Father, daughter share surprise of service CDs

In what turned out to be a "special moment in life," two generations of Jardines surprised each other at 14 Wing Greenwood July 12.

404 (Long Range Patrol and Training) Squadron Sergeant Amanda Jardine received the Canadian Forces Decoration for 12 years of service at a unit presentation, presided over by Commanding Officer Colonel Ray Townsend – but presented by her father, Chief Warrant Officer Jim Jardine, MMM, CD2.

Wing marks change of command July 30

July 30, 14 Wing Greenwood will hold a change of command ceremony on the base's parade square, underway at 10 a.m.

The outgoing commanding officer, Colonel Mike Adamson, will be replaced by Colonel Brendan Cook, last posted at Greenwood as commanding officer of 405 (Long Range Patrol) Squadron (2014 to 2016). This is not

the first time the men have succeeded one another in command roles: Adamson was the commanding officer of 405 Squadron from 2012 to 2014.

Special guests include The Honourable Arthur J. LeBlanc, Nova Scotia lieutenant-governor; Brigadier-General Iain Huddleston, 1 Canadian Air Division deputy commander; and Major General Bill Seymour, Canadian Joint Operations Command deputy commander. Both Huddleston and Seymour are past 14 Wing Greenwood commanding officers.

The ceremony will include a parade of personnel representing 14 Wing's squadrons, a fly past and the 14 Wing Bands. Guests should be seated by 9:45 a.m. >>
