Civic sign project puts base safety first

A splash of blue will be going up on the facades of 173 of 14 Wing Greenwood's buildings.

The 911 civic signs will completely re-organize how emergency personnel identify a location on base, and will tie the addresses into the Nova Scotia 911 phone service in case non-military respondents are activated.

A now-posted member of Wing Telecommunications Flight, Corporal Jordan De-

Long, flagged the project several months ago, and leadership quickly endorsed it. Real Property Operations, which looks after base infrastructure, took the work on as a priority.

"In the past, if there's been an emergency, our commissionaires answer the call and have either the Military Police or the firefighters meet non-military responders at the gates of the base, and escort them where they need to go using base-assigned building numbers," says Cap-

BZ event to mark Op Impact success, sacrifice

The commitment to Operation Impact by 14 Wing Greenwood's personnel – and their families – will be

recognized February 10 at a homecoming event on the base.

While 14 Wing continues to deploy personnel to support the remaining Op Impact mandates and other

operations around the world, the culmination of the Royal Canadian Air Force's long range patrol surveillance and reconnaissance effort in December 2017 marks the end of one of the most

significant military missions supported by 14 Wing in the past 50 years.

The pace set in 2014, when the first LRP crews were out the door on just a few weeks' notice as part

of Canada's commitment to the international coalition to defeat Daesh, was astounding. Thirty-nine months of training, briefings, logistics and administrative support to deploy rotating maintenance

and flying crews are over.

"A major wing event, recognizing the 14 Wing and LRP detachment successes that were demonstrated at home and in the Op Impact joint operation from October

Legions’ lynch pins recognized with Canada 150 mementoes

Through November and December, West Nova Member of Parliament Colin Fraser visited Royal Canadian Legion branches throughout his riding, in Kings, Annapolis, Digby and Yarmouth counties; bringing special thanks from the Government of Canada to a group of special people.

A set of Canada 150 pins was provided to each MP across the country to recognize the work of community leaders and volunteers. The pins contain copper material from the roof of the West Block on Parliament Hill, removed during recent renovations.

Individual MPs determined the criteria for eventual recipients in

tain Andrew Peddle, RP OP’s requirements officer. “But, we do have cellphone calls getting picked up by different phone systems – maybe not the base’s, and that could mean compromised patient care if there’s a delay.”

The 911 civic addressing and signage was seen as a “no brainer,” Peddle says, quickly championed at all levels to improve safety, response times and directions

on base property.

By adding the civic addresses, too, it means 14 Wing’s buildings have been added to the provincial civic addressing map. Surveyors visited the initial 173 base buildings, took the GPS coordinates and ensured they’re now all included in the maps emergency responders have access to as they handle calls and routing.

“The provincial ambulance system is activated by GPS, so they go right to a civic

address,” says Captain James Gannon, Construction Engineering operations officer. “Our phone systems now will alert 911 with a civic address on base.”

Non-military responders will now be able to find their way directly to 14 Wing locations on the public side of the base; access to addresses on the secure, operational airfield will continue to depend upon military escorts.

The signs themselves are oversize versions of the community 911 signs in use around the province - the blue signs with reflective numbering, but on a 10-inch tall sign with eight-inch numbering.

RP OP’s carpentry shop is now working on getting the signs up, focused on buildings on the domestic side of the base and then the operational zone. The goal is to have them all up by the end of March, and then take another look at the building inventory that remains to be signed and GPS-located.

Better indications coming you’re on Pathfinder Drive

As part of the civic signage and address project, a section of Ward Road, from the Central Avenue intersection to the Ad Astra Way intersection; will be completely renamed Pathfinder Drive.

A short distance of this street is already named Pathfinder Drive, but only on the base itself, from the Administration Drive intersection near wing headquarters to Ad Astra – but with no clear, name-changing identifiers.

New signs will be up in about two months; the street name change and corresponding civic numbering will affect limited base-owned housing and public use addresses.

home to their families and friends.”

Leading the BZ Mega event is organizer Bill Brown, the senior operational mission simulator officer at 404 (Long Range Patrol and Training) Squadron. Having helped train crews through 18 deployment serials during the Op Impact effort, he is aware of just how extensive the wing’s effort has been to

support the mission.

“From that Thanksgiving weekend in 2014, when we were sending those first personnel off: their families were supporting them, Wing foods and transport... everyone was working extra hours, and that surge became normal, with no end date until just a month ago,” Brown says. “This event will truly acknowledge the efforts of the whole wing, here and internationally. Everyone returned safely, and people

should feel their contributions are recognized – at all levels.”

A team of volunteers is organizing a day-long event, starting with lunch and family activities at the Annapolis Mess and several base recreational venues. In the evening, Adamson will host special guests, personnel and families with a number of activities to thank all for effort and sacrifice from what 14 Wing always refers to as the “Defence Team.”

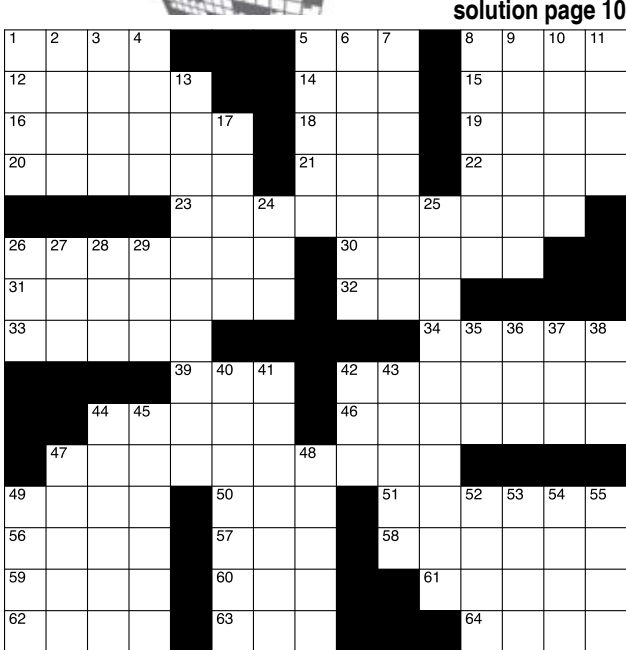

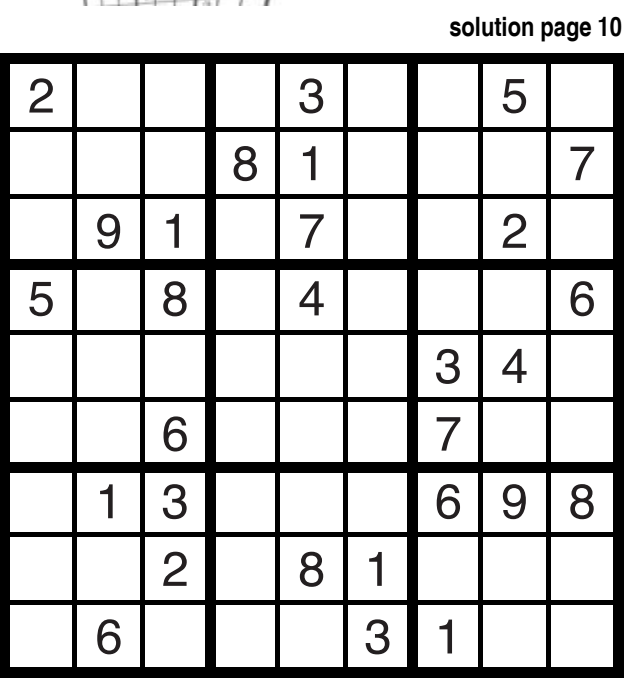
