Kelly recognized by Canadian Disability Hall of Fame

November 4 in Toronto. the Canadian Foundation for Physically Disabled Persons inducted Terry Kelly (Achiever), along with Marni Abbott-Peter (Athlete) and Tim Frick (Builder) into the Canadian Disability Hall of Fame.

The Hall of Fame provides permanent recognition of outstanding Canadians who have made extraordinary contributions to enriching the quality of life for people with physical disabilities. Founded by the CFPDP, this public exhibit was officially opened in 1994. Nominations to the Hall of Fame come from sources across Canada: community groups, private citizens, associations and organizations of and for people with physical disabilities. Nominees are chosen each year by the Hall of Fame's selection board in the category of Builder, Achiever or Athlete.
