## Opening opportunity for all within CAF

Showcasing opportunity – and openness – at 14 Wing Greenwood was the aim of a coordinated visits day November 21, with guests invited onto the base from a number of organizations representing visible minorities.

Wing Commander Mike Adamson greeted guests at headquarters, inviting them to ask lots of questions about the base's role and wider mission.

"Take advantage of everything you see, and educate

yourselves on what we do as a wing, and our people," Adamson said. "The Canadian Armed Forces is looking to be more representative of Canadian society, and this is a great opportunity to showcase our work and our jobs and make those connections.

Representatives from Women in Aerospace – Maritimes, the Confederacy of Mainland Mi'kmaq, the Chinese Culture and Art Club of Nova Scotia, the MUTCHO Cultural Group, the Black Business Initiative, Dalhousie University and the Filipino

community all took part in the day's tour, which started out with a visit to the operational side of the base and a familiarization flight aboard a CP140 Aurora aircraft. 14 Air Maintenance Squadron Commanding Officer Lieutenant-Colonel Amy Tsai-Lamoureux, the wing's champion for employment equity programs around visible minorities, hosted lunch at the Annapolis Mess. The afternoon included a hands-on experience at the 404 (Long Range Patrol and Training) Squadron flight simulator.

## Aurora, crews home Saturday from Op Impact

Air crew and families reunite Saturday, as the first of the last deployed Operation Impact Aurora aircraft personnel return to 14 Wing Greenwood December 16.

The aircraft and its crew

are expected late in the afternoon, and plans are in place to welcome them home and mark the end of over three years' deployed service. 14 Wing Greenwood Commander Colonel Mike Adamson, with the base's command team, personnel and family members; along with Major-General

Christian Drouin, commander, 1 Canadian Air Division; and Major-General Bill Seymour, chief of staff, Operations, Canadian Joint Operations Centre Headquarters; will all be waiting in the base's Air Movement Unit in Hangar 7.

Families will greet their returning aviators, Drouin, Sey-

mour and Adamson will make brief comments; and customs and administration will be taken care of before everyone can go home. Ground crews will transport the Aurora across the airfield to its regular home.

Airfield technicians and support crews will continue to return to Greenwood from

Operation Impact into next week, with all expected to be home by Christmas.

14 Wing Greenwood CP140 personnel have maintained a presence on Operation Impact since Canada joined the international coalition against Daesh in the Middle East in October 2014. The Aurora has

flown over 7,500 hours in theatre, providing reconnaissance and surveillance information to coalition forces. At almost any given time, approximately 80 14 Wing personnel have been deployed, some repeating three- and six-month postings multiple times over the length of the operation.

# Maritime training ensures ready response

November 20, CH149 Cor-

morant crews from 413 (Transport and Rescue) Squadron, based out of 14 Wing Greenwood, made their way to Prince Edward Island to take part in a maritime extraction exercise, colloquially termed “Boat Camp.” This intense week of training saw rescue teams working with numerous marine vessels all hours of the day and night, practicing life-saving

protocols in a variety of real-world situations. Particular focus was paid to the transfer of people and equipment between the helicopters and the vessels themselves, which included Canadian Coast Guard ships, fishing boats and zodiacs. During this unique exercise, the crews continued to maintain a regular search and rescue (SAR) posture, meaning they were ready and available to respond to emergencies in the region as tasked at any given time. Consistency in training is often noted as a key element in developing and maintaining skills, and the SAR environment is no different. Crews train frequently to uphold a high level of readiness, which allows for quick and competent action in life-threatening situations. Over 65 per cent of SAR missions executed in 2017 by 413 Squadron were classified as maritime emergencies; with a motto of “Ad Vigilamus Undis” (“We watch the waves”), the importance of this kind of training is clearly evident. Such exercises also provide the squadron with an opportunity to connect with local communities in the training area, fostering an environment of mutual respect, trust and camaraderie. One such highlight was a visit with Cadets of Holland College’s firefighting program in Summerside. The Cadets were treated to a tour of the CH149 Cormorant helicopter and spoke with 413 Squadron members about the aircraft, the SAR community and military life in general. Weather conditions, long hours and multiple taskings resulted in a demanding yet rewarding training experience. The benefits to those who took part are considerable, and 14 Wing’s SAR crews look forward to integrating more maritime exercises into their regular training regime.

## Hunter found by SAR crew

December 2, the Halifax Joint Rescue Coordination Centre dispatched a 413 (Transport and Rescue) Squadron Cormorant helicopter to assist in the search for a missing hunter on Anticosti Island. The crew left 14 Wing Greenwood just after 3 p.m. and, upon arrival in the search area, successfully located the 60-year-old man and returned him to his camp. They returned to 14 Wing around 8:30 p.m.

# The changing face of UN peacekeeping

Recently, I had the privilege to be tasked as a liaison officer during the United Nations Peacekeeping Defence Ministerial Conference (UN-PKDM), held in Vancouver November 10 through 17. I was told I would be “the face of Canadian hospitality” for delegation members attending the event.

I was not sure what to expect, as this was outside the realm of what I typically do as an aerospace controller (AEC) at 14 Wing Greenwood: would I be get-

ting coffee for high-ranking officials and carrying their briefcases? The opportunity ended up being the highlight, to date, of my career in the Royal Canadian Air Force.

As a liaison officer, I worked with the South African delegation, composed of the chief of the South African Army, Lieutenant-General Lindile Yam; his aide, Brigadier-General Mnimimzi Sizani; Brigadier-General Talita Mxakato, the Director of Foreign Relations; and Major Seitebatso Pearl Block. In addition to ensuring the senior officers were where they needed to be, I was responsible for arranging

meetings with delegations from other countries and UN officials, handling requests for media interviews and confirming the endorsement of the Vancouver Principles (aimed at preventing the use of child soldiers).

I was able to observe keynote speaker, Angelina Jolie, the United Nations’ High Commissioner for Refugees. She gave a very compelling speech about the harsh

realities many refugees face every day. As a Canadian, it is shocking to learn of the atrocities many people experience. UN peacekeeping aims to improve the lives of people in areas of the world experiencing crisis. Many countries recognize the need for the UN, including Canada, and, over the course of the conference, delegations made pledges that included personnel, equipment and training in support of future peacekeeping missions.

The four themes of the conference included smart pledges, innovation in training and capacity building, protecting those at risk and early warning and rapid deployment. Also discussed were the importance of empowering women and the role we play in improving the effectiveness of UN peacekeeping. There is a push to increase the rates of female participation in UN peacekeeping: the presence of women reduces the risk of sexual exploitation and abuse by UN peacekeepers, and members of the community are more likely to report incidents of sexual exploitation and abuse to females.

A member of the South African delegation, Block, was named this year’s “United Nations Military Gender Ad-

vocate of the Year.” While deployed on the United Nations Organization Mission in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (MONUSCO), Block worked toward the protection of civilians. She described an initiative using cellphones to distribute and receive information and reports from civilians via SMS. She said, even if people had no food, shelter or clothing; the majority had cellphones. It was inspiring to learn how one person can give a voice

to so many, people who may otherwise go unheard.

Attending the conference was an eye-opening experience, and I learned much about what goes on around the world. It is truly moving to see so many countries and organizations recognize the need for action, and come together to facilitate positive changes. As a result of this outstanding experience, I now have a career goal to be deployed on a UN peacekeeping mission.

## Making it all taste good

**Richard Berthiaume, Valley Brewtique, Kingston**

We could go on for days with pairings between beer, wine and food: the list is endless. Here, we'll give some basic background and pairings that can be enjoyed everyday.

The flavours of foods and wine and beer have grown up together for centuries. The

idea with pairing is "an echo:" notes in one sip can accent flavours in past or future bites. The opposite approach suggests contrasting flavours are pleasing in a complimentary way, like sweet and salty (perfect together!). We must also remember dominant flavours can come from protein like beef, cream sauces or preparation (grilling, for example).

Winemakers have generally one ingredient to play with: grapes; two, counting barrel-aging. Beermakers have multiple options. Beer may even be considered more food-friendly than wine, especially when you're experimenting with grains, hops, spices and fruits that react amazingly with flavours. Hops in beer can function like wine

acids when pairing: both cut through fattiness or oiliness, and even saltiness, in foods. Ales (considered like red wine) are generally fruity or robust; lagers (considered like white wine) are crisp and delicate.

Here are some pairings that go well together:

**Beer**

Ales - beef, poultry, cheese, spicy foods

Lagers - fish, poultry, pasta, spice

Pils - fish, cheese, spice  
Stouts - beef, salty/ spicy foods

**Red wines**

Full bodied - best with red/ cured meat and hard cheese  
Medium - white/ red meat, cheese, vegetables  
Light - fish, white/ cured

meat, vegetables

**White wines**

Dry - fish, vegetables  
Medium- cheese, bread, fish, white meats  
Light - cheese, cured meat, desserts

Ask at your brew shop which wine or beer is right for your taste. Cheers, and happy brewing!

# Aurora crews return from Op Impact

Aircraft, crew home in Greenwood December 16; support personnel by Christmas

## On the time line

Operation Impact is the Canadian Armed Forces' (CAF) support to the global coalition against Daesh in Iraq and Syria. A maximum number of about 850 CAF members are approved to serve, includes those assigned to the train, advise and assist mission in support of the Iraqi security forces.

The United States president authorized targeted military intervention in August 2014. Canada joined the United States-led coalition shortly afterwards, and the CAF mission time line now includes four extensions through to March 31, 2019.

Joint Task Force-Iraq includes the CAF air component. Air Task Force-Iraq gathers information and is responsible for collecting, synthesizing and analyzing intelligence for operational planning, protecting coalition forces and determining how to conduct coalition operations. This includes one CC150 Polaris aerial refueller, one CP140 Aurora surveillance aircraft, one CC130J Hercules tactical airlift aircraft and a tactical aviation detachment with up to four CH146 Griffon helicopters. A variety of self-defence weapons are fitted to the aircraft.

Daesh formed in Iraq in October 2004. The group has also been known as the Islamic State of Iraq and Syria, the Islamic State and the Islamic State of Iraq and the Levant. Daesh advocates radical interpretations of Islam. It also claims religious authority over all Muslims. It aims to create a caliphate in the Levant region; its ultimate objective is to establish a world-wide Islamic caliphate.

The coalition has been effective: Daesh is on the defensive and is losing control of the territory it once held. In July, Iraqi security forces supported by the coalition retook Mosul, the last major centre of Daesh control in Iraq. As of December 16, the CP140 and its support crews will be home in Canada.

## Forever

*Communication is not always as clear, concise and simple as we sometimes wish it was . . .*

"I remember one night returning to our operating base," relates an Aurora crew member about one mission flight.

"We were told by air traffic control to turn right to join a left downwind for RW30R. My captain at the time didn't quite understand these instructions, and asked ATC to "say again."

ATC mumbled something unintelligible. The captain asked once more for ATC to "say again."

ATC came back shouting our call sign with the instruction, "stop talking!" The captain replied, "say again."

ATC yelled, "stop talking!" The captain replied, "for how long?"

ATC replied, "forever!"



## Centurion club

*Milestones and metrics are a mainstay of any military operation . . .*

During the Second World War, air forces kept track of missions flown by each crew member and, depending on the theatre, after reaching a number, aircrew would be rotated home. Some volunteered again; others were "voluntold" to extend, with the end result being some aircrew flew more than the minimum number of missions. Those who completed 100 missions over hostile territory were inducted into a Centurion Club.

During Op Impact Roto 3, the first aircrew member flew his 100th mission April 21, 2017, commemorated with the presentation of a Centurion Club certificate based on those created during the Second World War, modified to reflect the realities of Op Impact.

The long range patrol detachment commander at the time commented the RCAF needed a way to record the fact members were now completing 100 missions in theatre, and have that commemoration displayed for future LRP aircrew to view. A plaque was made by an LRP Standards and Evaluation Team tactical navigator, who donated his time and the material, and the name plates and header plate were sponsored by the Greenwood Wing of VPI - as will future Centurion Club inductees' name plates.

It is hoped this new tradition extends beyond Op Impact. Whenever the LRP force is involved in an enduring operation, whomever completes the in-theatre mission milestone will be able to display a certificate of accomplishment and see their names recorded as members of the LRP Centurion Club.

## Aircraft sorties

As of December 2, Air Task Force-Iraq has flown **3,427 sorties\***:

- CP140 Aurora aircraft flew **877 sorties**
- **Over 7,500 flying hours**
- **More than 1,150 days in theatre**
- **More than 6,000 points of interest surveyed**
- CC150T Polaris aerial refueller flew **890 sorties** and delivered nearly **52,800,000 pounds of fuel**
- CC130J Hercules aircraft flew **282 sorties** and delivered some **1,701,700 pounds of cargo**

\*This total includes 1,378 sorties flown by CF18 Hornets between October 30, 2014 and February 15, 2016.

## The power of the cookie

*Lieutenant-Colonel Bruno Baker reminds us there is still something called soft power, and it can be achieved through a judicious use of cookies...*

"We were there six months, flying a mission a day over Iraq with two aircraft and two aircrews, doing maintenance around the clock," said Baker, the Roto 3 long range patrol detachment commander from April to October 2016. "The Americans fly the P3, the same aircraft as our Auroras, and they bring a lot more of the equipment we use – and that means a lot of favours."

Classic maple leaf cookies sent in care packages from Canada are regularly swapped, turn into preferred parking on the airfield, priority fuel line positioning and access to tools and equipment the Canadians may not have had in theatre.

"We used those cookies as currency, all the time, a box at a time," Baker said. "One day, we noticed we were running out!"

With a couple calls home to the Military Family Resource Centres and to Comox and Greenwood community Superstores, more cookies were on their way. Kingston "sent us cases – oh, happy day!"

"They were literally not for us, but they helped us maintain our operations. They saved missions with the tools we were able to borrow. Our roto, we met 100 per cent of the missions we were tasked with, and a big part of that was maintenance. They pulled miracles. Those cookies? They contributed."






