## RCAF heritage marks 75-year milestones in June

A lot has changed, but a lot has stayed the same.

The 75-year heritage – and future – of four Royal Canadian Air Force Squadrons will be showcased at a June gathering at 14 Wing Greenwood, Nova Scotia; along with 50 years' worth of VP International history. Organizers expect up to 600 guests to attend anniversary events over the week, all highlighting the strong relationships within the Canadian aviation community, and with international partners.

The modern-day 413 (Transport and Rescue) Squadron, 404 (Long Range Patrol and Training) Squadron, 405 (Long Range Patrol) Squadron and 415 (Long Range Patrol Force Development) Squadron all mark their 75<sup>th</sup> year in 2016 since first being stood-up for service



during the Second World War.

"These squadrons were stood up, populated with air crew, ground staff, support personnel – everything that goes along with establishing an air force," says organizing committee chairman Lieutenant-Colonel Richard Hone, 14 Wing Operations officer. "What's interesting is today's connection to the past – we still have a lot of linkages with nations who were our Allies in the 1940s; and also with those who were in the Axis then.

"That these squadrons sur-

vive today, 75 years later – it depended on their role, their location, the need for their operations and government direction."

For example, 413 Squadron "has flown just about every major aircraft type" over its history, says Wing Heritage Officer Major Richard LeBlanc, and its primary role today is search and rescue on Canada's East coast.

"It's important to know who we are, and where we came from, so today's RCAF members know what they're part of."

three of the four squadrons' past would be Argus-era folks, who remain keen on their RCAF experience as members of VP International. As part of the squadron's anniversary, VPI will mark its 50th anniversary and commemorative service at the international headquarters and memorial at 14 Wing. Twenty-three nations with VPI affiliations are invited to participate.

"It's a chance to reconnect and meet with old friends and talk about our history and heritage," Hone says. "And it goes the other way: with today's personnel talking about the challenges that go along with the advances in today's technology, the new overland mission, the integration of the flood of information available in today's aircraft and the analysis and communications required to turn it into a tactical plan."

It is easy to point to the pressures and challenges in the generations of aviation heritage encompassed over the past 75 years, and see how they evolve: 413 Squadron can be out the door on a search and rescue mission within 30 minutes of a call, and the danger is just as real as bombing runs over Second World War Europe or surveillance flights over Afghanistan or Iraq today.

"We're all part of the Air Force,

all working in support of Canada – and that continues today," LeBlanc says. "Folks take great pride in that, and the tradition continues."

14 Wing Greenwood Commander Colonel Pat Thauberger has several hats to don at this June gathering: officer in command of the hosting 14 Wing Greenwood facilities, a past commander of 404 Squadron and patron of the VP International association, in addition to having been a crew member on 405, 404 and 415 squadrons.

"This is such a great opportunity to collectively remember our

past, while we also look at how our current personnel honour that proud legacy in our day-to-day operations, training, missions and deployments," Thauberger says. "The June gathering marks the significant 75th anniversaries of four of Canada's best squadrons, and 50 years of camaraderie and heritage in VP International. I look forward to welcoming all of our old friends and colleagues back to 'ZX' to join us in this celebration."

# Cours de sensibilisation à la sûreté radiologique offert en ligne

Il existe plusieurs idées fausses au sujet du rayonnement ionisant et la sûreté nucléaire au sein du ministère de la Défense nationale et de la communauté des Forces armées canadiennes et le grand public. Les événements entourant l'accident à la centrale nucléaire Fukushima au Japon souligne le malentendu gé-

néral de la société au sujet de l'impact d'une exposition potentielle au rayonnement ionisant.

Afin d'aider le personnel du MDN et de la FC à comprendre les risques associés à l'exposition aux rayonnements ionisants, le directeur de la sécurité nucléaire a publié un cours de sensibilisation en ligne sur la

sûreté radiologique (RSA), cours de sensibilisation de base des rayonnements ionisants, introduisant les types de pratiques du MDN et de la FC qui utilisent les rayonnements ionisants. Ce cours explique le rôle des officiers de la radioprotection du ministère pour aider à gérer l'ensemble du programme de sûreté nucléaire.

Le cours de sensibilisation à la sûreté radiologique (RSA) est accessible par l'entremise du Réseau d'apprentissage de la Défense et est ouvert à tous les membres du MDN et au personnel de la FC (vous aurez besoin d'environ une à deux heures pour le compléter). ## Online course offers radiation safety awareness

Several misconceptions exist about ionizing radiation and nuclear safety within the Department of National Defence and Canadian Armed Forces community, and the general public. Events surrounding the Fukushima nuclear power plant accident in Japan highlight society's general misunderstanding of the impact of potential exposure to ionizing radiation.

To assist DND and CAF personnel in understanding

the risks associated with exposure to ionizing radiation, Director Nuclear Safety has released an online Radiation Safety Awareness (RSA) course to generate basic awareness of ionizing radiation, introduce the types of practices in DND and the CAF that use ionizing radiation and explain the role of departmental radiation safety officers in helping to manage the overall nuclear safety program.

The RSA course is accessible via the Defence Learning Network and is open to all DND and CAF personnel (it takes about one to two hours to complete). If you have any questions or concerns with regards to radiation safety, contact your unit radiation safety officer or Wing Radia-

tion Safety Officer Sergeant Greg Smith, 902-765-1494 local 5007. # African Heritage Month celebrates No. 2 Construction Battalion

Nova Scotia's No. 2 Construction Battalion, the only predominantly African-Canadian battalion since Confederation, is this year's centrepiece for African Heritage Month. Lieutenant-Governor J.J. Grant, Premier Stephen McNeil and African Nova Scotian Affairs Minister Tony Ince joined guests from across the province at Province House January 27 to launch African Heritage Month 2016 in Nova Scotia. The theme is No. 2 Construction Battalion: the Legacy of Commitment - They Fought to Fight.

The No. 2 Construction Battalion, also known as the Black Battalion, was created after the British Empire renewed its call for soldiers during the First World War. A separate battalion was the military's response to black men who wanted to enlist, but were turned away from recruiting offices. "Despite the great prejudice that they faced, the brave men of the No. 2 Construction Battalion voluntarily stepped up to fight for king and country," said Grant. "Their courage and legacy continue to inspire 100 years later, and it is vital that all Nova Scotians know this history."

"African Heritage Month is a celebration of culture, history, longevity and progress," said McNeil. "This year's theme of overcoming adversity to participate in the broader society resonates in all communities, but African Nova Scotians know it well."

The battalion formed July 5, 1916 in Pictou. Most of the more than 600 men accepted came from Nova Scotia, but others came from New Brunswick, Ontario, the West, the United States and the Caribbean.

"We are proud to help promote and preserve the legacy of the battalion," said Russell Grosse, executive director of the Black Cultural Centre of Nova Scotia. "They are a symbol of commitment in the face of adversity for all Nova Scotians."

AFRICAN HERITAGE MONTH 2016  
LEGACY OF COMMITMENT

When the First World War broke out in 1914, African Nova Scotians responded patriotically. The men of the community wanted to volunteer to serve overseas yet most were rejected. Recruiters told them things like: "this is a white man's war" and Canada didn't want a "checkerboard army."

The majority of Black men who wanted to serve in the military were told there was only one way: they had to form an entire segregated battalion. Black men from Nova Scotia, the rest of Canada, the United States, and the British West Indies formed the No. 2 Construction Battalion, C.I.F. with the largest contingent coming from Nova Scotia. In March, 1917, they went overseas to support the front lines on the Western Front

In Europe. They assisted in forestry, dug trenches, built railroads, repaired roads, and laid barbed wire. The Battalion disbanded in 1920. This year during African Heritage Month, we commemorate the 100th Anniversary of the Battalion and honour the Legacy of Commitment that was demonstrated.

2015-2024 is the United Nations International Decade for People of African Descent, in which we honor those such as the No. 2 Construction Battalion, who blazed the trail, as a demonstration of the contributions people of African descent have made in society.

to Africa, then on to London, where she bears witness to the injustices of slavery. It is a story no listener - and no reader - will ever forget. The reading group guide is included.

"Under The Story Tree" takes place every Tuesday from 10:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. in the library. It's a great time to bring your youngsters to listen to stories, sing songs and make crafts.

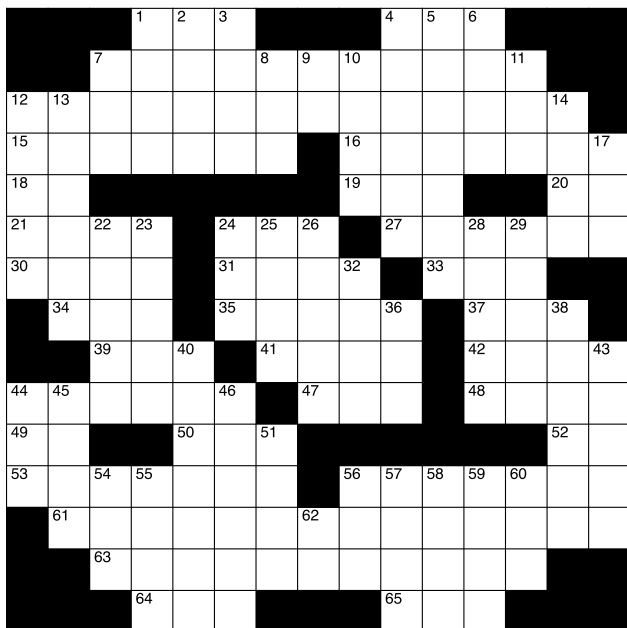

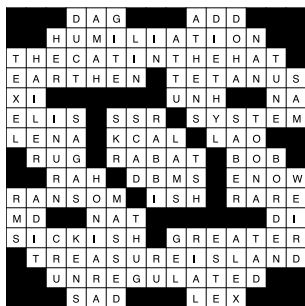

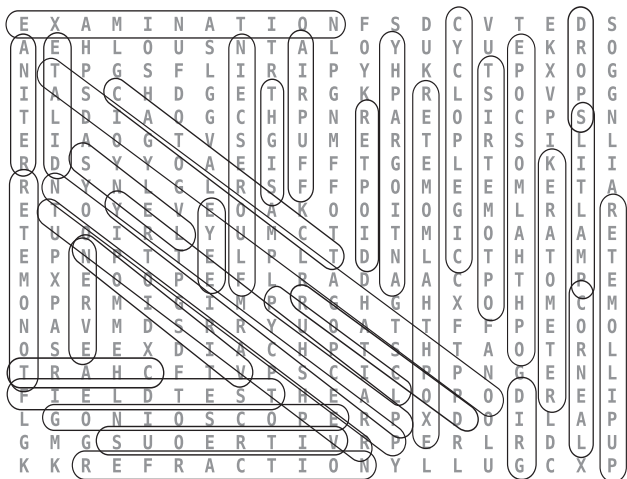
