# Milestone vaccination effort starts at 14 Wing

In the chair January 14 as 14 Wing Greenwood’s first recipient of the Moderna COVID-19 vaccine, peers and hallway passersby were congratulating Corporal Audrey Ethier as the wing’s “poster child” of a monumental vaccination mission.

Ethier is a medical technician with 26 Canadian Forces Health Services, first on the local list to receive the vaccination as a member of the Atlantic MMAT (Multi-Purpose Medical Assistance Team). Last summer, she joined Operation LASER, the Canadian Armed Forces’ response team for domestic emergencies, as CAF medical personnel responded to the overwhelming effects of the pandemic in long-term care facilities.

“Normally, I am working here in the treatment room, doing preliminary exams, sick parade and medicals,” Ethier said. “Last summer, I worked in two long term care homes in Montreal, so I’m really excited to get the vaccine. I’m happy with it, everything was all explained and I’m optimistic – this is so needed.”

Clinic community health nurse Colin Muise and registered nurse Vanessa Bou-

dreau ran the day-long immunization parade, which saw 20 CAF members receive their first dose of the Moderna vaccine.

“You’re all screened, good to go?” Muise asked Ethier, readying the needle. “Es-tu prêt?”

“Yes!” responded Ethier. The vaccination looked just like any other needle in the arm, with Ethier out of the chair and moving to the clinic waiting room to collect her third patient of the day within minutes.

“We’re excited,” clinical

services manager Dan Godin said of the start of the first phase of the immunization process. “This will be a long day, with lots of spaced out timings. It’s been a lot of work just to get this underway – a new freezer, having the vaccine brought in, all the

administration in the background to think about the 28-day span between the first and second shots.... When we get ready to do mass vaccinations, we’ll move out of the clinic.”

Muise and Boudreau had a quiet clinic workload over the

holiday break, but filled the time preparing for the start of the local immunization clinics for CAF personnel. A new freezer arrived, capable of holding trays of vaccine vials at sub-zero tempera-

tures once regular shipments start arriving. There was an hour-long webinar hosted by Moderna on the vaccine, handling and administration; with another two-hour CAF teleconference making more detailed plans to start the vaccine rollout with maximum effect. Priority lists laid out by CAF Surgeon General Major-General Marc Bilodeau were localized, matching up 14 Wing personnel with available vaccine. It also considers their availability now and for the second shot, stand-by lists in case intended recipients miss their appointment, and the paperwork process to track names, supplies used, clinic set-up and future planning.

“It was quiet over the holidays, but we knew this was coming – and here we are,” said Boudreau. “This is exciting – it’s part of history.” 14 Wing Greenwood Commander Colonel Brendan Cook reiterated the wing’s 2020 message, “Stay safe – Stay healthy – Operate as One,” as he acknowledged the local vaccination rollout. “We all know there are so many reasons to get the vaccine – it protects you, your co-workers, your family, and



your community,” he said. “It ensures our force remains operationally ready to be called upon when needed. It’s safe, it’s effective and it’s the biggest contribution we can make to eliminate COVID-19, aside from the personnel health measures already in place.

“We always think ‘service before self’ on operations, and this is even lower risk and no different. Getting the vaccine is an extension of service before self.”

He urges CAF personnel - and everyone - to keep well informed with accurate information on the vaccine’s safety, and to get their vaccination when the time comes. In the meantime, wear a mask, maintain physical distancing, wash your hands and limit social gatherings. “We all need to keep these personal health measures going, even during the vaccine rollout, until we have the virus fully under control.” ➔

# Ask the expert: making military fitness challenges safer

*Q: I take great pride in staying in good shape, and I have done a number of the fitness challenges organized by the Canadian Armed Forces (CAF). These events are physically and mentally demanding, and I have been injured several times training for and completing these events. Thanks to the changes made to the 2020 Iron Warrior event, I was able to successfully complete the competition. Were these changes specifically made to reduce the risk of injury for participants? - An Iron Warrior*

A: Dear Iron Warrior: Congratulations on successfully completing this very demanding event! As you know,



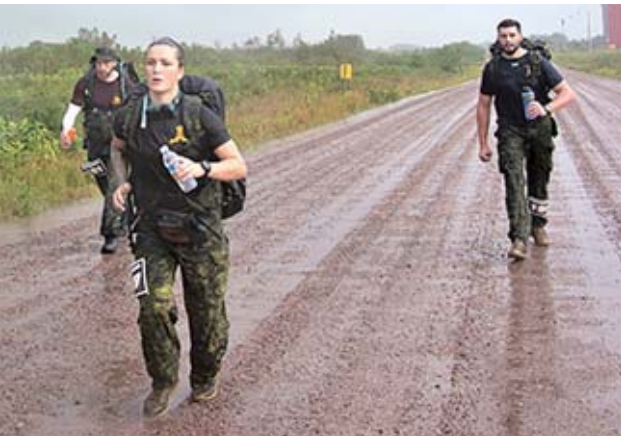
there are a number of fitness challenges offered by the CAF, including Iron Warrior, Mountain Man, Bushman and Iceman. These events “test your mettle” but, for several years now, Canadian Forces Health Services Group personnel have expressed concerns about their potential to cause injuries - as you have

experienced firsthand. In some cases, this could have lifelong personal and career-altering consequences.

After asking his medical staff for their advice, Colonel Eric Landry, the commander of 2 Canadian Mechanized Brigade Group, decided to change the format of the Iron Warrior event in the hope this would reduce the number and severity of the injuries experienced by participants.

These changes included:

- reducing the distance of the ruck march from 32 kilometres to 26k
- lowering the length of the portage from 4.5k to 2k
- shortening the sprint finish from 5k to 2k
- decreasing the weight participants must carry from 40 pounds plus food and



water to 30 lbs including food and water

- giving participants the option of wearing running shoes or combat boots

While these changes reduced the physical load for this event by approximately 25 per cent, they did not considerably alter the challenging nature of this com-

petition. Most importantly, they did significantly reduce the number and severity of injuries sustained by participants: an approximately six-fold reduction in injuries, with none of the competitors under these new rules requiring emergency assessment or hospital admission. Not only is this a great step forward for injury prevention, these changes and results inspired the leadership at CFB Gagetown to also reduce the physical demands of their 2020 Bushman event.

The bottom line: military fitness challenges are intended to “make,” not “break,” the military personnel who par-

ticipate in them. The changes military leaders are making to these events are making them significantly safer, while keeping them challenging. Injury prevention is everyone’s responsibility. CAF leadership has the greatest influence on keeping members safe when they include injury prevention in their planning and decisions. As this real example demonstrates, good things happen when leaders become agents of change. ➔

# Winter calls keep SAR crews busy

14 Wing Greenwood search and rescue crews closed out 2020 with a December 29 call. The Halifax Joint Rescue Coordination Centre tasked Hercules Rescue 343, with 413 (Transport and Rescue) Squadron, around 3 p.m. to assist in the search for a boat with smoke coming from it, reported by high-flyers approximately 330 nautical miles southeast of Newfoundland. The crew was stood down shortly after the initial call, during engine start.

January 8, just before 2 p.m., Hercules Rescue 343 and Cormorant Rescue 903 were both tasked to track an emergency locator beacon sounding in the vicinity of Brier Island. The beacon was located, with a buoy and at-

tached line the only findings. The fishing vessel owning the items did not respond via communications, but was found to be safe. All air assets returned to Greenwood around 4 p.m.

January 12, JRCC received a call from Nova Scotia RCMP indicating there was a missing person in the water in vicinity of Morris Island, south of Yarmouth. A second person was found deceased along the shoreline, connected to the missing person. The person did not return from a weekend camping trip and is believed to have gone missing while canoeing back to a vehicle for supplies. Just after 3 p.m., Cormorant Rescue 903 and Hercules Rescue 343 were tasked, along with a Provin-

cial Airlines aircraft and the Canadian Coast Guard out of Clark's Harbour. By 5 p.m., Cormorant Rescue 907 had replaced R903. Both R343 and R907 returned to Greenwood for refueling through the evening and continued to search through the night. January 13, the Hercules was still on the scene, with R907 returned to base just after 6 a.m. as R903 and its crew prepared to stand up and resume the search by helicopter. The aircraft search was stood down January 13 just after 5 p.m.

January 17, Hercules R344 was airborne just after 8 a.m. to support a top cover mission in assistance with Gander Cormorant R902, south of Newfoundland. The call was successful, with R344 return-

ing to 14 Wing around 4 p.m.

January 19, just before 11 a.m., Hercules R343 was tasked to provide top cover for Gander Cormorant R902 for a medevac from the cargo ship MV Pola Indian, roughly 200 nautical miles south-east of Sydney. An individual aboard the ship appeared to be suffering with appendicitis. R343 returned to Greenwood just after 4 p.m. The joint effort between 103 and 413 squadrons was recognized January 20 by 1 Canadian Air Division Major-General Eric Kenny: "Chief Warrant Officer Parent and I are very proud of what you and your teams do each day to meet our SAR mandate!" ➔

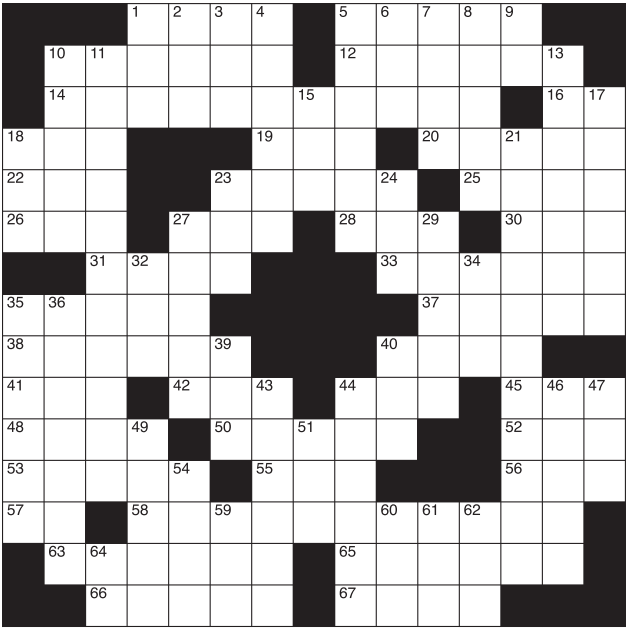
