Members of 413 (Transport & Rescue) Squadron returned home after a productive week of maritime search and rescue (SAR) training in Halifax. Two CH149 Cormorant helicopters, three crews and support staff deployed between November 1 and 5 with the express aim of conducting saturated maritime extraction training, commonly known as boat hoistina.

In many ways, boat hoisting represents both the most demanding and important

SAR context. The teamwork, technique and precision that must align to safely and effectively hoist SAR technicians and equipment from the helicopter to a vessel and back again (likely along with injured personnel) is nothing short of challenging. The difficulty is further compounded by winds, waves, darkness and a myriad of obstacles or complicating factors; nonetheless, the capability to hoist to vessels is a key maritime rescue capability often employed when carrying out 413 Squadron's SAR mandate.








## **Community** support on show




