## Musts, needs Base infrastructure work puts money into priorities

Infrastructure spending at 14 Wing Greenwood is obvious this summer, right from the main gate of the base.

Over \$45 million in work plans are underway, including paving, fire system upgrades, new construction and, the single big-ticket item: a \$13.9 million air traffic control tower being built from the ground up over the next two years.

"We have a team of six, and we have about 60 projects this season – it's nice to be busy," says Rick Nippard, engineering officer, Real Property Detachment (Greenwood).

"The goal is to maintain the infrastructure of the wing and put money where the need is. We prioritize – we sit down with sections and branches and commanding officers, we look at every project and

we make a plan – then we get our marching orders."

The main gate guard hut was torn down in July, and will be replaced by the end of November with a \$400,000 structure, similar to what was built two years ago at Checkpoint Charlie, the operations side of the base's gate.

"It's a small structure, but there are certain security requirements, the gate and fencing will be moved to the west, communications lines will be run and, when you think you have people in there 24/7 with no washroom, air conditioning or other facilities; it needs to be done."

There's a \$3 million paving budget this season: 2.5 kilometres around the north side of the airfield; two kilometres along the route to Checkpoint Charlie, the parking lots of the 14 Wing Greenwood Community Centre, Church Street, one facing 26 Canadian Forces Health

Services, partial lot repavement between hangars seven and eight and the Emergency Generator Systems building; and in-filling of a taxiway between two runways to enable full-size aircraft to manoeuvre around the airfield more easily.

The new air traffic control tower will be built to the southeast of Hangar 11 as a freestanding structure: not like the 1950s-addition to the hangar's rooftop. It will be nine stories tall, with work space for garages, offices, mechanical and electrical rooms.

"It's very expensive – but it's a must," Nippard says. "Over the years, we've done so much to make the air traffic folks happy – I would say it's probably the single most important building on the wing: it actually controls the aircraft and the airfield; but it's at a point it needs to be replaced. It's been a 10-year

process, back and forth, to get to this point.”

Pomerleau won the contract for the ATC tower and will start this fall on a hole and potentially footings. Getting 200 to 300 contractors cleared through military security is the immediate challenge, but Nippard says the tower should be complete by the spring or summer of 2018. As for the old one, “it’s on girders and can almost be craned right off the top of Hangar 11.

Atlantic Roofing will replace Hangar 11’s roof before

the end of March, a \$2.4 million contract. Work will have to be finished in 2018, once the old ATC is removed.

Hangar 10 will see a new paint booth for aircraft technicians, as they maintain various parts. Mid-Valley Construction will build the \$500,000 structure. Maintenance work will also be done to upgrade this building’s freight elevator.

Fire systems are also on the radar: \$700,000 will replace six pumps providing fire coverage to hangars 11 and 14, and the fire alarm in Hangar 14 is getting a \$500,000 upgrade.

A review is underway now of three bids for a comprehensive energy performance contract, announced earlier in the year. The successful contractor will look at 14 Wing buildings for potential energy savings, do the upgrades; the base will see long-term energy savings and benefit from more energy-efficient buildings. Nippard says the last EPC was 10-15 years ago, so it’s time to take a more current look at 14 Wing’s greenhouse gas emissions and environmental footprint. The contract should be awarded by the end of October.

The Explosive Disposal Flight will move into a new, \$600,000 structure and the Explosive Storage Area into a \$650,000 building by the spring of 2017.

Storage is also on the horizon for search and rescue equipment to the northwest of Hangar 14 (clearing hangar floor space for aircraft access), a project worth \$800,000; and for search and rescue aircraft engine parts on the north side of the hangar, a \$400,000 build.

Hangar 11 will see floor repainting, Hangar 13 will see siding work and the doors on Hangar 9’s east side will be

replaced. The Refuelling area will extend its roof to cover trucks and tenders as they use the area.

On the domestic side of the base, new water pumps are being installed in Building 125, in the Residential Housing Units neighbourhood, to serve the domestic side of 14 Wing’s structures. (The RHUs themselves are serviced municipally.) The Fitness & Sports Centre and Checkpoint Charlie will both see new auxiliary power units, and the Annapolis Valley Regional Air Park’s airfield remote-controlled gate is ready to be activated.

Accommodations in Building 33 will see \$500,000 in interior work, including flooring, fixtures and paint. There was debate on whether or not to invest this money, but Nippard says there are rooms there for about 100 people, and the improvements will make the space more modern – and still useable.

Nippard understands this level of construction around the wing is “a headache” – for wing personnel, contractors, security and his own section staff – but “the long-term is, you get a road, good upgrades and money going where it should.”

# 14 Wing firefighters challenge FireFit

It's called the toughest two minutes in sport.

FireFit, an international event featured on TSN, produces some of the fittest competitors in the firefighter trade; tapping into firefighters' mental and physical toughness. Competitors face a torturous event that leaves them feeling dazed and confused, legs flooded with lactic acid, lungs burning and a lingering metallic taste in the mouth.

Firefighters from across the Maritimes gathered in Summerside July 30 and 31 to compete in the 2016 regional championships, including eight members of 14 Wing Greenwood's Fire and Emergency Services. Aviators Cody Saulis, Marshall Logan, Jen Cousintine,

Nicole Hornsby and Jordan Haughton and corporals Gabriel Hould, Mark Amos and Vince de Boer depended upon months of training and strong team bonds as they went head-to-head against some of the nation's fastest and toughest competitors in the sport. The event consists of six job-related tasks, including a six-storey ascent with a 40-pound high-rise pack over the shoulder, a 45-pound hose hoist, forcible entry, a 140-foot slalom run, a charged hose advance and a 175-pound victim rescue.

With six new members competing in this year's event, 14 Wing's fire department was still able to manage an outstanding total of two gold and three bronze medals in three different events: the women's individual, mixed team

relay and doubles. The men's relay team also deserve a notable mention, as it competed in a thrilling, neck-and-neck race against the long-standing champs from the Fredericton city department.

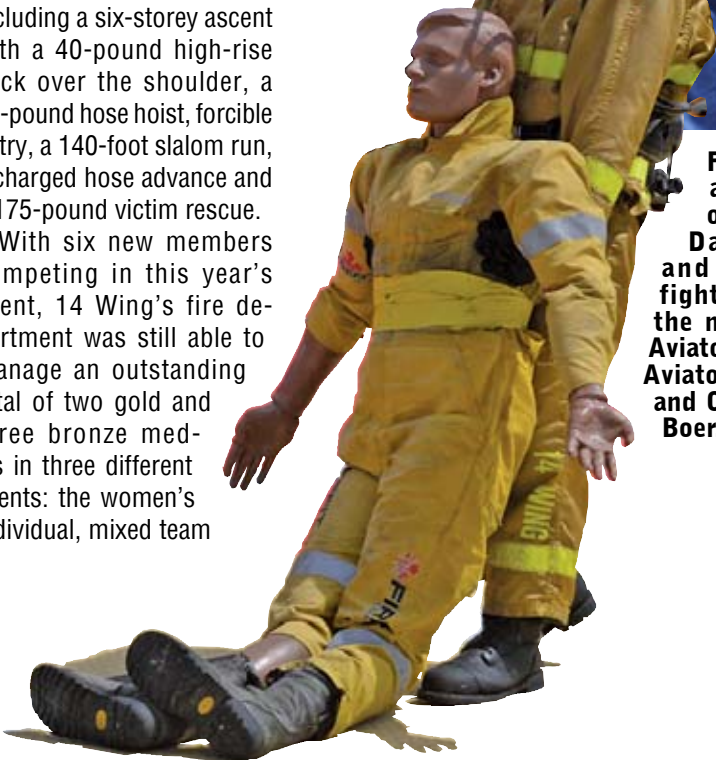

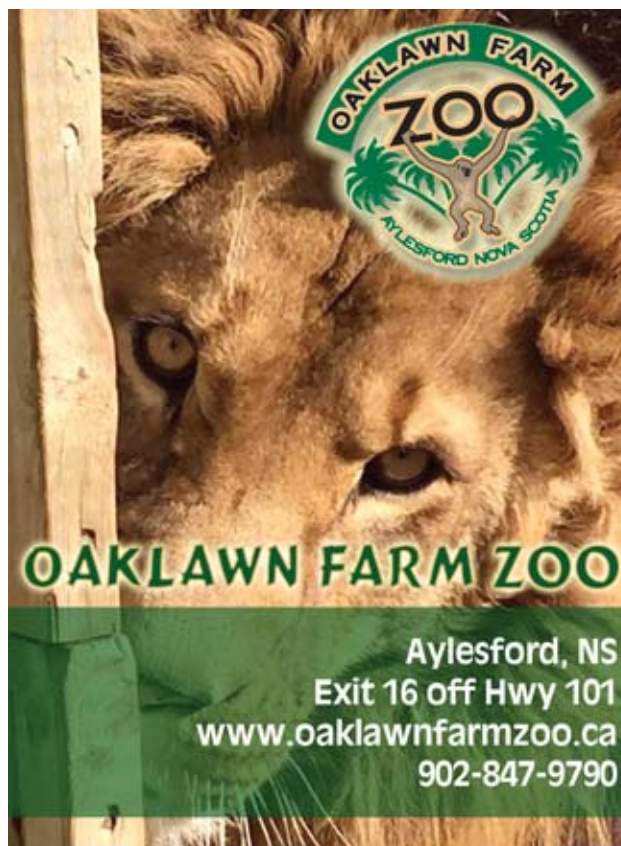

# Gala Days' fun since 1945

The first Berwick “Gala Day” was held September 2, 1945. This event was sponsored by the Berwick Amateur Athletic Association to improve Rainforth Park. The volunteer committee's tireless efforts, along with support from the town's recreation department, have allowed Gala Days to be a must-attend festival for those who live within or near Berwick.

All funds raised at the weekend's events go back to support youth activities in Berwick and surrounding areas.

# Memorial (Silver) Cross donated to museum

The Greenwood Military Aviation Museum highlights the professional and operational history of the Royal Canadian Air Force; a recent donation comes with highly personal value.

A Memorial (Silver) Cross medal was presented to the museum, after having been originally presented to Helen Foote of Woodville upon the Second World War death of her husband, Flying Officer Raymond Hamilton Foote, service number J1561.

Raymond was born April 11, 1918 in Woodville to Charles Perry and Susie (Ryan) Foote, attended Horton Academy and became a fruit warehouse foreman before joining the Royal Canadian Air Force in June 1940



in Halifax. Trained as an air observer in Regina, Moncton, Malton and Jarvis, Raymond married Helen Gladys Banks of Kentville April 28, 1941, before proceeding overseas in May 1941. He joined 13 Squadron of the Royal Air Force, flying Army Cooperation missions; later, with 418 Canadian squadron flying Boston aircraft, including the first 1,000 bomber

raid on Essen and Cologne, Germany. After completing 28 missions, Raymond was killed in action while navigating his Boston aircraft over France November 7, 1942. He is buried in Poix-de-Picardie Churchyard in France.

Helen later married another aviator, Roy Loomer, and their daughter, Carol Loomer (Hopkins), joined her father in the presentation to the museum of the Memorial Cross.

The Memorial (Silver) Cross, instituted December 1, 1919 by King George the Fifth, was presented as a memento of personal loss and sacrifices on behalf of all widows and mothers who lost a child while on active duty in the service of their nation or whose death was consequently attributed to

such duty. The Cross was sent automatically to moth-

ers and wives who qualified, and could be worn by the recipients anytime, even though they were not themselves veterans. Engraved on the obverse of the medal is the name, rank and service number of the son or husband.

Recent changes now allow Canadian Armed Forces members to designate up to three Memorial Cross recipients (specific only to the Memorial Cross EIIR).

The Memorial Cross is in

the form of a cross pattee, in silver, suspended by a bar brooch, although, prior to 1945, it was suspended from a light purple ribbon. At the end of the upright is a crown and at the foot and the end of either arm, a maple leaf. In the centre, within a wreath of laurel, is the royal cypher of the reigning monarch: GRI for King (Rex) George the Fifth, GVIR for King George the Sixth and EIIR for Elizabeth the Second Queen (Regina).
