then as well. Upholding your legacy is something we continue to do to this day: we have people deployed now from the wing, coordinating operations on a daily basis to combat tyranny - as you did so many years ago.

"Consider the staggering achievements of your past. We're flying a mission a day, now at 750-plus in two-and-a-half years we've been fighting Daesh in Iraq. In the Second World War, Bomber Command flew over 350,000 missions, mostly at night, about half by Lancasters. Of the 55,000 crew killed, 9,800 were Canadian."

Thauberger said having the Lancaster "living legends" sign their plaque is a unique chance to say "I was here.

"These heroes were not just statistics: they were people. There were real risks and real fears. They triumphed and pulled it off."

Colonel (retired) Brian Handley, president of the museum, commended Lancaster restoration leader Dave Saulnier and his vol-






