The CFRG hosts several ness sessions a vear, keving in on under-represented populations, including women, Aboriginals and visible minorities. The CAF follows the federal Employment Equity Act, which encourages a wide representation of Canadian demographics within the workforce. The current representation rate for women in the CAF is 14.8 per cent (compared to a target representation rate of 25.1 per cent), 4.9 per cent for visible minorities (versus a target of 11.8 per cent) and 2.1% for Aboriginals (versus a target of 3.4 per cent). "Key influencers" – like the group of female guidance and career planning specialists visiting 14 Wing – can help expose a military career and lifestyle to these populations.

"They become 'force multipliers," says Sergeant Sue-Ann Galenzoski, the women's advocate for the CFRG. "They remain permanent advocates for the Canadian Armed Forces and, as pillars of their communities, their words of endorsement establish






