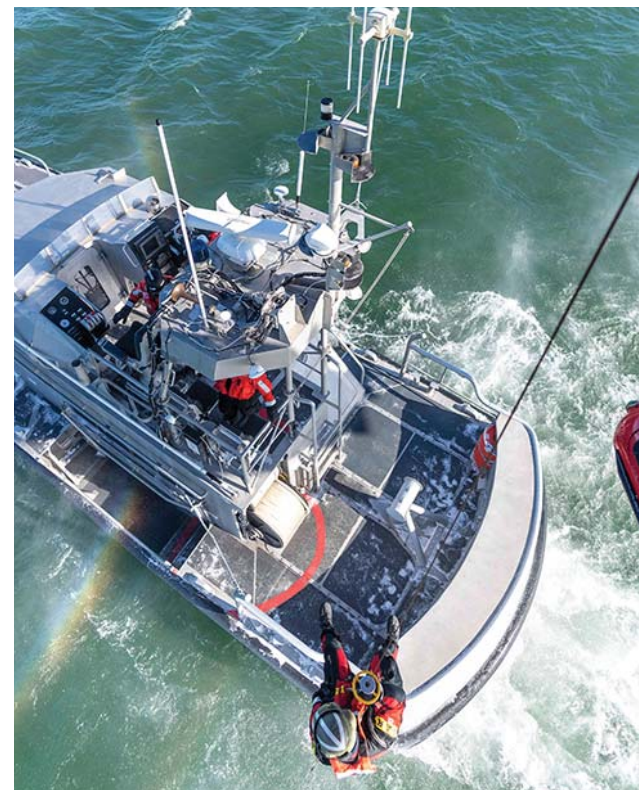

Lowering, lifting: extraction training builds SAR skills

413 (Transport & Rescue) Squadron completed a successful week February 10 to 14 of day and night training in Yarmouth, as three fully capable search and rescue (SAR) crews and two CH149 Cormorant helicopters were deployed to conduct maritime extraction training - or

boat hoisting - from various vessels in Southwest Nova Scotia.

This training is important for the Cormorant crews to maintain their skills, as maritime rescue is a core mandate of the Royal Canadian Air Force SAR system. While 413 Squadron trains throughout the year, having a week dedicated to improving this skill specifically is advantageous. The train-

ing involves lowering and hoisting the helicopter's two SAR-Tech members, as well as any equipment or medical supplies they may need, to and from the helicopter to a vessel. An example where this would be required in a real-life scenario would be when a crew member on board a fishing vessel has a medical emergency, or the vessel itself is in danger and people have to be removed

from it.

Participation from the local community was fantastic during this training, as numerous commercial fishing companies and private fishing vessels participated. Homeports of the vessels involved were primarily Yarmouth, Pubnico, Digby Neck, Shelburne and Cape St-Marys. This area is one of the busiest fishing regions in the Maritimes and presents

some of the most technically challenging offshore missions for SAR crews, so it is important to train with the local community. Canadian Coast Guard Auxiliary vessels and U.S.A Coast Guard also joined in.

Despite marginal weather conditions and rough seas, the week was a huge success: 12 unique vessels participated, and a com-

bined effort of 18 full hoist sequences were completed. The crews noted having a bit of bad weather is actually valuable for training as, more often than not when a real SAR mission happens, the weather is not cooperative.

In the unfortunate event someone requires help from the SAR system, all involved will be better prepared to have a successful outcome. ➔

New scam impersonates RCMP officers, Kings offices

A traditional phone scam involving social insurance numbers and police now has a local focus.

Kings District RCMP wish to warn Kings County residents of a new telephone scam, where police are being impersonated on the phone. Callers are threatening arrest and attempting



to convince the potential victims to provide their social insurance number. A recent file in Kingston had the po-

tential victim receive a call from a person who identified themselves with an officer's name and badge number. The caller then requested the local police number. A short time later, the potential victim received a call that displayed Kingston RCMP's number on call display. The caller then represented himself as a local

RCMP officer. The caller then told the potential victim they were being investigated for a fraud in Montreal.

Residents are reminded fraudsters are creative and use current technology. Modern technology apps can imitate phone numbers on call display. Police encourage the public to be aware the

number in their call display may not be the agency they represent themselves to be. Members of the public are encouraged to contact their nearest detachment to report potential fraud by calling 800-803-RCMP (7267). Fraud may also be reported to the Canadian Anti-Fraud Centre at 888-495-8501. ➔

Greenwood course pairing focuses on conflict resolution

The Conflict and Complaint Management Services is offering two courses to help Defense Team members resolve their conflicts early, locally and informally.

The Resolving Conflict Effectively course (RCE) is a three-day course, April 14 to 16, to introduce a collaborative process of resolving conflicts, based on existing conflicts and COs are to support ADR by ensuring appropriate training to all CF pers; CF PER system: "Part of the PER evaluation criteria within performance objective 'working with others' is ability to use alternative dispute resolution; all are expected to have appropriate conflict resolution skills and to be actively improving their skills in this area;" and DAOD 5046-O: "Alternative dispute resolution is the preferred approach to manage conflict in the workplace. It is generally quicker and leads to more satisfactory outcomes when compared to the traditional formal approaches of grievances, harassment, tribunals, etc."

These courses are open to all military and civilian members of DND and will be held at the Birchall Training Centre. Civilian dress is required for all training. Personnel are free to register for any course within the Atlantic

region. These courses are free; however, any personnel requiring a TD will need to be funded by their home unit.

Fully settled and with a year under its belt, 14 Wing Greenwood's Transition Centre is a hub of services and support.

February 10. Major-General Andrew Downes, commander of the Canadian Forces Health Services Group and surgeon general, with Chief Petty Officer 1st Class Lucie Simpson, visited the base centre and personnel. "We moved in in January 2019 - this was the former Military Police space," said Captain Isabelle Jean as she welcomed the touring group.

"You're lucky to have this space—a good, secure building!" Downes said.

The building was fully renovated to create a meeting room, reception area and offices for the Transition Centre's partners, including Veterans Affairs Canada, Canadian Armed Forces release services, Operational Stress Injury Social Support and more. The focused attention on services for serving, or former CAF personnel, and their family offers a more seamless experience from active duty to post-military life. Special care and attention is provided to those who are ill or injured.

"We do have an issue with space, as we could potentially hire more Reservists and support staff," Jean said, endorsed by 14 Wing Commander Colonel Brendan Cook, who explained some of the discussion underway to consider the wing's infrastructure and its ability to expand the Transition Centre's staff and offerings.

This is such an important part of a military career - to have a good transition," Downes said. "Canadians and CAF Personnel have big expectations. On the medical side of operations, we believe in this and want to support it." ➔

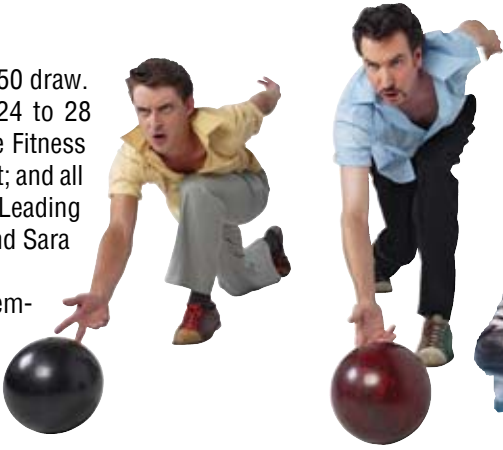

Food for Thought from the Upper Room

In order to keep the area public aware of our activities, the Upper Room Food Bank in Kingston publishes its monthly statistics and activities on a regular basis.

During the month of January, the food bank served 166 families, consisting of 218 adults and 127 children, with 17,678 pounds of product going out and 18,551 pounds coming in. The incoming total includes 2,954 pounds provided by the Feed Nova Scotia network and 1,781 pounds purchased with local cash donations. The remainder is from local donations, which includes food from several local businesses, some of which can now deliver their imperfect products to the food bank they previously had to write off and destroy. Imperfect refers to items that may be safe, but includes dented cans, damaged packaging or items close to "best before" dates that are still fine for consumption, but stores are unable to keep on their shelves.

The Upper Room Food Bank is currently well-stocked from donations received during the Christmas season, but local families are always in need. The food bank quickly goes through non-perishable food items, like canned vegetables, canned fruit, canned stews and soups, as well as Kraft dinner-type pasta mixes. The community's continued support makes a big difference.
