Transition Group stands up member-focussed suite of career, life supports

Introducing the guest speaker at a March 1 briefing on the Canadian Armed Forces' new Transition Group. 14 Wing Greenwood Deputy Wing Commander Bruno Baker urged the crowd to pay attention: "this all about you change, but a change of what – a tonne of information, and you should take it seriously."

The CAF's Transition Group stood up in December, a national collective of programs and services designed for transitioning military personnel, with special care and family members. Colonel Kevin Cameron, Director

Transition Services & Policy, said he's already heard similar questions about the Transition Group raised in a number of coast-to-coast briefings, "and that's a good thing. It allows us to see what the concerns are, and answer those.

"We are not just a name we are bringing to the table. If 'Strong, Secure, Engaged' (Canada's defence policy) chapter one is all about people, how do we make things better for members and families? This is the mechanism."






