



## Sanitas Atlanticum Class, field training at Aldershot readies new Med As

The skies were clear above 5th Canadian Division Support Base Detachment Aldershot June 7, as the distinct sound of a rotary-wing aircraft grew louder. Seven young members of the Canadian Armed Forces – Primary Reserve Force were anxiously awaiting their chance to familiarize themselves with life-saving equipment and standard operating procedures as part of a display put on by search and rescue technicians (SAR Techs) from 413 (Transport and Rescue) Squadron during their Qualification Level (QL) 3 Medical Assistant course.

These seven soldiers,

members of the CAF Health Services branch, were on a six-week occupational training course put on by the Health Services - Atlantic Region, part of an effort to decentralize training and assure quality of skill passed along to aspiring medical assistants (Med As) as they advance into their career field following their Basic Military Qualification (BMQ).

Med As are an essential trade, particularly as the quality of care for the sick and injured remains at the forefront of collective consciousness through the COVID-19 pandemic and the continued demand for more health care personnel. A Reserve and Non-Commissioned Member-only

trade, Med As assist and support medical and nursing officers to treat the sick and injured in CAF units and on operations. This position is only available for part-time employment through the Health Services Reserve.

During the conduct of their occupational training, these Med As were assessed on skills relevant to pre-hospital field care of casualties, including providing initial care for patients, providing basic life support

treatments in trauma cases, assisting with health assessments, performing specific environmental health and preventive medicine duties, and maintaining, replenishing and accounting for general and medical supplies.

June 7, as candidates in the Atlantic QL3 medical assistant course finished their day's compulsory training, they were delighted by the arrival of a CH149 Cormorant onto the camp sports field – also the designated

helicopter landing point. As the rotors ceased spinning and the helicopter's ramp descended, members of the 413 Squadron greeted students and toured them through the helicopter and its equipment, led them through the standard operating procedures for loading and unloading a casualty from an aircraft and - to the Med As' delight - took them for a familiarization flight.

The next challenge facing the Med As will be a final

field training exercise (FTX) in the Aldershot Range and Training Area, where they will put their theoretical knowledge to the test in simulated casualty and triage situations. Following this test of skills and drills, these students will earn the course qualification standard of QL3 Medical Assistant, and may be employed to their occupational function point and will be able to perform as capable members of their trade. ➔

## Maple Leaf summer camp fun expands to Maritimes

Camp Maple Leaf, endorsed and supported by the Canadian Armed Forces, for the first time is offering summer camp programs for all children of the Regular/ Reserve Force and veterans in New Brunswick this summer.

Camp Maple Leaf was established in 1955 on a beautiful island campsite in the Kawartha region of Ontario by the Canadian Council of War Veterans Associations and has been in continuous operation for over 65 years. Today, it is operated as a registered charity under the careful stewardship of the Camp Tanamakoon Charitable Foundation. Its mission is to provide children from military families, as well as children who share other unique life challenges, with a camp to call their own. Campers meet others who share their life experience, make new friendships and discover their own strengths – while having the time of their lives in a fun-filled week of overnight camp.

Camp Maple Leaf's vision is to triple the number of campers it serves over the coming three years and establish two new camp locations, including one at Greenhill Lake, approximately 40 minutes west of Fredericton. The goal this summer is



to host 200 campers in total over four sessions (each Sunday to Friday) of 50 campers each at Greenhill Lake. The first two sessions will serve children of military families (serving and veteran), with the first session beginning July 31 and the second starting August 7. The third session includes two special programs: Camp Kids of Heroes, dedicated to children of military families or first-responder families with a parent living with an OSI; and Camp Skein, dedicated to children grieving the death of a parent or sibling. The fourth session is for children of first responders, with additional capacity for children from military families.

Fees may be subsidized, thanks to the generosity of foundations and other donors who support the camp's charitable work, and families pay on a sliding, three-tiered scale. Visit [campmapleleaf.ca](http://campmapleleaf.ca) for further information. ➔

## CORROSION MONITORING OF DRINKING WATER

### We Need Volunteers!

The Municipality of the County of Kings is looking for 15 residents of the Greenwood Water Utility and 5 residents of the Sandy Court Water Utility to participate in its Corrosion Monitoring Program. The Corrosion Monitoring Program is designed to identify potential corrosion causing parameters and address them if necessary.

Greenwood and Sandy Court water does not contain lead and is tested annually to ensure this. However, in homes that may have older plumbing systems with galvanized iron, copper, or brass service lines pipes and fittings, lead and copper corrosion can potentially occur.

Volunteers would provide the Municipality with a single water sample to be taken on a predetermined date during either a summer or fall month. Municipal staff will drop off and collect the sample bottle from your home. All sampling results will be provided to you, the homeowner, upon project completion.

Monitoring of the Greenwood Water Utility is mandated by Nova Scotia Environment's *Requirements for Lead and Copper Management*.

Once this baseline sampling has been completed for the Greenwood Water Utility, a monitoring schedule will be established. Data from this examination will enable the Municipality to identify potential corrosion problems and prevent as required.

*What potential problems does corrosion cause?*

- Customer dissatisfaction due to water colour, staining and taste.
- Increased replacement frequency of water heaters, radiators, valves, pipes and meters due to corrosion damage.
- Water wasting due to pipes breaking down prematurely causing corrosion-related leaks.
- Decreased pumping capacity caused by narrowed pipe diameter as a result of corrosion deposits.

## Harassment and violence prevention: addressing family violence in the workplace

To strengthen the policies that keep our Defence Team members safe, the Work Place Harassment and Violence Prevention Regulations (WHVPR), under the Canada Labour Code (CLC) Part II, came into effect January 1, 2021. The regulations focus heavily on prevention. The Defence Team is committed to promoting a workplace that is physically and psychologically safe and free from harassment and violence, including family violence.

What is family violence, and is it a workplace issue?

Family violence is defined as any form of abuse or neglect a child or adult experiences from a family member, or from someone with whom they have an intimate relationship. Family violence can take many forms, such as psychological, financial, physical, sexual, social, verbal and even cyber.

When family violence follows a victim to work, it becomes a workplace issue. An actor of violence can present a risk to the victim or others in the workplace itself. For example, you may have heard people say “it is

a personal matter,” or “it’s none of my business.” These attitudes can lead people experiencing family violence to isolation and discourage them from seeking help. The regulation on Workplace Harassment and Violence Prevention in the workplace now ensures that those affected by family violence have access to support and guidance when in need.

Family violence prevention: what this means for Defence Team members? The inclusion of family violence in the workplace harassment and violence prevention policy empowers Defence Team members to come forward in order to establish a safety plan with their supervisors/managers.

To support Defence Team members in addressing

family violence in the workplace, the Workplace Harassment and Violence Prevention (WHVP) Centre of Expertise has developed Family Violence: Supervisor’s Guide. The guide includes a step by step action plan, appropriate resources and a template for an individualized family violence safety plan to ensure the safety of the Defence Team member as

well as other personnel.

In addition to the guide, the WHVP Centre of Expertise also offers a new family violence in the workplace presentation. The presentation is an opportunity for Defence Team members to learn about the types of family violence, the cycle, the warning signs, the responsibilities of employers and employees and available resources to all parties involved.

## Prévention du harcèlement et de la violence : contrer la violence familiale dans le lieu de travail

Le Règlement sur la prévention du harcèlement et de la violence dans le lieu de travail, lequel a été élaboré conformément à la partie II du Code canadien du travail afin de renforcer les politiques qui assurent la sécurité des membres de l’Équipe de la Défense, est entré en vigueur le 1er janvier 2021. Le règlement est fortement axé sur la prévention. L’Équipe de la Défense s’engage à promouvoir un milieu de travail sécuritaire sur les plans physique et psychologique et exempt de harcèlement

et de violence, y compris de violence familiale.

Qu’est-ce que la violence familiale et peut-elle représenter un problème en milieu de travail? La violence familiale se définit par toute forme de mauvais traitement ou de négligence infligée à un enfant ou à un adulte par un membre de la famille ou par quelqu’un avec qui la victime a une relation intime. La violence familiale peut prendre bien des formes, comme la violence psychologique, financière, physique, sexuelle, sociale, verbale et même cybernétique.

Lorsque la violence familiale suit une victime au travail, la situation devient un problème dans ce milieu. L’auteur de la violence peut représenter un risque pour la victime ou pour les gens de son lieu de travail.

Vous avez probablement déjà entendu des gens dire, par exemple : « la violence familiale est un problème personnel » ou « ce n’est pas de mes affaires ». Ces attitudes peuvent pousser les victimes de violence familiale à l’isolement et les décourager de demander de l’aide. Le Règlement sur la

prévention du harcèlement et de la violence dans le lieu de travail permet désormais aux victimes de violence familiale d’avoir accès à un soutien et à des conseils lorsqu’elles en ont besoin.

Prévention de la violence familiale : qu’est-ce que cela signifie pour les membres de la Défense nationale? L’ajout de la violence familiale à la Politique sur la prévention du harcèlement et de la violence dans le lieu de travail permet aux membres de l’Équipe de la Défense de se manifester afin d’établir un plan de sécurité

avec leurs superviseurs ou gestionnaires.

Pour aider les membres de l’Équipe de la Défense à contrer la violence familiale en milieu de travail, le Centre d’expertise sur la prévention du harcèlement et de la violence dans le lieu de travail (PHVLT) a publié le guide intitulé Violence familiale : Guide du superviseur. Ce guide inclut un plan d’action étape par étape, des ressources appropriées et le Plan personnalisé de protection des personnes en situation de violence familiale pour assurer la sécurité

du membre de l’Équipe de la Défense et celle des autres membres du personnel.

Outre ce guide, le Centre d’expertise sur la PHVLT offre également une nouvelle présentation sur la violence familiale dans le lieu de travail. Celle-ci permet aux membres de l’Équipe de la Défense de se renseigner sur les différentes formes de violence familiale, le cycle, les signes avant-coureurs, les responsabilités des employeurs et des employés et les ressources disponibles pour toutes les parties concernées. ➔

## Ex TAZ PRIMER 22 Puts explosives experts through threat scenarios

From June 6 to 24, 2022, 14 Wing Greenwood hosted an explosive ordnance disposal (EOD) exercise. Exercise TAZ PRIMER welcomed participants from across Canada, including EOD teams from Fleet Diving Unit Atlantic of Maritime Forces Atlantic, Royal Canadian Navy and 17 Explosive Disposal Flight (EDF) from 17 Wing Winnipeg.

This was a tri-element exercise, with members participating from 1 Canadian Air Division HQ – A4 Maintenance Armament, Canadian Armed Forces - Joint Counter Explosive Threat in Ottawa, a standards participant from the Canadian Forces School of Military Engineering at CFB Gagetown, a range safety officer from 19 Wing Comox’s 19 EDF, observers from 3 Wing Bagotville’s 3 Air Maintenance Squadron, with support staff from Greenwood’s own 14

AMS. The team from Fleet Diving Unit Atlantic is also trained to respond to threats underwater.

Exercise TAZ PRIMER 2022 is a three-week Royal Canadian Air Force improvised explosives device disposal (IEDD) training and force confirmation exercise. The exercise gets its name from the cartoon Tasmanian devil, TAZ, who is a mascot or symbol for the IEDD operators. PRIMER refers to their preparedness. Exercise TAZ PRIMER is important for developing and maintaining the CAF’s ability to respond to domestic and deployed IEDD tasks.

14 Wing, through 14 AMS, provided IEDD training by delivering realistic scenarios in order to prepare and validate IEDD operators’ proficiency and currency. Aside from the blackflies and ticks, Greenwood is a great location for hosting the exercise. Not many bases, especially air force bases, have multiple

range sites, which allow for varied training locations and concurrent training scenarios. Most people would typically associate EOD skills with the army, but Greenwood is one of several RCAF bases that maintain EOD capabilities.

“It’s a capability that a lot of people don’t know exists,” explained the exercise OPI Sergeant Rita Boutilier, an air weapons systems technician with 14 AMS.

The exercise offered renewal training for IEDD operators. Several salvage vehicles were spread out in different areas to accommodate the training.

“There is a wide range of different threats that the operators are responding to throughout the exercise,” said Boutilier. “Smaller things like a suspicious envelope, up to larger threats, like a suspicious vehicle.”

The operators work in teams of two as a minimum, with one member as the lead operator and the other as the operator assistant. One thing that is very important to the team when responding to a threat is planning.

“When they arrive to a scenario, they have to plan for what could go right and what could go wrong. They have to be prepared for any possible outcome,” Boutilier said.

To an outside observer, things may seem to move

slowly, but everything must be completed very methodically.

Operators were working with TEODOR, the Telerob Explosive Ordnance Disposal and Observational Robot. TEODOR is equipped with several cameras and an extendable arm that may be fitted with different attachments, such as a pinching claw or a “ninja star” cutting blade. During a training scenario June 10, operators used TEODOR to inspect a suspicious vehicle thoroughly.

However, there is only so much TEODOR can do: its mobility and visibility is impressive, but somewhat limited compared to what a human can do. One of the IEDD operators donned the 85-pound bomb suit in 25-degree Celsius heat to complete the final inspection - while also carrying another 50 pounds of gear. Once again, the inspection is done slowly and methodically. Dealing with the heat, the weight of the suit, manipulating the extra gear and the stress of the job is a lot to overcome.

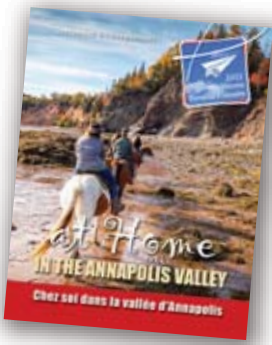
“There’s no better feeling than taking that bomb suit off at the end of the day, when you know the job is done,” the operator said, wrapping up their task. ➔
