Tiny wee doors, windows and trimmings have been installed on many 14 Wing Greenwood tree trunks, indicating elves have made themselves at home.

The Holoway family knows an *awful* lot about the elf homes, living just steps away from several on trees near their home in the Residential Housing Units' neighbourhood. There's even one in their own backyard – the kids insisted, Margeena Barrett says.

Squadron, and planned to join her a little closer to her due date.

While home, Barrett passed time exploring a network of community trails with the

children.

"We always saw elf houses on the trees – they called them fairy doors, there, but the boys called them elf doors and they'd go up and knock

on them all," Barrett Says. "I thought, 'We could do that.'"

Once the family returned to Greenwood, Holoway cut out 30 wooden door and window sets, and Barrett got painting,

using as many bright colours as she had on hand. The kids worked on their own projects: bird houses. Once they were done, they headed out onto the paths and trails in

the centre of the RHU patch to place the elf doors.

"We hid when we did it, and now, everyone who sees them loves them," Barrett says. ➔

Regional rides smash past MP relay fundraising efforts

The Military Police National Motorcycle Relay, like many other charities, has been adversely affected by the pandemic. In a normal year the world's longest annual motorcycle relay - more than 10,000 kilometres across Canada, from coast to coast; national organizers decided to break the ride down into regions for the 12th annual relay in support of visually-impaired young people to the age of 21 through the Military Police Fund for Blind Children (MPFBC).

Relay riders are Canadian Armed Forces members, veterans from the Military Police community and civilians. Normally, the ride leaves Victoria, B.C., with riders dipping their rear tires into the Pacific Ocean, and ends with riders dipping their bikes' front tires in the Atlantic Ocean in St. John's, Newfoundland and Labrador. Along the route, bikers stop at a number of Royal Canadian Legion branches, as the organization is one of the ride's national sponsors, providing subsidized meals, hosting gatherings and assisting in riders' fundraising efforts.

Normally, the ride would stop in Halifax on its way to the Sydney Ferry Terminal, with a final destination in Newfoundland; the Atlantic regional ride this year consisted of two routes. This was the first year the ride came to Greenwood. Riders packed a few extra things along with the usual travelling gear, including hand sanitizer and masks, to ensure their "mobile bubble" followed provincial guidelines; and worked to follow social distancing at all points.

August 4 and 5, four bikes travelled from Greenwood to Yarmouth, stopping at Legions and various businesses along the way and gladly explaining how the Military Police Fund for Blind Fund and the relay came to be. The group intended to meet the sailing schooner, Bluenose II, but it cancelled its port of calls due to poor weather.

August 14, ride organizers held a fundraising BBQ at the 14 Wing Greenwood CANEX, which turned out to be a great location. During the BBQ,

Master Corporal Alex Milham received his coveted National Rider coin for participation in last year's ride from Major (retired) Bob Edwards. Each coin is engraved with the participant's name, year of completion and a coin number. We only anticipated selling four dozen burgers; we sold twice that amount. All \$405 from the BBQ, \$260 in merchandise sales, \$150 in ride registration, plus \$205.20 in donations added up to a total of \$1,020.20, which will go straight to helping blind children in the local area. Organizers could not have pulled it off without the help of Knights of Columbus Council #6297 Greenwood/ Middleton.

Then, August 15 to 17, a second group of riders departed from Greenwood on the second route weekend, heading north to the Cabot

Trail and Gaelic Trail in Cape Breton. That evening, they rested at the famed Cove Motel in Aulds Cove: it even has kickstand pads in the parking lot for motorcycles! 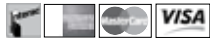

Yellow ribbons on ice

The South Shore of Nova Scotia has a rich military history, with veterans of past and present stepping forward to serve. The military family has also been part of that history, maintaining day-to-day responsibilities at home while family members serve. There are many symbols of military service throughout the South Shore, with cenotaphs and monuments sprinkled in ever community, but there are now two more to keep the sacrifices of the military and their families

front and centre.

Over the last several years, the South Shore Lumberjacks of the Maritime Junior Hockey League have held military appreciation hockey games, and those attending were very appreciative of the members' service. The next game will feature another very visible reminder to "Support the Troops."

Early in 2020, Honorary Colonel Dan Hennessey, 14 Construction Engineering Squadron; reached out to Ontario-based JetIce, which provide logos for ice surfaces worldwide, to ask the price for two "Support the Troops" yellow ribbons. After several conversations, JetIce informed

Hennessey it would be happy to provide the ice logos - at no cost. All they asked was for the shipping cost of the ribbons to be covered. Hennessey reached out to local realtor Karsa Melnick to see if she might be interested in sponsoring this effort, and quickly received a big yes.

The two ribbons arrived shortly but, as an attempt to install them mid-season would be a daunting task, the decision to wait until the next season, this fall, was reached. Then, as we all know, COVID-19 hit and put all plans on hold - until the last week of August, when the ice at the Lunenburg County Lifestyle Centre was installed

Lighter SAR week for crews

August 26, just after 6 p.m., the Halifax Joint Rescue Coordination Centre tasked a 14 Wing Greenwood-based Cormorant, Rescue 911, with 413 (Transport and Rescue) Squadron; to assist with the rescue of four hikers stranded in poor weather around Mont Groulx, 113 nautical miles north west of Sept-Îles. Provincial assets were unable to reach them due to snow and freezing rain. Around midnight, the helicopter and crew had successfully completed the rescue in what RCC described as extremely challenging conditions. The four hikers were transported to Sept-Îles with exposure-related injuries. R911 refueled, and returned to 14 Wing just after 3 a.m. August 27.

Also August 26, just before 10 p.m., JRCC tasked Hercules R343 to investigate flare sightings in the Bay of Fundy near Martin Head. The crew was conducting a night trainer at the time of the tasking, and was able to leave 14 Wing at 10:01 p.m. Shortly after 11 p.m., the SAR tasking was stood down as a false alarm. R343 landed at 11:08 p.m.

September 2, at 5:23 a.m., the Cormorant was tasked to search for a fishing vessel with four people on board, reportedly taking on water near Miscou Island, New Brunswick. R912 left 14 Wing just after 6:30 a.m. →
