Air Task Force-Iraq's reliable contribution

Air Task Force - Iraq staff

Providing aircraft for operational missions nearly every day for three months straight without fail is no mean task for any Royal Canadian Air Force formation.

That Air Task Force - Iraq (ATF-I) has done so over the course of 143 consecutive missions is a testament to Canada's reliability as a coalition partner. It also highlights the skills and dedication of the ground crew and planners in keeping the aerial refuelling and surveillance aircraft flying

in support of the fight against the Islamic State of Iraq and the Levant (ISIL).

"This is truly a remarkable feat," says Colonel Jason Major, commander of ATF-I. "We have contributed valuable and uninterrupted support to the Coalition at a high tempo in a challenging environment for quite a long stretch. Everybody involved in that success should be very proud of this achievement."

ATF-I maintains a fleet of two CP140M maritime patrol

Canada's 'eyes in the skies' over Iraq get sharper

When CP140 Aurora aircrew flying over Iraq share points of interest with coalition partners, they now have a tool that allows the coalition to engage those points of interest with even greater accuracy.

Members of the Long Range Patrol (LRP) Detachment of the Air Task Force (ATF) say this added accuracy allows coalition aircraft to engage Islamic State of Iraq and the Levant (ISIL) targets more quickly,

more effectively and in a way where safety is optimized for both friendly forces and non-combatants alike.

"We can share highly accurate and timely information regarding points of interest with

our coalition partners," says a member of the LRP Detachment. "It helps keep friendly troops safe while minimizing the possibility of collateral damage, which is something of the greatest concern to the Govern-

ment of Iraq and the coalition." The CP140 Aurora aircraft deployed on Operation Impact have conducted over 500 surveillance missions since October 30, 2014 in support of the global coalition fighting

ISIL. With its array of sensors and skilled aircrew, the LRP Detachment has helped the coalition find, develop and deliberately engage targets which have had a strategic effect on ISIL. CP40s flying over Iraq

aircraft and one CC150T air-to-air refuelling aircraft and fly missions on a nearly daily basis. Add to this tempo the challenges posed by the operational environment. Flying in one of the hottest places on earth and dealing with clouds of blowing sand takes a toll on machines and crew alike. As well, operating with two CP140M aircraft and one CC150T aircraft to support two lines of operation leaves little margin for error.

ATF-I runs a 24/7 maintenance regime for both fleets, which includes both military and civilian personnel. Even with 24/7 maintenance, keeping the aircraft flying required cunning, careful forethought - and a little luck.

"Maintenance days are always busy as we troubleshoot faulty equipment, rob parts from one aircraft to service another and carefully follow the approved maintenance plan before deferring a defect," says one ATF-I staff officer. "The technicians' dedication and the work they carry out during maintenance days ensure airworthy serviceable aircraft on time for every mission."

Technicians and other sup-

port staff often have to work long hours in temperatures that frequently climb over 50 degrees Celsius. Major applauds the dedication and the operational focus of the ground crew.

"These men and women personify the RCAF's original motto of 'Per ardua ad astra' - 'through adversity to the stars'," he says. "They faced numerous challenges and overcame them through perseverance and ingenuity."

Such mission success is not possible without support from home, either.

"There were numerous times where fast communication with home units was critical in ensuring necessary parts were loaded onto service flights," says the ATF-I staff officer.

During the 143 consecutive missions, the CC150 remained 100 per cent serviceable, meeting all missions. The CP140 fleet kept a steady serviceability rate of 72 per cent: on any given mission day, at least one aircraft was able to fly the assigned mission.

The ATF-I operations have resulted in over 29,400,000 pounds of fuel transferred to coalition aircraft, and over 538 reconnaissance missions conducted over Iraq since ATF-I deployed to the Middle East in October 2014.

RCAF participates in Alaskan SAR exercise

Personnel from Royal Canadian Air Force (RCAF) squadrons participated in Arctic Chinook, a significant search and rescue (SAR) exercise taking place in the vicinity of Nome, Alaska, August 22 to 25.

The exercise was led by the U.S. Coast Guard and Alaska Command, and the exercise was open to Arctic Council nations. Participants exercised various elements of the "Agreement on Cooperation on Aeronautical and Maritime Search and Rescue in the Arctic," including interoperability, cooperation and information sharing of SAR services as they respond to a mass rescue operation scenario in the Arctic.

RCAF participation in the exercise included a CC130H Hercules aircraft from 413 (Transport and Rescue) Squadron, 14 Wing Greenwood; a CH149 Cormorant helicopter from 442 (Transport and Rescue) Squadron, 19 Wing Comox; and search and rescue technicians (SAR-Techs) from 435 (Transport and Rescue) Squadron, 17 Wing Winnipeg; as well as additional support personnel.

have also found targets on the battlefield for other coalition aircraft to strike in order to provide air support to Iraqi security forces – a process called “dynamic targeting.”

Up until now, making sure everyone was looking at the same thing the aircrew had identified took time, skill and intense coordination. One air-

crew likened it to looking at the ground through a straw and trying to guide other coalition assets towards the target, who themselves were looking at the ground through their own straws.

“It was more difficult because you had to provide qualitative information to get people onto what you were looking at,” says a member of the ATF headquarters. “You really had to ‘talk’ people onto the target in cities because so many buildings look alike.”

Enter the Precision Strike Suite – Special Operations Forces (PSS-SOF) software. PSS-SOF is already in use by the Royal Canadian Artillery among its Joint Terminal Attack

Controllers to guide indirect fire onto targets with significant accuracy. It works with sensory data and provides accurate Global Positioning System coordinates to what the operator sees on the screen. Identified as an urgent requirement by the ATF last January, PSS-SOF was tested, approved, installed and aircrew were trained to operate it in a little over four months. One CP140 aircrew noted how they can do their job more quickly, and with greater confidence.

“What used to take minutes is now a matter of seconds,” he said. “When I give somebody the coordinates of what I’m looking at, I know they will be looking at the same thing. More accurate means safer for friendly forces and civilians – you hit only what you want to hit.”

The CP140 Aurora is historically a maritime surveillance aircraft that worked jointly with the Royal Canadian Navy. While CP140s were used as surveillance platforms over primarily coastal areas of Libya during Operation Mobile in 2011, Operation Impact is the first environment where it has been used in a purely overland surveillance role. The integration of PSS-SOF into the aircraft’s sensory toolbox continues the improvement of overland surveillance capabilities of the

“From a combined arms point of view, having that kind of capability on an airborne surveillance platform is very valuable to Canadian joint operations,” says one of the Royal Canadian Artillery instructors

deployed to Operation Impact to conduct in-theatre training on PSS-SOF. “The more accurate the information provided, the better.”

The integration of the PSS-SOF software is one of a number of new capabilities be-

ing integrated as part of the LRP Roadmap devised for the CP140. Future software and hardware capabilities will be integrated as the aircraft evolves in its overland role and increases its overall mission effectiveness.

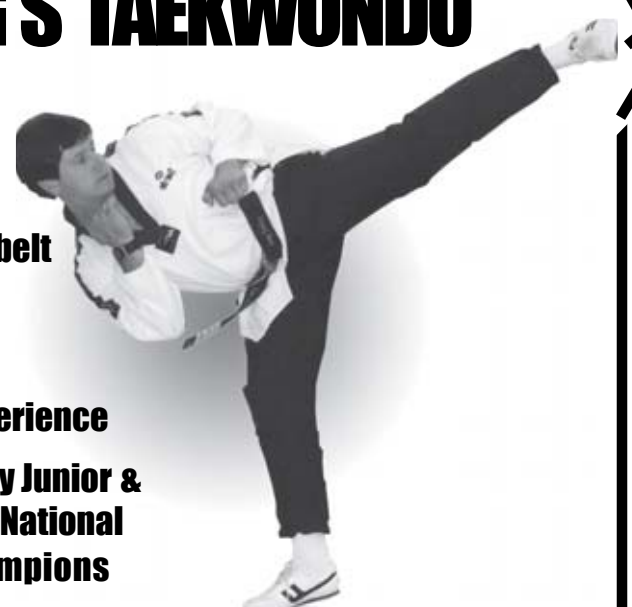

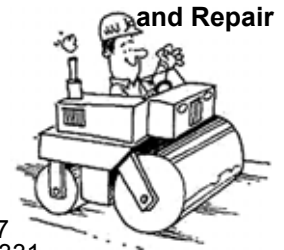

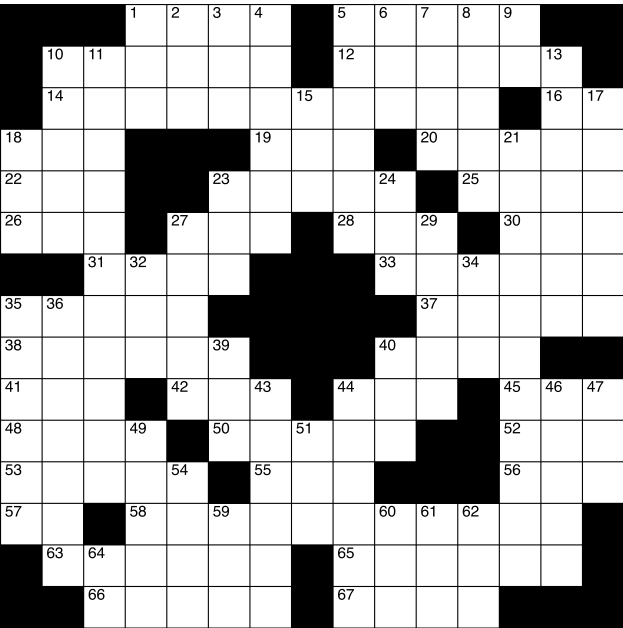

- Respect the privacy of others – avoid flying over private property or taking photos or videos without permission.

Do not fly:

- Closer than 9 km from an airport, heliport, or aerodrome.
- Higher than 90 metres.
- Closer than 150 metres from people, animals, buildings, structures, or vehicles.
- In populated areas near large groups of people – such as beaches, sporting events, outdoor concerts, festivals, or firework shows.
- Near moving vehicles – avoid highways, bridges, busy streets or anywhere you could endanger or distract drivers.
- Within restricted airspace, including near or over military bases, prisons, and forest fires.
- Anywhere you may interfere with first responders.

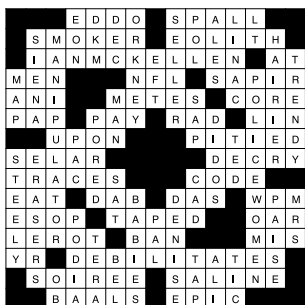

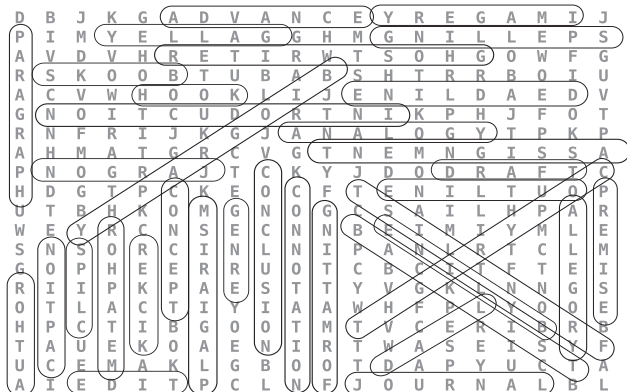
