## Summer work highlights museum displays

Volunteers did not stop over the summer at the Greenwood Military Aviation Museum! Some projects are continuing, while others are coming to fruition.

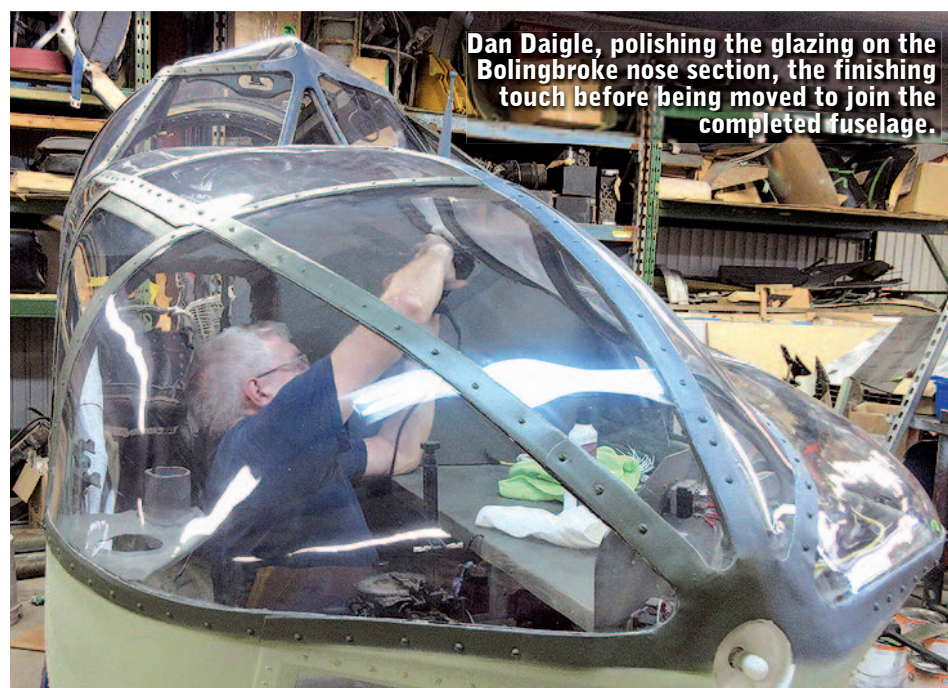
The Lancaster bomber re-configuration project will be the most noticeable to museum visitors. Two years ago, the elongated nose from the post-war service Lancaster was extricated and shortened.

The nose was refurbished, and reattached this spring. An accurate replica nose turret is being constructed and will be attached soon. Painting of the fuselage began last fall and is nearing completion. This major effort is to acknowledge the stellar participation of Greenwood's 405 Squadron during the Second World War with the famous 8 Pathfinder Squadron.

In the museum workshop, the Bolingbroke restoration project has made significant progress. The nose section

has been completely rebuilt and is now ready to join the fuselage in the museum extension. The centre wing box nears completion, as the troublesome flaps have now been restored. Assembly of the landing gear is next. Room in the workshop will now be available to enable wing restoration.

The Piasecki/ Vertol H44 "Flying Banana" helicopter restoration has passed a milestone, with the replacement of the last of five corroded panels on the rear fuselage. Soon,



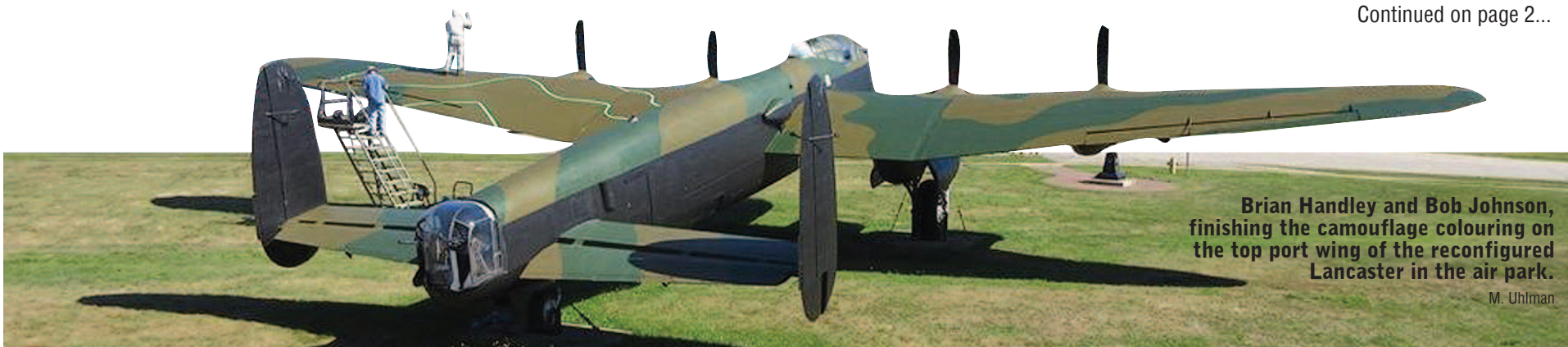

# Battle of Britain service marks 75 years

Seventy-five years ago, Great Britain stood alone in Europe against the mighty German war machine. Germany swept across Europe and pushed the Allied armies off of the mainland through Dunkirk. The British and French armies were decimated, losing most of their equipment on the retreat from the beach.

The only thing standing against total German victory was a small British air force. Thus began the battle in the air over the English mainland known as the Battle of Britain.

The Battle of Britain lasted just short of four months, starting July 10 and lasting until October 31, 1940. The RAF during the battle of Britain included 595 non-British pi-

lots, including 112 Canadians. Of the RAF losses, 47 people were from Canada. September 15 is deemed to be the crucial day of the battle, as the Germans sent two massive waves of aircraft to attack. The RAF shot down 60 German aircraft, with only 26 losses. This day is commemorated as Battle of Britain Day.

Come out and join the Royal Canadian Air Force Association as it marks the battle at the CANEX parking lot September 20, at 2 p.m. There will be a short parade and wreath laying ceremony, followed by a reception at the Royal Canadian Air Force Association at 904 Central Ave (the Greenwood civic building).

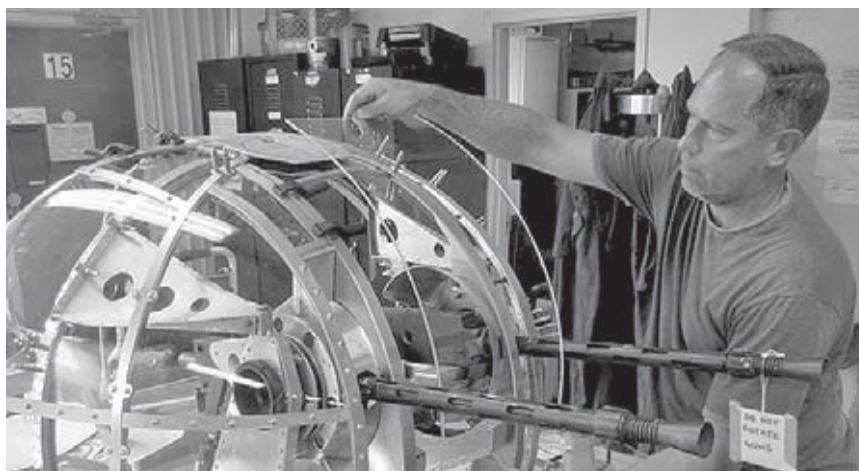

will complete this project, leaving the museum with a pristine restoration for all to enjoy. Next to the Neptune, there are three cement pads. These will hold the museum's time-expired Arcturus (an Aurora without all the sophisticated electronics) when time permits the move.

Inside the museum, several new exhibits can be enjoyed. An exciting diorama depicts a 404 Squadron sortie during the Second World War commemorating "Black Friday;" another depicts a bomb run by a 405 Squadron Pathfinder aircraft. The latter allows the visitor to look through a Lancaster bomb aimer's window during a bombing raid over an enemy target. The realistic view sees in the night time skies several aircraft at different altitudes

on the same mission, with misty clouds obscuring the target, coloured ground explosions depicting markers dropped by Pathfinders, bomb bursts and flak explosions.

September 12 sees an inaugural museum event, "Wings and Wheels," an expo of vintage cars and aircraft in the air park. Museum volunteers are pulling out all stops to make this a memorable event, and will show off their labours by opening up the Dakota, Labrador and Anson aircraft restorations. Food will be available in The Flight Line Cafe and in the air park; the latter will include a hot dog barbecue and popcorn and cotton candy sale. Seventeen splendid glass trophies, named after aircraft flown at Greenwood, will be up for grabs for deserving automobiles.

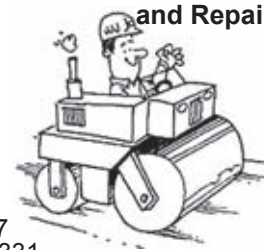

# Barrier art tells CAF story in Kuwait

The omnipresent concrete barriers that line the roads and surround their compounds can sometimes leave Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) personnel serving in Kuwait feeling a little “closed-in,” despite the open desert that surrounds many of the airfields from which they operate.

Fortunately, for the artistically inclined, these flat grey walls also serve as excellent canvasses for expressing unit pride and esprit de corps. A quick walk through Camp Canada or Camp Patrice Vincent reveals a wide variety of artwork reflecting units, operations, exercises and people. Some American art dates to the late 1990s, during that nation’s enforcement of the “no-fly zone” over Iraq. Other paintings are more recent – those commemorating the Canadian air bridges be-

tween Kuwait and Afghanistan in the final years of Operation Athena, for example.

With the Canadian deployments to Kuwait as part of Operation Impact, members involved in Canada’s fight against the Islamic State have been using their paint brushes to make new contributions to the décor of their camps, reflecting those who inspire them and that which binds them together.

Among the first walls to go up during Operation Impact was the “Camp Canada” barrier wall at the front gate of the CAF’s Kuwait “Hub.” Adorned with the Canadian Joint Operations Command badge, this wall serves as the “welcome home” sign for returning long range patrol and air-to-air refuelling personnel, and for members of the many support trades who work in and around the busy base.

Another recent addition to the barrier wall art in Kuwait

is also the most poignant: the Camp Patrice Vincent wall, which was painted by two Air Task Force - Iraq members

over the course of five days in memory of Warrant Officer Patrice Vincent, intentionally killed October 20, 2014, by a hit-and-run driver in Saint-Jean-sur-Richelieu, Quebec. The pair of dedicated artists completed the project with just hours to spare before it was revealed to Canadian and coalition members on parade during the 2014 Remembrance Day ceremony. Among the most vibrant and new walls on the base, it stands out, catching many eyes of the passing Canadian and foreign military members each day. The painting serves to remind members to uphold the values which Vincent

upheld.

There have also been additions from the air detachment members to commemorate Rotation 0 and the work the busy crews did to achieve early successes within the Air Task Force. Some – the new long range patrol detachment mural, for example -- are found in places such as Camp Canada, while others, such as the Rotation 0 fighter detachment mural, are closer to the flight lines.

Barrier art is often created at night, using projectors to put the design on the wall so artists can trace on the outlines. Working at night also enables the artists to avoid

the mid-day heat. To mitigate the effects of the harsh desert environment such as driving wind, flash rainstorms and high temperature, oil and enamel paints are often used. While durable, it also means longer working days and evenings.

For personnel deployed on Operation Impact, the splash of colour against the often monochromatic base landscape is welcome, and the efforts of the volunteer artists are greatly appreciated. As a new batch of CAF personnel rotates in to continue operations against ISIS, there will surely be more stories to tell on the concrete walls of Kuwait.

## Is health, safety just common sense?

How often have you heard, "he (or she) would not have been injured if they had just used some common sense?"

Many safety incidents, serious disabling accidents and fatal accidents are often blamed on a lack of common sense. If, in fact, health and safety is just common sense, then, to quote Mark Twain "Common sense is not that common."

There is no such thing as "common sense:" all such "sense" is a learned behaviour. A recent comical obituary in the London Times pays homage to the death of common sense itself: "Today we mourn the passing of a dear old friend, Common Sense, who has been with us for many years. No one really knows how old he was, since his birth records were long ago lost in bureaucratic red tape. He will be lovingly remembered as having cultivated such valuable lessons as 'knowing when to come in out of the rain,' 'the early bird gets the worm,' 'life isn't always fair' and 'maybe it was my fault.' Not many attended his funeral, as few realized he was gone"

Humans do not have the ability to "just know" about everything, including safety. The common sense 4:1 ladder angle ratio is not imprinted in our DNA. My father, a licensed carpenter; taught me as a young lad how to use all the power tools in his work shop, and how to use them safely.

Common sense is a basic ability to perceive, understand and judge things in a way that is common to nearly all people. Implying health and safety is simply common sense relegates it to those areas in our lives that don't require much thought or close attention.

But, wait! There may, in fact, be a couple of factors that affect what appear to be "common sense." For example, a young child puts his hand on a hot stove top and gets burned. So-called common sense will prevent most adults from the same mishap but, because the child has never yet experienced this, he or she does not possess this common sense - and will only learn through experience, education and training.

When it comes to workplace health and safety, common sense is only "common" when employees have an awareness and understanding of the risks associated with work tasks and conditions. "Mindfulness," linked to yoga and spirituality, is closely related to common sense. Mindfulness is all about keeping one's thinking current and doing things "mindfully." This is closely linked to safety training components, such as keeping eyes and mind "on task." Safety requires much more than common sense: it deserves mindfulness - and competence. Health and safety will become common sense when all employees are able to perceive risks when and as they arise, understand the consequences of exposure and make timely, smart decisions to not tolerate any risk inconsistent with the corporate risk posture.

We could state the majority of health and safety practice is not common sense; rather, it is simply "good sense." All too often, common sense does not become

good sense until after an accident. When we undertake an accident investigation, we look back at the actions, behaviours and conditions of the event and understand how or why work processes allowed these unsafe conditions to exist, we can see what went wrong, further developing competence from lessons learned. Our focus needs to be not on common sense, but on seeking competency from employees.

Department of National Defence members are not born with good sense and competency. These attributes are acquired throughout our work lives via experience, education and training. Good sense can be learned from the experiences of others, as well as our own, and can be taught in classroom or on the hanger floor. Front-line workers are the best individuals to prevent workplace injury and illness, both to themselves as well as fellow co-workers - but this will only be achieved if they are properly and thoroughly taught to recognize hazards, assess risks and implement appropriate controls.

When you are looking for safety solutions, don't dwell on the elusive common sense: just focus on competency. As respected health and safety professional Alan D. Quilley, whom some may know as the author of "The Emperor Has No Hard Hat," states, "Common sense is a myth propagated by those people who don't remember where and from whom they learned what they know."





# La santé et la sécurité : est-ce vraiment des questions de bon sens?

Combien de fois avez-vous entendu dire : « Une telle personne n'aurait pas été blessée si elle avait fait preuve de gros bon sens »?

On attribue souvent des incidents liés à la sécurité, des accidents invalidants et des accidents mortels à un manque de bon sens. En fait, la santé et la sécurité ne sont pas tout simplement dictées par le gros bon sens. Autrement dit, le gros bon sens ne va pas toujours de soi.

Le bon sens est un non-sens. Tout sens est plutôt un comportement acquis. Dans un avis de décès plutôt comique publié récemment dans le *Times* de Londres, on annonçait la perte du bon sens : [Traduction] : « Aujourd'hui, nous pleurons la perte d'un ami cher, le Bons sens, qui était avec nous depuis de nombreuses années. Personne ne sait quel âge il avait, parce que sa déclaration de naissance a été perdue il y a belle lurette dans la bureaucratie. Ceux et celles qui l'ont connu garderont de lui de bons souvenirs des leçons précieuses qu'il a apprises, notamment savoir à quel moment se manifester, et des proverbes et mantras qu'il incarnait : L'avenir appartient à ceux qui se lèvent tôt; L'avenir

n'est pas toujours juste; Peut-être que c'était de ma faute. Peu de personnes ont assisté à ses funérailles, car peu ont réalisé qu'il était parti. »

Les êtres humains n'ont pas la capacité de « tout simplement savoir » tout de tout, dont les principes de sécurité. Le calcul de l'angle selon la méthode « 1 dans 4 » pour placer une échelle n'est pas une capacité inscrite dans notre ADN. Lorsque j'étais jeune, mon père, un charpentier breveté, m'a appris comment utiliser en toute sécurité tous les outils électriques dans son atelier.

Le bon sens, c'est la capacité fondamentale de percevoir et de comprendre les choses qui nous entourent d'une manière qui est commune à presque tout le monde. De supposer que la santé et la sécurité sont dictées par le gros bon sens le relègue aux domaines de nos vies qui exigent peu de réflexion ou d'attention. Mais, attention! Plusieurs facteurs peuvent influencer sur ce qui peut sembler le bon sens. Par exemple, un jeune enfant

pose la main sur la surface chauffante de la cuisinière et se brûle. Le soi-disant bon sens empêcherait la plupart des adultes de s'exposer à pareil danger, mais pas les enfants. C'est que les enfants n'y ont pas encore été exposés et n'ont pas ce bon sens. Ils l'apprendront seulement par l'expérience, l'éducation et la formation.

Lorsqu'il est question de santé et sécurité au travail, le bon sens est seulement « bon » lorsque les employés connaissent et comprennent les risques associés aux tâches et aux conditions de travail. Le concept de la pleine conscience qui est associé au yoga et à la spiritualité est aussi étroitement lié au bon sens. La pleine conscience ne se limite pas à se concentrer sur le présent et à faire les choses consciemment. Elle peut aussi s'appliquer à la formation sur la sécurité, notamment le fait de maintenir les yeux et l'esprit concentrés sur la tâche. La sécurité nécessite bien plus que le bon sens. Elle exige la pleine conscience et

des compétences. La santé et la sécurité deviennent dictées par le bon sens lorsque tous les employés sont en mesure de percevoir les risques dès qu'ils surviennent, qu'ils comprennent les conséquences d'y être exposés et qu'ils prennent des décisions éclairées et en temps opportun pour ne pas tolérer les risques qui ne cadrent pas avec la position de risque de l'organisation.

Nous pourrions affirmer que la majorité des pratiques en matière de santé et de sécurité n'est pas une question de bon sens, mais plutôt de logique. Trop souvent la logique ne prend pas le dessus sur le bon sens avant qu'il ne survienne un accident. C'est au moment d'enquêter sur un accident que nous faisons un retour sur les actes, les comportements et les circonstances entourant

l'incident et que nous comprenons pourquoi et comment les méthodes de travail ont contribué au maintien de ces pratiques dangereuses, que nous voyons ce qui n'a pas fonctionné et que nous développons nos compétences des leçons apprises. Nous ne devons pas mettre l'accent sur le bon sens, mais sur le développement des compétences des employés.

Les membres du ministère de la Défense nationale ne sont pas nés avec le bon sens et les compétences voulues. Ces attributs s'acquièrent tout au long de nos carrières par l'expérience, l'éducation et l'instruction. Le bon sens peut s'apprendre des expériences des autres de même que de nos propres expériences, en salle de classe ou sur le plancher du hangar.

Les travailleurs de première ligne sont les mieux placés pour prévenir leurs propres accidents et blessures et ceux de leurs collègues de travail, mais uniquement s'ils sont entraînés de manière appropriée et rigoureuse à reconnaître les dangers, à évaluer les risques et à appliquer les mesures qui conviennent.

Lorsque vous cherchez des solutions en matière de sécurité, ne vous attardez pas au bon sens insaisissable; mettez plutôt l'accent sur les compétences. Comme le dit le professionnel respecté en santé et sécurité, Alan D. Quilley, l'auteur de l'ouvrage : *The Emperor Has No Hard Hat*, [Traduction] : le bon sens est un mythe qui est perpétué par les personnes qui ne se rappellent pas où et de qui elles ont appris leurs connaissances.

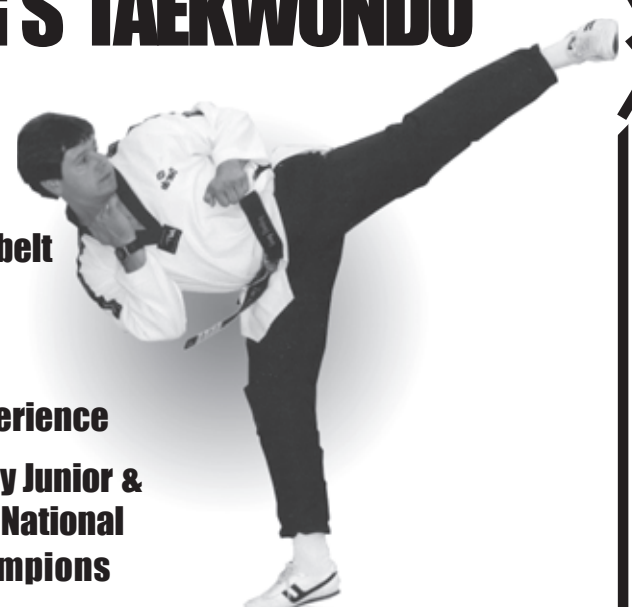



The Duke of Edinburgh International Award program is a non-competitive program open to all youth between 14 and 24 years of age. Youth are challenged to improve themselves in physical activity, service and skill, as well as an outdoor adventurous journey component. It provides an opportunity for youth to become more involved in their community and more diverse in their extra-curricular activities, while gaining valuable skills, experiences and friendships along the way. 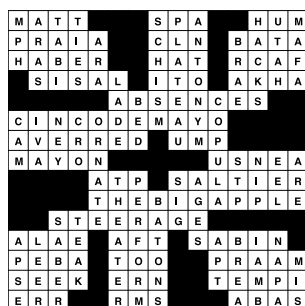

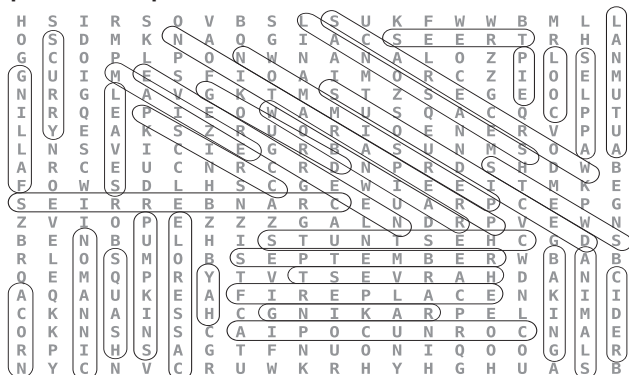
