Bombers work hard, miss regional three-peat

14 Wing Greenwood's men's Bombers couldn't get the three-peat they were hoping for at the 2024 Canadian Armed Forces Atlantic regional hockey tournament.

The Halifax Mariners fought their way through every game they needed to win the title, sending them to CAF nationals later this winter.

"It was real even competition for the full tournament - three games were decided in overtime and the final in triple overtime," says 14 Wing assistant captain Warrant Officer Pier-Olivier Poulin. "We would like to wish best of luck to the Halifax Mariners at the national championship."

Greenwood opened the action at the RBC in Dartmouth January 23, meeting CFB Gagetown for a good, back-and-forth game. Greenwood was up 3-1 before Gagetown tied it; then Greenwood was up 5-3 before Gagetown notched a single; THEN Greenwood scored two quick goals at the end to hold a 7-4 win.

Corporal Tyler Williams and Sailor 3rd Class Ryan Hoskins both scored twice for Greenwood; while Corporal Tyler Happeney, Aviator Steve Best and Corporal Dylan Ventresca scored once. Warrant Officer Joel Brooks kept Greenwood in a great position with many key saves.

Game 2 that afternoon put Greenwood up against CFB Halifax, securing a 5-2 win. The game held 1-1 coming out of the second, before Greenwood took the lead in a strong third. Kudos to Captain Nik Majcher, making multiple saves in his first military hockey win. Best scored twice, with singles from Corporal Rhett Sheppard, Sergeant Evan Birchall and Hoskins.

January 24, Greenwood met the 12 Wing Shearwater Flyers in the afternoon game, taking a 4-3 loss as Shearwater scraped out the winning goal in the last eight seconds. Greenwood was down 3-1, but a goal with five minutes left, and another with 17 seconds left, put it all back to square - until it went in Shearwater's favour. Happeney got the

double, while Best scored once. Greenwood, now 2-1, would now wait for the winner of the January 26 morning game between Gagetown and Halifax.

January 25, it was indeed Halifax, battling back in a the must-win match-up to make the January 26 final and, potentially, get back to the CAF nationals. Halifax came

out of the morning win over Gagetown, and found enough gas to tie Greenwood 3-3 with just 12 seconds left in the third period. And, then, Halifax got the goal it needed to clinch a 4-3 OT win. Greenwood goals came from Lieutenant Nick Gibson, Birchall and Ventresca.

Halifax went into the final January 26 against Shearwa-

ter, winning the Atlantic title and their return to nationals for the first time in several years.

"The Bombers took the last two regional championships, and we were not able to accomplish the three-peat this year," Poulin said. "Everyone worked hard all year - and all week - to push for the win, but not many bounces went

our way."

Poulin and the Bombers would like to thank Halifax PSP for great hospitality through the tournament week, and Greenwood PSP for the all-season support, particularly Fitness and Sports Centre manager Matt Gillis, who stepped up as a coach on the Friday morning heading into the tournament week. ➔

As the Royal Canadian Air Force (RCAF) celebrates its centennial this year, prepare for an exciting journey through a century of aviation excellence. The year will be studded with outstanding national, international, and local celebrations by squadrons and wings. It's not just a nostalgic look back; it's a leap into the future, as the RCAF enters its second century of service.

Celebrations began with the launch of the Winnipeg Jets' special jersey for the 2023/ 2024 NHL season. Players in historic replica uniforms pay homage to the 1948 RCAF Flyers, the hockey team made up of RCAF members that won gold at the 1948 Winter Olympic Games in St. Moritz, Switzerland. The Jets will wear the 1948-style jerseys for three home games including April 1, the official 100th anniversary of the RCAF.

That same day, April 1, more than 250 locations in at least a dozen countries will light up in RCAF blue,

kicking off the RCAF Centennial Illuminations. This global event invites participation from around the world, symbolizing a visual tribute to the RCAF Centennial and celebrating a century of aviation excellence. And, yes, Guinness World Records has been contacted and we are looking forward to breaking a world record with this initiative.

Fast forward to May and the Canadian Tulip Festival takes centre stage in Ottawa. Festival organizers had four specially cultivated tulips produced for the centennial. Named Wings, Ad Astra, Rescue and Flyers, these vividly coloured flowers commemorate the RCAF's lasting impact on Canada and are a living testament to a century of aviation excellence.

The RCAF Centennial Ball is scheduled for June 1, in Ottawa. It's not just a celebration; it's a reflection on the journey from the Royal Flying Corps and Royal Navy Air Service to the creation of the RCAF in 1924 and beyond. It will be an evening when Canadian Armed Forces members, their families and community partners come together to recognize the contributions of the RCAF to Canada's Defence Team.

RCAF Game Force flew on to the stage when it launched in August 2023, to the delight of gamers and e-sports enthusiasts. Less than two months later, the RCAF sent a team of four highly skilled gamers to Los Angeles to compete against military teams from the United States and the United Kingdom. It

was the RCAF Team's first competition – and they won! In fact, their team captain, Aviator Ryan Mezzei from 14 Wing Greenwood, was named MVP of the tournament. RCAF Game Force will expand during the centennial year with games like Rocket League and Forza Motorsports, with the intention of this being a legacy activity for the whole CAF.

In the spring, a visual treat awaits with the release of the documentary, “Wings of Honour: A Century of the Royal Canadian Air Force,” produced in collaboration with the Royal Canadian Geographical Society. Premiering in select locations around the world, this film tells the compelling story of air force aviation throughout the decades.

The RCAF's commitment to STEM (science, technology, engineering and math) will take flight with STEM science fairs in the spring and summer. In partnership with Youth Science Canada, these initiatives will spark the curiosity of Canada's

youth and align with the RCAF Centennial's focus on fostering innovation and preparing future leaders.

A literary journey awaits with the release of “100 Objects for 100 Years: A History for the Royal Canadian Air Force Centennial” in the spring of 2024. This book is a treasure trove of information that provides insights into the lesser-known aspects of the RCAF's history through artifacts from RCAF museums across Canada.

Lace up your running shoes in the spring and summer to participate in the RCAF Run. This centennial-themed run invites current and former RCAF members, along with their friends and families, to connect with Canadians through sport and fitness. You may find a run near you or opt to participate virtually. Participants of all abilities and fitness levels are welcome to take part and “Earn Your Wings.”

Sustainability takes root with the Trees for Heroes initiative, running to October.

This initiative will see trees planted in the shape of the RCAF roundel at various locations across the country, serving as a unique and lasting way to commemorate the RCAF Centennial and symbolize its legacy in Canada.

As we embark on this remarkable journey to celebrate the RCAF Centennial, these events and initiatives weave a tapestry of history, innovation and community spirit. This celebration is not just about the past; it's an invitation to join hands in shaping a future where the sky's no longer the limit. The RCAF Centennial is not just one event, but a celebration of a legacy that has been soaring for the past hundred years and will continue to soar for the next hundred years.

Centenaire de l'ARC : s'envoler vers le prochain siècle

L'Aviation royale canadienne (ARC) célèbre son 100e anniversaire cette année. Préparez-vous à un parcours passionnant à travers un siècle d'excellence en aviation. Les célébrations locales, nationales et internationales remarquables des escadrons et des escadres marqueront l'année. Il ne s'agit pas d'une simple rétrospective nostalgique; c'est un saut vers l'avenir alors que l'ARC entre dans son deuxième siècle de service.

Les célébrations ont commencé avec le lancement du chandail spécial des Jets de Winnipeg pour la saison 2023-2024 de la LNH. Cette réplique de l'uniforme historique vise à rendre hommage aux Flyers de l'ARC de 1948, l'équipe de hockey composée de membres de l'ARC qui a remporté l'or aux Jeux Olympiques d'hiver de 1948 à Saint-Moritz, en Suisse. Les joueurs des Jets revêtiront les chandails au style de 1948 pour trois matchs à domicile, y compris le match du 1er avril, date du 100e anniversaire de l'ARC.

Toujours le 1er avril, plus de 250 emplacements dans au moins une douzaine de pays allumeront des lumières bleu aviation pour lancer les illuminations du centenaire de l'ARC. Cet hommage visuel international est ouvert aux participants du monde entier et souligne un siècle d'excellence en aviation. Nous avons communiqué avec l'organisme Guinness World Records et nous avons hâte d'établir un



record mondial grâce à cette initiative.

Passons au mois de mai, lors duquel se déroule Festival canadien des tulipes à Ottawa. Les organisateurs du festival ont spécialement cultivé quatre variétés de tulipes pour le centenaire. Ces fleurs aux couleurs vives nommées Wings, Ad Astra, Rescue et Flyers commémorent la

marque durable de l'ARC sur le Canada et soulignent un siècle d'excellence en aviation.

Le bal du centenaire de l'ARF aura lieu le 1er juin à Ottawa. Ce sera une soirée historique et mémorable; il ne s'agit pas d'une simple célébration, c'est aussi une réflexion sur le cheminement de l'ARC, des Royal Flying Corps et Royal Navy Air Service jusqu'à sa création en 1924 et au-delà. Les membres des Forces armées canadiennes (FAC), leurs familles et les

partenaires communautaires pourront se rassembler afin de reconnaître les contributions que l'ARC apporte à l'Équipe de la Défense du Canada.

Les membres de Mission de Jeux de l'ARC sont montés sur scène lors du lancement du tournoi en août 2023, au grand plaisir des joueurs et des adeptes de sports électroniques. Moins de deux mois plus tard, l'ARC a envoyé une équipe de quatre joueurs hautement qualifiés à Los Angeles pour une compétition contre des équipes militaires des États-Unis et du Royaume-Uni. C'était la première fois que l'équipe de l'ARC participait à une compétition, et elle a gagné! Le capitaine de l'équipe, l'aviateur Ryan Mezzei de la 14e Escadre Greenwood, a été nommé joueur le plus utile du tournoi. Mission de Jeux de l'ARC prendra de l'ampleur tout au long de

l'année du centenaire grâce à des jeux comme Rocket League et Forza Motorsports dans le but d'en faire une activité historique pour tous les membres des FAC.

Une surprise vous attend au printemps avec le lancement du documentaire Wings of Honour: A Century of the Royal Canadian Air Force (Les ailes de l'honneur : Un siècle de l'Aviation royale canadienne), produit en collaboration avec la Société géographique royale du Canada. Ce film, qui sera diffusé en primeur dans certains endroits dans le monde, raconte l'histoire fascinante de l'aviation au fil des décennies.

L'engagement de l'ARC envers les STIM (science, technologie, ingénierie et mathématiques) se concrétisera par des foires scientifiques au printemps et à l'été. Réalisées en partenariat avec Sciences jeunesse Canada, ces initiatives éveilleront la curiosité des jeunes du Canada et s'harmonisent à la priorité du centenaire de l'ARC qui consiste à encourager l'innovation et à préparer les leaders de demain.

La publication de 100 Ob-

jects for 100 Years: A History for the Royal Canadian Air Force Centennial (100 objets pour 100 ans : Une histoire pour le centenaire de l'Aviation royale canadienne) au printemps vous fera vivre une aventure littéraire. Ce livre est une mine d'information et présente des aspects moins connus de l'histoire de l'ARC à l'aide d'artefacts des musées de l'ARC des quatre coins du pays.

Enfilez vos chaussures de course ce printemps et cet été pour participer à la Course de l'ARC, une course sous le thème du centenaire qui invite les membres actifs et anciens de l'ARC ainsi que leurs amis et leurs familles à établir des liens avec les Canadiens et les Canadiennes grâce au sport et à la mise en forme. Vous pourrez prendre part à une course dans votre région ou participer virtuellement. Les participants de tous les niveaux de capacité et de forme physique sont invités à remporter leurs ailes.

La durabilité s'enracinera grâce à l'initiative Arbres pour les héros qui se déroulera d'octobre 2023 à octobre 2024. Des arbres seront

plantés en forme de cocarde de l'ARC à divers endroits au pays et seront une façon unique et durable de commémorer le centenaire de l'ARC et son héritage au Canada.

Alors que nous entamons cette aventure remarquable pour célébrer le 100e anniversaire de l'ARF, ces événements et initiatives forment une mosaïque d'histoire, d'innovation et d'esprit de corps. Il n'est pas seulement question de célébrer le passé; il s'agit d'une invitation à s'unir pour façonner un avenir où le ciel n'est plus une limite. Le centenaire de l'ARC n'est pas qu'un événement, c'est la célébration d'un héritage en plein essor depuis les 100 dernières années et qui continuera à atteindre de nouveaux sommets pour les 100 prochaines années.

Core contingent eying repeat CAF old timers' win
