

Results of spring recreation 'makeover' show off 14 Wing facilities

various wings' and bases' capital improvements and maintenance plans, lists of projects that were on the horizon over the next two years. Bailey, the outgoing requirements officer, very quickly pulled stakeholders in for a meeting and had a detailed \$32 million list ready to go the same day.

Over the winter, federal money became available in multiple budget management lines, and Bailey has continued working with partners to make the most of the money: \$11.6 million of Federal Infrastructure Improvement Plan funding has been released to 14 Wing for 2015/ 2016 and 2016/ 2017, and another \$5.6 million will take care of projects working their way down the priority list.

"It means an awful lot of work," Bailey says. "Last fall's (priority list from the wing infrastructure planning committee) list is pretty much done, and we're moving on"

Add in cost-sharing partnerships with the Personnel Support Program and Wing Fund, along with already budgeted improvements, and 14 Wing is getting a facelift.



High in the public eye will be the new look at several recreation and community spaces. The Church Street 14 Wing Greenwood Community Centre is a prime example: in the gym, a new floor, painting, a scoreboard, water fountain relocation, LED lighting, sprinkler upgrades and the removal of storage cabinets. PSP is funding six new basketball nets. The central lobby, office spaces and youth centre were repainted and refloored, and new stair treads were placed. The bowling alley's lanes were completely refinished.

"The community centre was lower on the priority list, but we started looking at it with some health and safety questions, and then the funding injection: this is the full blitz. We have lifetime is the goal. If we were a large number of health and safety issues - near condemned," Bailey says. A total of \$200,000 in improvements over the last two years and this year is now augmented by the fresh cash injection: a new roof, asbestos remediation, five locker rooms being upgraded, new rubber flooring, a washroom replacement, LED lighting, new rink boards and a planned reconfiguration next summer of the west end entrance after this winter's snow collapsed the overhang-

ize and can likely be used for practices; in the fall, crews will move back in with topsoil levelling, hydroseeding and then "put it to bed" for the winter. This is another cost-shared project between the 14 Wing Construction Engineering and PSP/ Wing Fund. Work to rehabilitate the walking track around the Apple Bowl soccer field is on the radar for fall, incorporating a long-envisioned trail system through the Residential Housing Units' neighbourhood and recreational spaces with outdoor fitness equipment.

Finally, the outdoor pool has a pending project to renovate the shower and washroom block and build some shade structures, with the PSP and CE partnership model.
