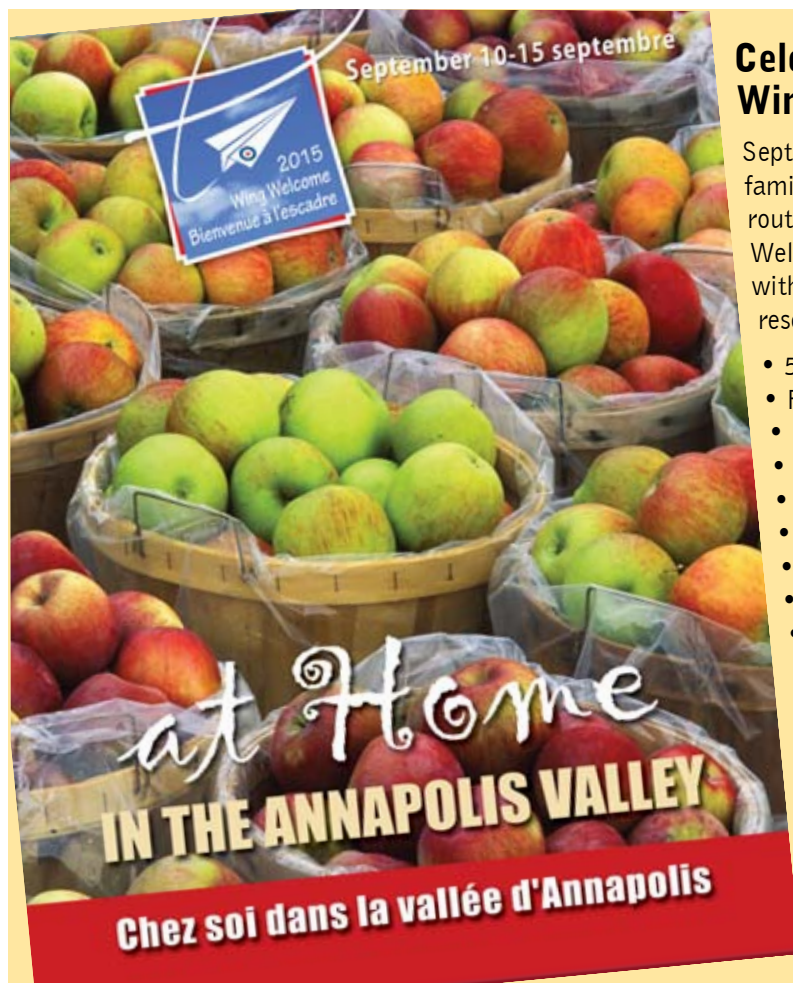



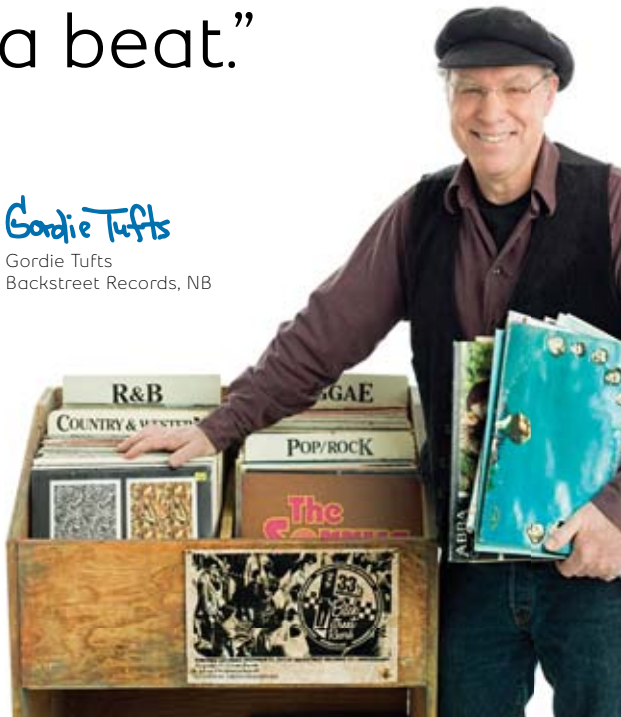
